ELECTIONS: April 27, 1970, will be the nomination and the election of the Executive Council for the year 1970-71 for the Blackburn Community Association.

The nominating committee will put forth a slate of officers for your approval, but nominations will be accep-

In the event of more than one candidate for a given office is nominated, an election will be necessary with only members in good standing in attendance being allowed to vote. Under the terms of membership two votes are allowed per household.

Corresponding Secretary: Issues all communications of the Association, receives and distributes Association mail as received.

Treasurer: Prepares the budget from expenses forecast by the committees, issues all cheques for the Association, makes sure budget is kept and reports regularly to the executive and general membership on the financial status of the Association.

Civic Affairs: The Association s liaison with Township Counciliance of the Association.

Civic Affairs: The Association s liaison with Township Council, C.C., Regional Government, Trovincial authorities & Costain Tstates; makes the wants and needs of the Association known to these levels of Government.

Tays and Means: The formation of this committee will be voted pon at the March 23, meeting) Raises funds for Asso-

ciation projects.

Tembership: Organizes a main membership drive each year, generally the month of Geptember, and accepts new memberships throughout the year.

Sports: Organizes all sports, hockey, basketball etc., for both boys and girls and adults.

March Meeting: The March General Meeting was an exceptionally fine Launching into the new series of meetings on CHILDREN'S ADJUSTMENT PROBLEMS. Dr. June Pium presented the current status of consulting services in psychology. (You will note from the local papers that a re-evaluation of psychologist services is before the Carleton Board of Education right now): Mr. Steve Lazier's presentation on BEHAVIOUR MODIFICATION was most engaging. The techniques described are those familiar to any parent or teacher, but he clearly identified the problem that we are inconsistent in their application. His film on an application of the technique for a severely disturbed youngster was dramatic and heart-wrenching.

April Meeting: Cur next meeting is at 3:00 p.m. on Monday, April 6th at Glen Ogilvic Public School. Cur guest speaker will explore the problem of "The Child with Perception Problems". Problems with vision and hearing are fairly readily identified and usually corrected. Less obvious but very significant are problems in reading and mathematics which are traced to difficulties with pattern recognition. Children often have trouble with inverted letters, numbers and word order that can hold back their progress in primary grades. Parents can contribute a great deal in the home to overcome these problems. Our speaker will explore the range of physical handicaps, how they are identified and how the home and the school can co-operate in solving these difficulties. Plan to attend and participate in the discussion
