





BCA DIRECTORS MEETING

APRIL 7, 1981

Present: Jo-Anne Bushell, Sheilagh Dubois, Bill Graham, Don Gray, Eldon Kemp, Ken Greenlaw, Gail Lacombe,

Andy Macdonald, Gwen Pollard, Mike Roche, Nelson Williams, Paul Phillipe.

Absent: George Dunthorne, Peter Houliston, Terry Melski and John Pollard.

The Minutes of the March Director's Meeting were previously distributed.

MOTION: 'Moved by Eldon Kemp, seconded by Don Gray that the minutes be adopted, CARRIED.

President Mike Roche welcomed Paul Phillipe, Recreational Co-ordinator, Recreation Department, City of Gloucester, who has replaced Barry Malmsten, to our Director's Meeting. Mike also informed the Directors that Jane Love of the Ottawa Choral Society would be joining the meeting later.

CORRESPONDENCE

Letter from Carson H. Miller, Chairman, Information Gloucester, to Mike Roche requesting financial support from BCA - Already forwarded \$200.

Letter to Les Chansonniers from Mike Roche thanking them for the complimentary tickets to their NAC Show which he enjoyed immensely.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

John Pollard (1st Vice-President) - Absent - Gwen Pollard reported that there has been conflict with the school bookings.
Bill Graham reported that the Badminton Group have booked the gym for four nights next year with the understanding if we need the gym we get it from them.

Bill Graham (2nd Vice-President) - Canteen - Bill informed the Directors that the Canteen is now closed and that the general feeling was that everything went well. Bill mentioned that he is in the process of making arrangements for a new canteen co-ordinator. Bill also mentioned he will be contacting the manager regarding the Canteen operation for next season. School Bookings - Bill informed the Directors that the Carleton Board of Education have stopped bookings for all elementary schools and because of this they are not returning copies of the bookings. Bill mentioned that this could present problems such as overbookings, Bill suggested perhaps decentralizing the bookings. In the meantime, Bill will continue to monitor the bookings. Mike Roche requested Sheilagh Dubois (Education) to contact the schools in the Blackburn Area to see if they would support keeping the present system. Bill to contact School Board first and advise Sheilagh of his findings before Sheilagh contacts the schools.

Andy Macdonald (Civic Affairs) - Andy Macdonald informed the Directors that arrangements have been finalized for the Gloucester Police Force to present a briefing on Community Watch Program at the Annual General Meeting on May 26, 1981, at 8:00 p.m. Gwen Pollard mentioned that a flyer would be distributed to the Community advising them of the General Meeting.

Sheilagh Dubois (Education) - Sheilagh Dubois informed the Directors that the cheque was delivered for the children's tables at the library. Sheilagh Dubois will be resigning her Directorship in June. Mike Roche suggested that she contact the area school principals for possible names to take over her position and report at the next meeting.

Jo-Anne Bushell (Fun Fair) - Jo-Anne Bushell informed the Directors that they still need a group to look after the Auction. Jo-Anne mentioned that there will be an All Star Baseball game at 1:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m. and the winners of the Ball Tournament will be playing the CKOY Team at 2:00 p.m. in the Bearbrook Park. Ken Greenlaw was selected by the Directors to organize the Bed Race as well as, be in charge of getting the bed ready for the parade.

Eldon Kemp (Maintenance) - Eldon Kemp reported that a rented Van drove on the Tauvette Field and has caused a considerable amount of damage for maintenance (approx. \$150.). After general discussion, Mike Roche suggested that the claim be taken to small claims court and agreed to look into this possibility. Eldon also mentioned that the Tauvette soccerfields require more work.

Gwen Pollard (Publicity) - Gwen Pollard invited the Directors to submit their updated reports for the Banar as it is the main vehicle in the Hamlet to keep the community aware of what is happening.

Peter Houliston (Special Projects) - Absent - Gwen Pollard reported that the sales for the fertilizer drive are not going well due to difficulty in getting canvasers. Gail Lacombe reported that she sent out approximately 450 BCA volunteer invitations.

