There has been a request that we print the Banar in French as well as English. It is a logical request, but there are very good reasons why we have not followed this request. I have inquired around and found that there are not any homes in our membership that cannot read the Banar in English. Some people say this is not the point it is the principle of it, this is a bilingual country. Point well taken except for one thing: the work we do for this community is all volunteer (we are not a government agency) and we are doing it to provide facilities, recreation, etc. in our community. The publicity committee does not want to complain about how much time and effort it takes to put out the Banar, and they are not conceited enough to think that it is all that important whether it is printed or not.

The purpose of the Banar is just to let the people know what is going on the easiest way possible, and with the least expense. To publish a seven page edition - 525 copies it costs approximately \$25.00 plus the time it takes to gather news, type stencils, print and staple together. The expense is subsidized by the advertisements.

One suggestion we received was to put some of the articles in French and others in English. This would defeat our purpose, as we want to reach everyone with all the news and there are many English speaking people that never had the opportunity (or didn't take it) to learn French.

Our only hope is that the Banar is not used by some people to divide our community. I assure you all we wish to do is be a source of information whether it is about meetings, municipal affairs, schools or activities.
