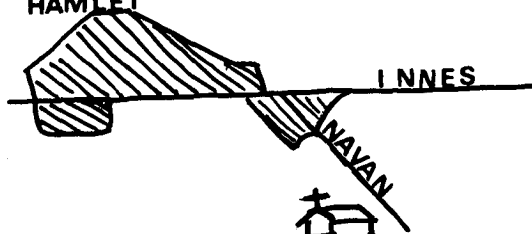

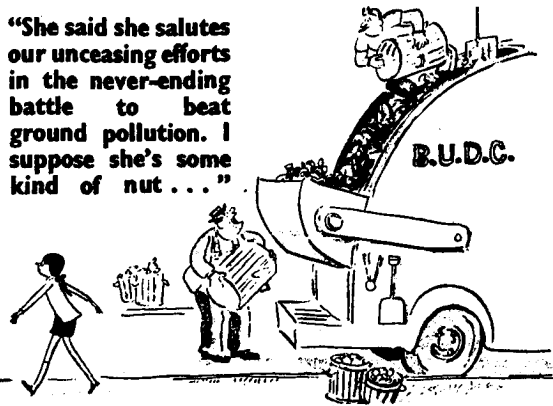

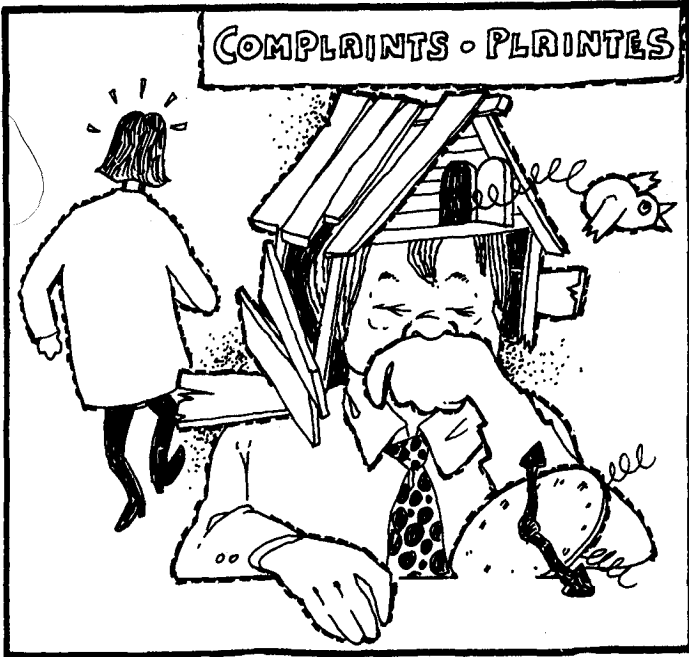

AIDEZ-VOUS D'ABORD ET ...

C.P. 99 est l'adresse postale du gouvernement fédéral et son antenne auprès du consommateur. Ce service s'emploie souvent à arbitrer les différends opposant le consommateur au fabricant ou détaillant dont il ne peut obtenir satisfaction. Sur les milliers de lettres qui parviennent à la C.P. 99 chaque année (nous garantissons une réponse), les plaintes qui nous donnent le plus de fil à retordre sont souvent celles dont l'objet est la Case postale elle-même.

Lorsque nous mettons un fabricant ou détaillant au courant d'une plainte, il arrive parfois que ce soit le premier mot qui lui ait été touché à ce sujet. Les producteurs se plaignent: "Pourquoi donc nos clients ne s'adressent-ils pas à nous au lieu d'ameuter le gouvernement?"

Le consommateur qui se plaint sur place au fournisseur obtient généralement des résultats plus rapides, et prévient souvent un cas grave de mécontentement général. Quand vous ne savez plus où donner de la tête pour obtenir que le fabricant ou le détaillant répare un tort, essayez-vous. Communiquez avec l'un des experts-conseils en consommation en poste dans la plupart des grandes villes, ou écrivez à l'adresse suivante: Le Consommateur, Case postale 99, en donnant tous les détails.

Mais essayez d'abord de vous mettre en rapport avec une personne responsable de la compagnie. Appelez-nous à la rescousse si ça ne donne rien.