Nelson Williams (Sports) - Nelson reported that the baseball registration this season was very successful. BMHA President Harvey Wittenburg was realected and Rockcliffe has been dropped from the GHA - now with East Ottawa. Sports equipment now stored in Blackburn Arena. The Ice Allocation Committee has accepted principle of counting participation as a factor for ice allocation. Nelson submitted his volunteer list with well over 200 names. Sub-committee will meet to discuss setting up a special account for hockey fund raising. (Sub-committee to include Mike Roche, Don Gray and Nelson Williams).

Don Gray (Treasurer) - Don Gray distributed BCA Combined Balance Sheet to Dec. 1980. Don Gray suggested we consider other auditors because of the excessive cost. Don also distributed an update of Revenue and Expenditures to the end of March 81, as well as, the Bookkeepers job description for the record. Don Gray distributed to the Directors, a suggested policy for distribution of grants in future years.



Ken Greenlaw (Youth Activities) - Regarding the donation from the Dentention Centre Ken Greenlaw informed the Directors that he is proceeding with option two, bleachers. Eldon Kemp to design bleachers (same type as RA Centre) cost approx. \$600. to be located at Tauvette Park at the teenagers diamond. After discussion the Directors agreed that Eldon order the material and that the Detention Centre do as much labour as their facilities can handle.

MOTION: Moved by Andy Macdonald, seconded by Sheilagh Dubois, that Eldon Kemp be empowered to finalize the design of appropriate bleachers, total amount not to exceed \$600. with the Ottawa Carleton Detention Centre to be invited to provide whatever labour they can in its construction and installation. CARRIED.

Mrs. Jane Love gave a brief presentation on the Ottawa Choral Society, which consists of 130 choir members with some professionals and funding by the Ontario Arts Council and the Canada Council. They have a variety of songs, pop, jazz, spirituals, as well as, French songs and also have a brass group. A concert usually is $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours long. Mrs. Love explained that she was approaching BCA with her program as a potential fund raiser for our community, as well as, with the desire to entertain in communities in greater Ottawa. Their fee is \$1000. which covers the instrumentalists. Mrs. Love brought to our attention that cultural grants may be available to assist us to off set some of the costs. The BCA would be responsible for the booking, selling of tickets and advertising. All proceeds would go to BCA. Mrs. Love informed the Directors that a booking could be made if we are interested in the period from May 15 to June 6 incl. of this year. After general discussion the Directors felt it would certainly be worth while looking into for 1982 but for the present the timing is not good since BCA is already organizing the Volunteer's Dance, and has Fun Fair early in June. Mike Roche suggested we take a rain check and get Peter Houliston (Special Projects) to look into it for the 1981-82 season. Mike to advise Jane Love of the Directors decision.

BY-PASS PUBLIC MEETING GLEN OGILVIE SCHOOL TUESDAY JUNE 23 7:30 P.M.

The political process as it relates to the Blackburn Hamlet By-Pass has reached the critical point. The Ottawa-Carleton Regional Transportation Committee has called a public meeting on the By-Pass for Tuesday, June 23 at 7:30 p.m. in Glen Ogilvie School. Public opinion as expressed at this meeting will be used by the Committee in deciding on whether to accept the recommendation of the Regional Transportation Department to opt for the Close-in By-Pass. Everyone in the Community is, therefore, strongly urged to attend this meeting and get involved.

BLACKBURN HAMLET BY-PASS

To service future Orleans traffic, the Regional Municipality of Ottawa-Carleton plans to build a close by-pass to Blackburn 150 metres or closer south of Hamlet properties. A close by-pass will lower property values, increase traffic noise and exhaust pollution, and remove recreational land currently used by walkers, cross-country skiers and children. The Blackburn Hamlet community has repeatedly stated that the best interests and qualities of life for residents will be maintained by a far by-pass along Anderson and Renaud roads, with Innes Road continuing as a proper two-lane community road.




Unless we act together the Regional planners will successfully ignore our wishes and build roads that make Blackburn a considerably less pleasant place to live in. This is not acceptable!



AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Members of the Blackburn Community Association:

We have examined the combined balance sheet of the Blackburn Community Association as at December 31, 1980 and the statements of general fund revenue, expenditure and accumulated net revenue and Fun Fair revenue, expenditure and accumulated net revenue for the year then ended. Our examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, and accordingly included such tests and other procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances except as explained in the following paragraph.

In common with many non-profit organizations, the Association reports amounts for membership fees, committee revenues and Fun Fair revenues amounting to \$149,006 which are not susceptible of complete verification by audit procedures. Accordingly, we were unable to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to revenues, excess of revenue over expenditure for the year, or accumulated net revenue.

In our opinion, except for the effect of any adjustments which might have been required had we been able to satisfy ourselves with respect to the revenue referred to in the preceding paragraph, these financial statements present fairly the financial position of the Association as at December 31, 1980, and the results of its operations for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles described in note 1 to the financial statements applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

They said they would not move anywhere else in Ottawa. What they particularly liked was that Blackburn has the aspects of a true hamlet, being surrounded by NCC greenbelt.

But today, we are in danger of becoming the Blackburn Sandwich. We should never let the Regional planners put in a By-Pass 150 metres from the southern edge of the Community, nor should we let Innes Road be turned into a 4-lane highway.

Realize that the noise and loss of scenic views will be the least of our problems. The big one is that housing values will go down along the southern tip of the community. This is an area with a high density of families. Everyone will be affected when unhappy residents move out. The character of the community would become less desirable. Also a close By-Pass will reduce our access to large sections of the NCC greenbelt. This will add to the burden of a community needing more outlets for adults and their children. We must identify these problems for they will affect the whole community.

SUCCESSFUL SEASON FOR THE "GREEN MACHINE"

The "GREEN MACHINE" Precision Skating Team from the Gloucester Skating Club, coached by Francine Belair, has come to the end of its 1980/81 competitive season. As pioneers for precision skating in the Ottawa area, the "GREEN MACHINE" has been in existence for only three years. During that period of time, with much hard work and dedication, they have been extremely successful and now rank third in Canada, and first in the Eastern Ontario Section.

The "GREEN MACHINE" is made up of 27 girls between the ages of 13 and 24. There are two teams that come under the "GREEN MACHINE" banner, a Junior and Senior team. In junior and senior categories, team selections are not made up by age, but by numbers. A junior team can have anywhere from 12 to 20 members while a senior team must include 20 or more skaters.

At the International Precision Skating Competition held at Whitby in February, the "GREEN MACHINE" captured all the top honors in winning both the Senior and Junior events. The Junior Team consisting of 16 skaters skated a highly intricate routine in an event totalling 22 teams. This event doubled as the Eastern Ontario Section Championship.

At the 4th Annual Linwell Precision Skating Competition held in Thorold, Ontario, the "GREEN MACHINE" continued their winning ways finishing first in the Junior event over 22 teams.

The 13th Annual Ottawa-Hull Inter-Skate Competition took place at Hull in mid March. A Junior Precision Event was held for the first time and the "GREEN MACHINE" reigned victorious. The RCMP donated a trophy for this event which has been presented to the "GREEN MACHINE".

At London in April the "GREEN MACHINE" competed at the prestigious Canadian International Precision Skating Competition as they have done the past two years. Thirty-six teams competed in the Junior Division and the "GREEN MACHINE" was a strong second in the final after winning its semi-final.

The Senior Team also solidly won their semi-final and placed fourth in the final. The "GREEN MACHINE" performances helped it clinch fourth spot overall in the Challenge Cup standings and a strong third among Canadian entries. Eighty-one teams competed in this two-day event and when one observes the high calibre of precision skating at such an event, the "GREEN MACHINE" is indeed very rpoud of the team's accomplishments.

To top off a most successful and rewarding season, the "GREEN MACHINE" Junior Team was invited to perform at the 1981 Celebrity Dinner at the North York Centennial Centre in Toronto, May 1st and 2nd. All proceeds from this show and dinner go to the figure skating Bursary Fund for support of Ontario competitors.




