CARLETON COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION

Nominations for Separate and Public  
School trustees to be held on November 18th

Gloucester Public School candidates will speak on Tuesday,  
November 26, at 8.p.m. at Fairfield Public School.

Separate School candidates will speak on Tuesday, November 26,  
at 8 p.m. in basement of St. Joseph's Church in Orleans,  
and also on Wednesday, November 20 at 8 p.m. at Notre Dame de  
Lourdes Church in Cyrville.

Elections of Public and Separate School Trustees will be held  
on Monday, December 2nd.

Election cards will be mailed to voters indicating the location  
of polls.

The new Regional Carleton County Board of Education will include  
all territory from Cumberland in the east to Fitzroy Harbour in  
the west (in other words, the whole of Carleton County except  
Ottawa, Eastview and Rockcliffe).

There will be two Boards of Education; the Separate  
School Elementary Board and the Public Elementary & High School  
Board, with fourteen (14) elected representatives each. Gloucester  
Township Public School supporters vote for two (2) representatives  
for the Carleton County Board of Education, Gloucester Township  
Separate School supporters vote for four (4) representatives for  
the Elementary Separate School County Board.

For High School purposes only, there will be 18 members  
and Separate School supporters will also vote for four (4)  
candidates from the County to represent them on the Carleton County  
Board of Education.

The forthcoming election of School Board members is extremely significant. In the interests of our children and the future development of our municipality it is essential that Gloucester be capably represented on the new Boards of Education. For this reason, we would urge all ratepayers to become acquainted with all candidates who offer themselves for election.

Please take note of meetings and Election day.

" As of September 1968, no Scouting group has been registered within the Blackburn Community. Many people are arguing that the fault lies with the lack of interest among the boys of the area. However, the major reason is that there are no leaders in the community supporting scouting. No boy of Scouting or Venturing age cares to step out unless he knows there is an organization that will lend to his support. Until the men of the community step forward, and there is only need for three or four, Scouting for all intents and purposes will remain inactive.

Why should we bother at all ? Well, Blackburn did have a reputation for producing excellent Scout and Venturer groups. In the past years Blackburn boys have won top honours; they have faithfully represented their community at Youth '66 and Scouting '66 as well as special ceremonies for Oxfam and the Fathers of Confederation in 1967. They have provided service at Winter Fairs and Summer " Ex " and have donated time, money and effort to visit the Veterans' Home. The boys from this community have served at service camps, have built canoes, coster wagons, radio sets and organized dances.

But now what do we have ? We have a group of six boys, who have been in Cubs and Scouts and who now wish to advance to Venturers but are stopped by the lack of leaders. A chance to mature within the community through Scouting is denied to them.

What then do we want? All we ask is that one or two men, who would be willing to act as advisers to these boys, come forward. He Could guide them in their setting up of a constitution, the election of officers and in the running of the Company. ' H e will be their resource personal '.

Editorial

In 1951 approximately 15 community-minded people decided it was time we took some interest in providing something for our young people. Blackburn Community was formed. Cubs and Brownies were started. A rink with lights and field house were erected on the the Public School ground; hockey teams, ball teams were formed, sleigh drives, parties and dances were held. Ste. Marie recreation club was formed around 1960; a rink and field house were erected on the Separate School ground. It was not until 1968 that the township decided to help the recreation groups with a grant. The Blackburn Property Owners Association was formed in 1958. Its biggest project was stopping the N.C.C. from expropriating Blackburn as part of the greenbelt. For four years we were told it was impossible to build a town here. Finally after much perseverance, time and effort, it was proven to the elected representatives of the township, provincial and federal governments that it was possible and they gave the go ahead sign.

In June 1967, Blackburn Community Club, Ste. Marie Recreation, Glen Ogilvie W.I. and St. Mary's Anglican Church had a Centennial Day. This day marked the end of an era, and the beginning of a unique situation where we were going to be involved in building a town or we could leave it to our Township elected representatives to give us what they see fit.

October 1967, the Blackburn Community Club, Ste. Marie and the Property Owners amalgamated to form the Blackburn Community Association. We have a very willing and active executive council, but they are not able to accomplish anything without the co-operation of the people of the community.

So let us all co-operate and contribute to the growth of an exciting and prosperous community.
