

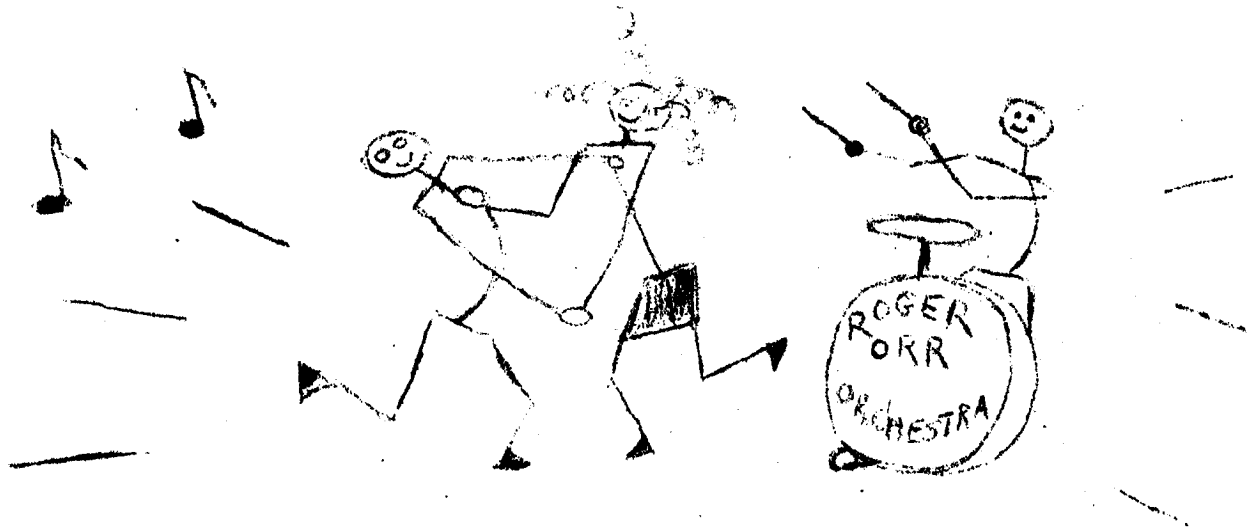

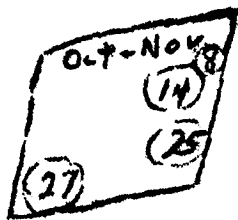

CIVIC AFFAIRS COMMITTEE - L. Labonte - Chairman

The Civic Affairs Committee acts as liaison with municipal, regional, provincial and federal governments, Costain Estates Ltd., school boards, N.C.C. and other community associations in the north - east sector of the township, in the interest of the residents as taxpayers and property owners the committee also promotes community development projects.

DOGS --By-law 19 - 1964 prohibits dogs from running at large in the Township. Due to the proximity of the Hamlet to wooded areas, extreme care must be taken of loose dogs because of the danger of rabies. If your dog is loose and picked up by the dogcatcher it could mean a fine of \$5.00 to \$100.00 for you therefore, please confine your dogs to your property and prevent them from running at large around the community. Cats should also be kept on your property for they too can be picked up and delivered to the Humane Society for disposal.

BUS SERVICE: --A questionnaire follows on public transportation and we hope all those interested will complete and return it to the Committee without delay.

ROADS AND SERVICES: -- The Ottawa-Carleton Municipal Government has awarded to Francon Ltd. a contract for the reconstruction and paving of 1.2 miles of Bearbrook Rd. from Montreal Rd. to Blackburn Hamlet. Work is scheduled to begin on or about Nov. 1st.

The same government has awarded to Alcan Colony a contract for the installation of sewer and water mains on the Cyrville Rd. from Tauvette St. to Bearbrooke Rd. and Bearbrooke Rd. from Cyrville Rd. to the Subdivision. Work is to begin Oct. 27. As soon as this work is completed sometime in Nov. Bearbrooke Rd. from Cyrville Rd. to the subdivision will be reconstructed and readied for paving. The paving will be done in the spring of 1970. After the road is rebuilt and made passable the hill on Southpark Dr. will be closed to all traffic.

GARBAGE COLLECTION IN BLACKBURN HAMLET - B QUESTIONNAIRE

This questionnaire is being sent to all families living in Blackburn Hamlet to find out if the residents wish the Civic Affairs to negotiate with the Township before next February a new garbage collection agreement. The present contract for garbage collection terminates in Feb. 1970. Please answer the following questions:

1. Do you want a twice a week year round garbage collection?.....
2. Do you want a twice a week collection during June, July and August?.....
3. If a twice a week year round collection or a twice a week summer collection was desired which days would you wish the collection to be made?.....
4. Are you satisfied with the present arrangement?.....
5. Do you wish the present Friday and Saturday collection days changed?.....
6. If yes to what day of the week?.....

If a twice a week collection was requested the cost to the ratepayers would be approx. 18¢ to 25¢ per week per household more than the present rate on your tax bill. So if a year round twice a week collection was requested by you your extra annual cost would be between \$9.36 and \$13.00 per year. If the twice a week summer collection the extra cost would be between \$2.16 and \$3.00.
