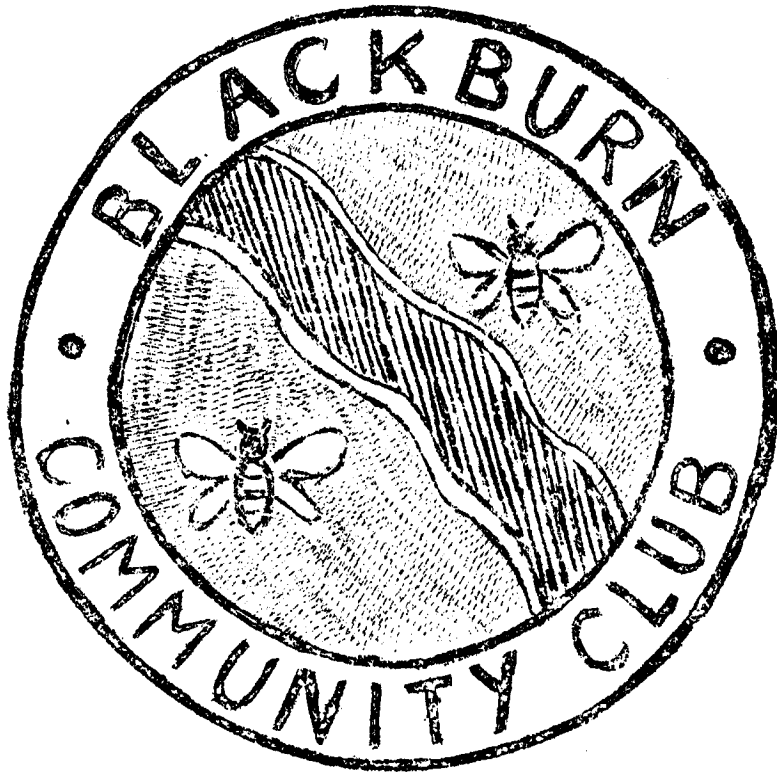

### The Blackburn Community Club Badge

The meaning of the devices in this design is as follows:

The black wavy diagonal stripe edged with white is a symbol for a stream of running water, the word "Burn" being an Old Country term for a brook or stream. Naturally, this "Burn" is black in colour, for Blackburn.

The hornets or wasps (bees) as well as the black wavy stripe are derived from the Arms of Blackburn, Lancashire, England.

The Bees are an emblem of skill, perseverance and industriousness and may, in our badge, be regarded as an indication of the ambition of the members of the Blackburn Community Club to express these qualities not only as participants in sports but as spectator-supporters.

The name "Hornets" seems appropriate for the senior team, while the junior or midget group might be called the Blackburn Wasps - a smaller but equally effective counterpart of the bigger "Hornets".

Arena and Community Centre

The following letter has been sent to the Gloucester Township with copies to the other Gloucester associations. Representatives followed up the letter by attending the Township meeting.

Dear Sir:

The Blackburn Community Club is interested in the action the township is taking to provide recreation facilities. We refer in particular to making available the Gloucester High School for recreation purposes and the arena planned for completion this September.

In respect to the arena, we are concerned about its planned location, close to the Leitrim township hall. We suggest the arena should be located on the basis of current and projected population density. In this regard, we point out that based on the population figures used for the 1967 per capita grants, approximately 75% of the population is located in the northern half of the township. This will increase to over 80% during 1968.

We further recommend that all public facilities be located on the basis of current and projected population density.

The Mosquito hockey team is in a round-robin series. They have played two out of five games (won one and tied one).


Are there enough interested single and married women to enter a Ladies' Softball team? Please phone Ken McNeely after 5 p.m. at 824-3252 as soon as possible.