B. H. SOCCER NEWS

In an earlier 1972 edition of the BANAR it was reported that soccer was now well established in the Blackburn Hamlet area through a combined project with neighbouring communities. Two teams had been entered in the Ottawa and District Minor Soccer League and a local House League was operating.

This House League, despite it being the first year of operation, allowed many boys to enjoy themselves, with a minimum of outlay and it has proved most popular. The conclusion of the House League program will be in mid October with cup finals and trophy presentations. Further details in this regard will hopefully be published in next month's BANAR.

The two teams placed in the Ottawa District minor soccer leagues met with mixed fortunes. Due to a poor start the senior of the two teams (under 16 years old) finished bottom of the league but showed promise and lots of improvement in the latter part of the season.

The Mosquito team (11-12 year olds) more than made up for this by their performance. They finished on top of the Mosquito league winning 21 of their 22 games played with one tie game and scored 81 goals with only 5 against them, a fine all round team effort.

Blackburn Hamlet can be rightfully proud of this team, the North Gloucester Hornets, as we supplied almost half of the 15 member team who stayed unbeaten in a long league season. The following boys from Blackburn Hamlet, in addition to their Beacon Hill counterparts, are to be commended and congratulated for their contribution to the team.

Ken Nyhuus, a fine captain, of both our team and the Ottawa All-Star team, who performed with style and polish seldom seen in an 11 year old.

Stuart Gibbs, vice captain and a member of the city All-Star team, who was an essential and reliable part of our halfback line, the best in the league.

Lawrence Thibault, a good all round player who found his best position was centre forward and is the team's top goal scorer with 22 goals.

Michael Northcote, another city All-Star team member, who scored 13 goals from the outside right position, found his speed and strength a great asset.

New to soccer this season Peter Mannion, settled down very well at full back and showed unusual flair and style for a newcomer to the game.

This season proved very rewarding for Jim Nyhuus, the youngest and smallest boy on the team. Early in the season playing on the forward line he performed well, however he later excelled himself in goal having 9 shut outs in 13 outings in that position.

Greg Dustan as with Peter Mannion was a newcomer to soccer this season gained in confidence and ability as the season progressed and hopefully will be an exciting member of next season's team.

It is interesting to note that half of this winning team will be eligible to play in the same league next season.

All these boys will I'm sure be the first to admit that success came through an excellent team effort and without each and every Beacon Hill boy, this team would not have done as well as it did.

We have had and really appreciate, support from all parents concerned, those who volunteered transportation, oranges and vocal support to each and every game, a big thank you. The financial support rendered by the various local Associations, including Blackburn Hamlet is also appreciated and welcome.

In addition to the House League final report next month, it is hoped that a financial statement will be available and although our needs for further fields and equipment are still with us, the organisers of the soccer feel rewarded and happy with the first full season of soccer in the area.

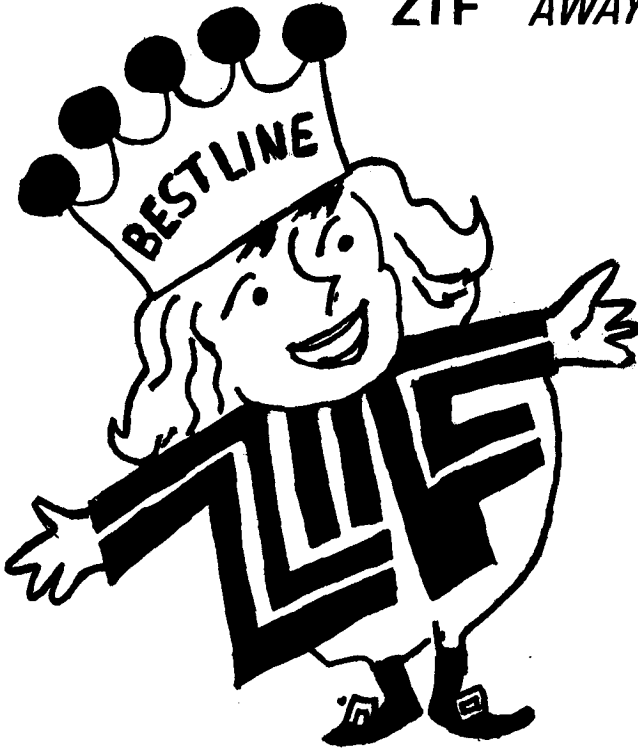

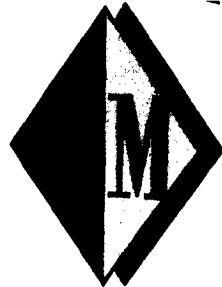



DAY CARE CENTRE ??



