As I reported last month, the Budget Meeting was a success....although as you can see by looking at our budgets elsewhere in this issue, we have once again applied deficit budgeting.


Several organizations voiced their concerns about the possibility of curtailing some programs because of our inability to provide more financing. The only alternative is to introduce fund raising.

ABSENT: Linda Phillips and Gord Kemp

President John Pollard called the Directors Meeting to order at 7:40 P.M.

Copies of the December 7th meeting were distributed.

President Pollard called for a motion on the minutes of the December meeting. It was noted that the minutes of the meeting be amended to show that Mike Irvin's name be added re rearranging of the trophy case at the arena.

MOTION: Moved by Ron Robin, seconded by Dave Roth that the minutes of the December meeting be adopted as amended.

PRESIDENT: John Pollard advised that application has been made for box at the Post Office at Alta Vista.

1st VICE PRESIDENT: Ron Robin - still no conclusion re trophy case at Library.

EDUCATION: Gloria Dawn Warkenton-Coulter mentioned the photo package was quite different this year and poor compared to other years. Also, the matter of report cards - Carleton much later in giving out report cards than the separate school boards. The Local Library has no copies of the minutes from the different Boards of Education. They are willing to display them if they can get copies.

SPORTS: Pat Vasudev mentioned the updating of the BCA By-Laws and President Pollard suggested that come March of '83 we could ask two or three people to form a committee to put this on the agenda. Pat Vasudev, Joanne Bushell, Gloria Dawn Warkenton-Coulter, and John Pollard volunteered. Pat also advised that Basketball and Volleyball will not be pursued.

MAINTENANCE: Eldon Kemp said rinks coming along well. Ball fields have some work that has to be done in the spring.

SPECIAL PROJECTS: Dave Ross thanked Joanne Bushell for the help re first play. He went on to say that the music is arranged for the Volunteer Dance, Friday, April 29th. After some discussion it was decided to proceed with the Fertilizer Drive this year. The sale will be in March.

TRANSPORTATION: Mike Irvin - Jack Rabbit may be cancelled because of lack of snow.

YOUTH ACTIVITIES: Dave Roth - Day Camp - deposited rebate for transportation. Arrangements will be made for camp to be held for six weeks commencing July 4th and also for a seventh week if possible. Ad will be placed in the Banar for councillors. Karate - cancelled due to lack of interest.

JOINT MEETING

JANUARY 25, 1983

President John Pollard called the meeting to order at 8:10 P.M. Approximately 30 people in attendance.

The President welcomed all the Ratepayers and outlined that the first part of the meeting would be a ratepayers meeting for the purpose of approving the distribution of the City Recreation Grant. The second part would be the general meeting of the BCA to approve the 1983 Budget.

MOTION: It was moved by H. Wittenberg, seconded by John Rowe, that the minutes of the Jan. 26, 1982 Ratepayers and Community Assoc. Joint Meeting be approved as presented in the March 1982 Banar. Carried.

The President outlined that the 1983 budget would be a deficit budget and that the groups may have to do some community fund raising and he hoped some co-ordination could be arranged through the BCA. He then called on D. Donnelly, Treasurer, who outlined the proposed distribution of the 1983 Recreation Grant and then opened the meeting to questions from the floor. Discussion followed.

MOTION: It was moved by Ron Robin, seconded by Mike Irvin, that the proposed distribution of the recreation grant for 1983 be accepted as published. Carried.

MOTION: It was moved by Garth Bracewell, seconded by Pat Vasudev, that the Ratepayers meeting be adjourned. Carried.

President Pollard called the General Meeting of the BCA to order.

Dennis Donnelly (Treasurer) reviewed the BCA Proposed Budget for 1983 and outlined this would be a deficit budget. Discussion followed.

MOTION: It was moved by Garth Bracewell, seconded by Dave Roth, that the 1983 Blackburn Community Association budget be accepted. Carried.

President Pollard thanked the budget committee and the BCA Directors for their time in preparing this budget.

President Pollard opened a discussion on Fund Raising in the community. His comments on this will be in the February issue of the BANAR. Discussion: It was felt that the schools should be contacted and asked to co-ordinate their fund raising with the community groups. It was also felt that outside groups should be discouraged from coming into the Hamlet.

The President thanked everyone for coming to the meeting and called for a motion to adjourn.

MOTION: It was moved by John Rowe, seconded by Terry Heaslip, that the meeting be adjourned. Carried.

EDUCATION

Dr. Whittle (Principal of Glen Ogilvie), in an effort to provide better communication between the home and school, has and is presenting a series of three seminars scheduled for January and February. At the time of writing this article, the first two have been presented: 1) Staff Development: In-Service and Professional Development, Supervision of Staff; 2) Student Placement and Promotion Procedures; and 3) Multigraded Classrooms.

Dr. Whittle had obviously spent much time preparing such thorough seminars on the above topics. He allowed considerable time for parental input during and after the seminars. Unfortunately, only five people attended the first seminar. Seventeen attended the second seminar. I am sure all who attended these seminars felt they had gleaned a better understanding of the scope and limitations the schools in our area are under.

Contrary to our Provincial Minister of Education's comments, teachers do not take off skiing or do any other "pleasurable fun activities" on our children's time. Teachers work very hard on P.A. and P.D. days. Many of the activities they are involved in are for the direct benefit of our children. As all boards must write for permission stating what activities are intended for such P.A. and P.D. days, I was very surprised by her comments which appeared in the Citizen. I am, however, pleased that schools will no longer be able to use these days for parent/teacher interviews (according to the Citizen). Now the schools will have to provide some evening interviews for those parents who are unable to attend during the day.

The Ministry has come up with a new policy regarding physical education. The schools are expected to provide 40 minutes a day. To be physically fit, one only needs to exercise 20 minutes 3 times a week. Glen Ogilvie

currently has two-30 minute periods a week. Since the instructional day for students is approximately 5 hours and is not expected to be lengthened, what subject(s) are going to be robbed to provide this extra time for physical education? Glen Ogilvie will have met with the Planning Board by the time this article appears in print. If you are concerned about your school's plans, please phone your principal/trustee.

While writing this article, a few parents have phoned to ask about Home and School-type associations at the various schools. I will inquire and report on this in the next BANAR issue, as well as report on Dr. Whittle's third seminar and the Planning Commission meeting held in February.

Blackburn Hamlet PRE-SCHOOL

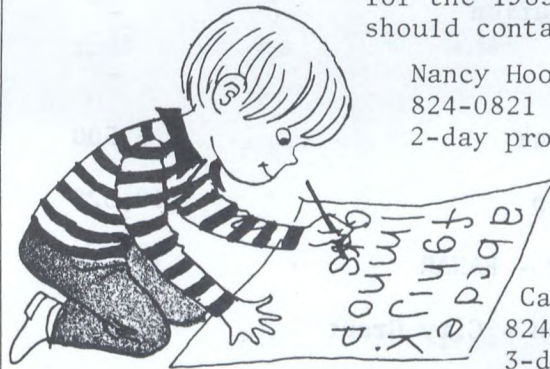
In January, we had our annual Dad's night. The purpose of these evenings is to allow the
