GLOUCESTER NORTH COMMUNITY STUDY

BY: the people of Gloucester North (east of Blair Road, north of the Innes Road in Gloucester Township).

WHEN: starting January 17, 1971, for 6 evening meetings at two weeks intervals.

WITH: the guidance of the Extension Division of Algonquin College and with the assistance of resource persons including faculty and students from Algonquin College.

Briefly, the study is a systematic examination of the community by a representative group of citizens. It will assist this area in assessing problems, needs, and resources and to determine how available resources may be better utilized to assist in the solution of problems and meeting of needs. The project will not reduce community involvement but will make it more effective.

A recruitment committee has been formed with the responsibility of seeking participants for this study from as broad a representation as possible of people with an interest in the area.

This study is being supported by the Blackburn Community Association though participation is not limited to members of the association. Interested parties outside the organization are urged to participate.

The study is intended to cover a broad range of activities, a few of which are:

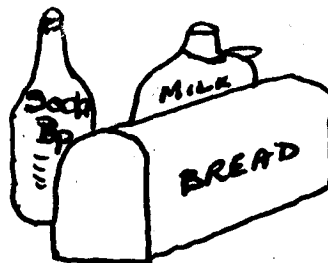

## ATTENTION SNOWMOBILE OWNERS

The time of year is here, when all the snowmobiles are brought out of summer storage and are made ready for a winter of fun.

It will be of interest to snowmobilers that in the Blackburn Hamlet area the only place you can operate your vehicle is on the road. The N.C.C. has closed last year's Green's Creek run.

It must also be remembered that the same laws apply to snowmobiles as to motor vehicles; they must not travel toward on-coming traffic and must have Public Liability and Property Damage insurance. Although an operator's licence is not required, the operator must be 16 years of age and over; however, the vehicle must bear a licence.

As there are a lot of farms in the area, it must also be remembered that the owner's permission must be obtained before using the fields, otherwise you may be charged with trespassing.

There have been reports that last year farmers have had their fences cut by people wanting access to fields; this does no harm at the time, but when the farmer turns his cattle out to pasture in the Spring, the cattle find the hole and wander out on to the road, causing accidents and possibly a death.

When snowmobiling respect other people's property; also a snowmobile is not as easy to handle as a car, so drive slowly and watch out for children.

Also please no late night riding through the Hamlet. Your vehicles are noisy and people do like to sleep in peace.


Dear Rod:

When Costain commenced development in Blackburn Hamlet in Reg. Plan 805, we negotiated an agreement with Skyline Cablevision Limited whereby we prepaid the installation and first two years of cablevision services for the lots in the Westpark and Southpark neighbourhoods.

One of the provisions covered in paragraph 8 of this agreement is that upon the expiration of the two years prepaid service, Skyline undertakes and agrees to continue this service on an individual subscription basis at a rate not to exceed \$4.00 per month, or twenty percent less than the prevailing subscription rate.

I believe that many people are not aware of this clause, and if it is possible to have it brought to their attention through "The Banner", I am sure those people affected will appreciate it.

Dear Mr. McDonald:

As you know, your company entered an agreement with Costain Estates Limited to provide cablevision services to the homes constructed in Reg. Plan 805 for a period of two years. On a number of the homes covered under this agreement, the two years of occupancy and cablevision use have now expired, and I believe you are contacting these people with regard to entering an independent contract with your company.

I would like to call your attention to paragraph 8 of the agreement between Skyline and Costain dated September 27, 1967 whereby your cablevision service is to continue at a rate not to exceed \$4.00 per month, or twenty percent less than the prevailing rate for other subscribers to your company.

This agreement is being brought to the attention of our purchasers in this Registered Plan, and I am sure that you will be hearing from them in regard to your honouring this provision of the agreement.
