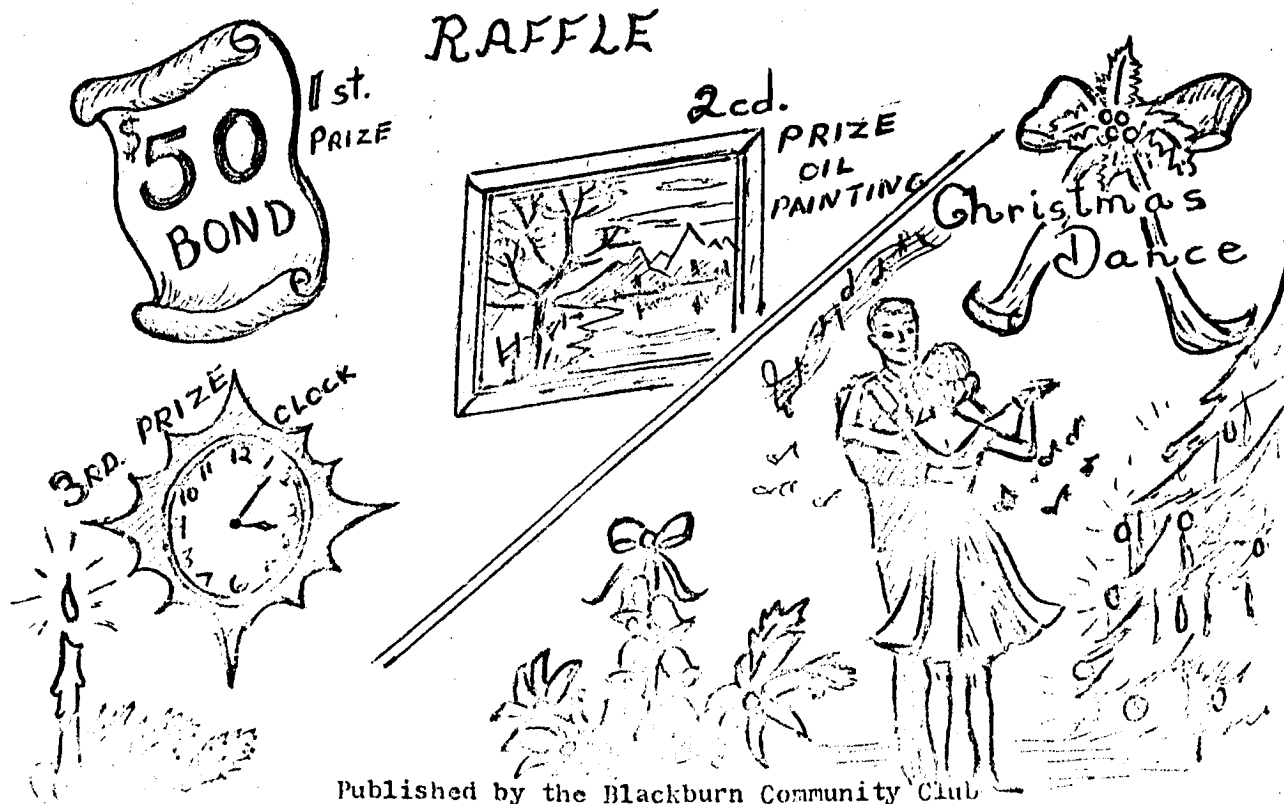
Ballet -