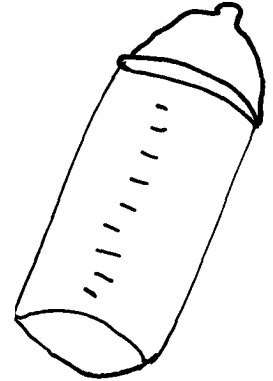
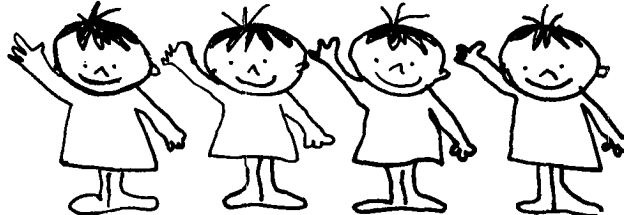
The Banar has recieved several enquiries about a Day Care Centre; in particular, the possibility of having one in the Blackburn area.

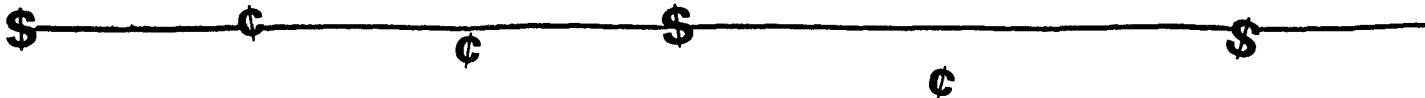



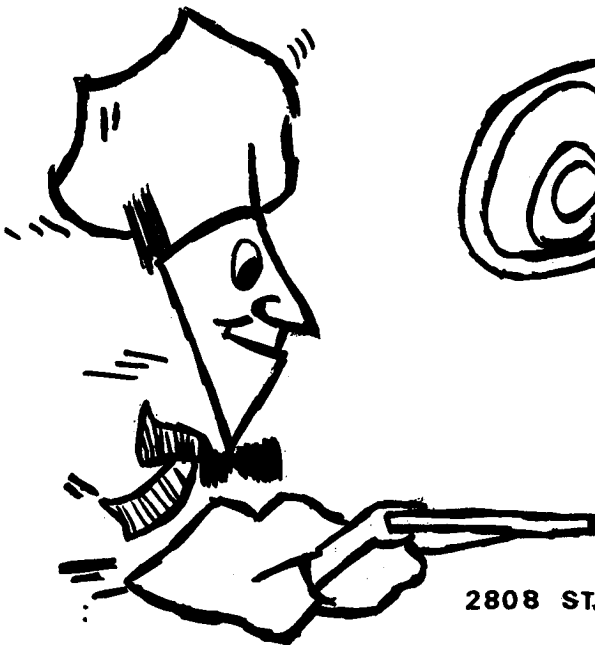
GIRL GUIDES OF CANADA - BLACKBURN DISTRICT

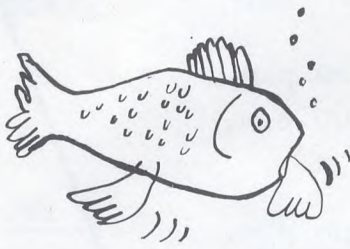

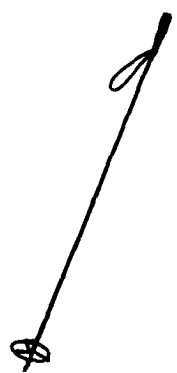

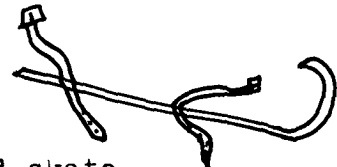
