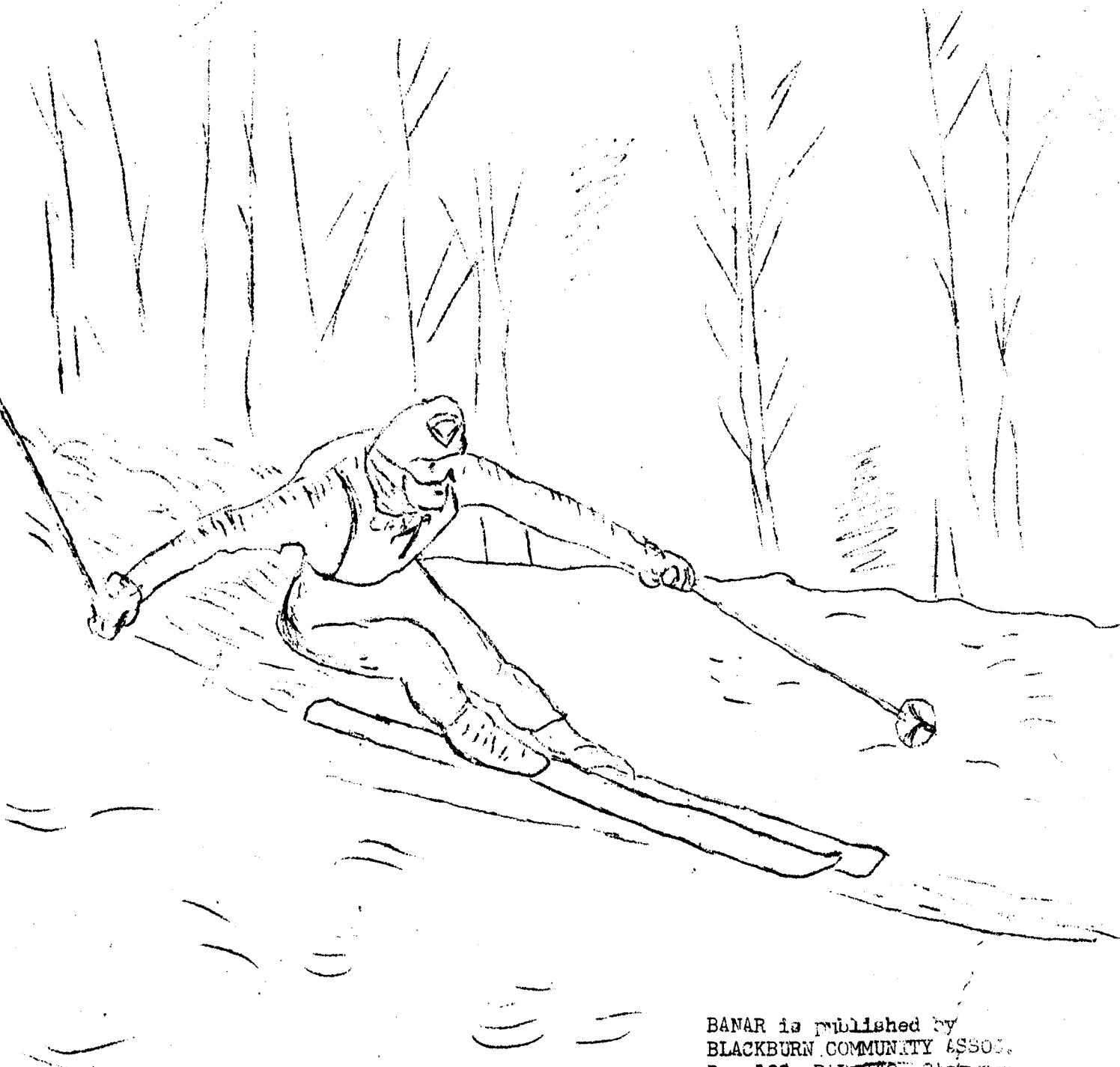

COMPUTERS IN EDUCATION - BOON OR BUST?

The guest speaker will be Mr. Bernard Webber of the Computer Systems Section of the Ontario Department of Education, Toronto. Until 1967, Mr. Webber was a teacher of economics at Woodroffe High School and a member of an Ottawa teachers advisory group on advanced electronic training aids. Subsequently he has taken up a position in the Ontario Department of Education where he is responsible for implementing computer applications in education in administrative and teaching fields.

Computers are widely represented as the most significant breakthrough in teaching and administration and as potentially dehumanizing monsters that threaten our society. What are they in fact? What can they do for us in the education of our youngsters? Mr. Webber is well equipped to present these many aspects of this new technology and will provoke lively discussion. Plan to attend this informative and authoritative presentation.
