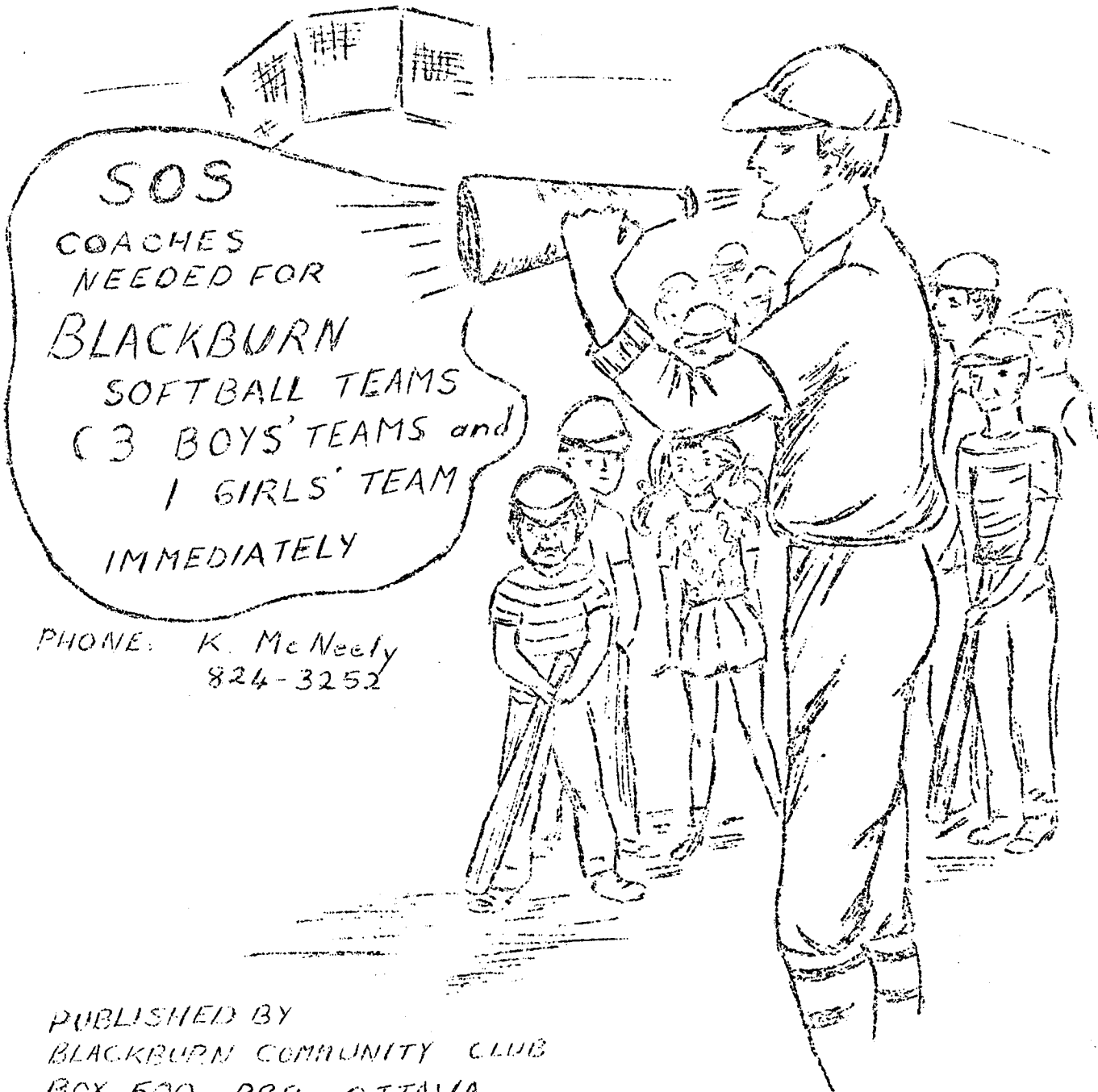

Arena and Community Centre

The Township Council meeting on April 1st was attended by representatives of the various Community Associations in this area. It was our intention to obtain further information re the proposed Recreation Complex which is to be constructed at Leitrim. Township Council graciously listened to the points raised by the various Associations and then presented us with their views on the matter.

The views of Council indicate that they will not change the location of the Arena-complex. The well has already been drilled and the land has been purchased. The tenders have been submitted and the plan is now too far advanced for change. Council refused to consider our suggestion that two arenas be built, one here and one at Leitrim, as being more expensive than building an Arena-complex.

Note: The lowest bid on the Arena-complex was approximately \$300,000. higher than Council had estimated. This may help to change their plan.


High School News
