# B.C.A. DIRECTORS MEETING

SUMMARY OF B.C.A. DIRECTORS MEETING SEPTEMBER 11, 1984

**PRESENT:** Roger Pyper, Joanne Bushell, Don Gray, Harvey Wittenberg, Ken Greenlaw, Pat Vasudev, Trixie Clow, Jane O'Reilly, Gloria Dawn Warkentin-Coulter, Eldon Kemp, Marg Maddock, Chris Brett (for Robert Madill)

The President, Roger Pyper, called the meeting to order at 7:45 p.m. The minutes of the meeting for June 5, 1984 were distributed.

**MOTION:** Duly moved and seconded that the minutes be adopted. MOTION CARRIED.

**COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

Roger Pyper (President) - reported that \$1,824.44 was received from the Gloucester Bengals Football Club and that they now requested a grant of \$500.00.

**MOTION:** Duly moved and seconded that the B.C.A. approve a grant of \$500.00 to the Eastern Gloucester Bengals Football Club. MOTION CARRIED.

- reported on the All Candidates Meeting held on August 16, 1984 at Louis Riel High School.

Ken Greenlaw (Treasurer) - the grants to the various organizations have been paid out  
- he will study the B.C.A. Budget process, and will find out from the city the budget deadlines and any stipulations on it.

**MOTION:** Duly moved and seconded that a Budget Committee be struck for this year including the Treasurer, President, 1st and 2nd Vice-Presidents, and the Sports Director. MOTION CARRIED.

Chris Brett (for the Civic Affairs Committee) - the newly-formed Civic Affairs Committee consists of Robert Madill, Chris Brett and Rusty Torobin.  
- a letter should be framed on behalf of the B.C.A., against Huneault Dump as it is now, and this was generally agreed to after some discussion.

Eldon Kemp (Maintenance) - the lacrosse box, the Blackburn field house and the skating shack were all painted, and a new roof installed on the skating shack.  
- the fields were updated, and the fencing around the lacrosse box will be shortly updated as well.

Harvey Wittenberg (Membership) - summer and fall registrations added 105 new members, to bring the total B.C.A. membership to 1760.  
- a letter will be sent to all organized group activities outlining that the \$20.00 surcharge to all non-B.C.A. members at registration must be collected and can be kept by the organizing group itself.

Pat Vasudev (Sports) - attended a meeting July 5th of the G.R.C.C., the Gloucester Parks and Recreation Dept., and the (arena) ice users of the area to discuss the need for a sixth ice surface. The final decision hinged on the cost and the location of the new surface.  
- we should support the need for a sixth surface in a letter to Council.

**MOTION:** Duly moved and seconded that the B.C.A. approve approximately \$200.00 (not to exceed \$250.00) over the approved budget for boy's baseball to be paid out. MOTION CARRIED.

- the Bylaw Committee will be re-activated, and is composed of Roger Pyper, Pat Vasudev, Harvey Wittenberg, Gloria Dawn Warkentin-Coulter and George Bushell.

Don Gray (1984 Fun Fair) - the net profit from this past Fun Fair was \$10,301.00 (compared to \$11,195.00 last year) basically due to additional expenses, and each share value is \$283.16.  
- an ad will be put in the BANAR for a new Chairperson for 1985 as he and Don Clow are unable to do it again next year.

## SCHOOL BUS SAFETY

A common sight each school morning is a line of lunch bags at the school bus stop and children playing. When the bus comes into sight, the children get into line in sequence as established by the lunch bags. Late arrivals may be rushing or running from any direction, not always protected by the flashing lights on the stationary bus. In the afternoon, younger children getting off a bus are prone to relish their new freedom from authority and rush into play. More children have been killed while waiting for, boarding, or leaving the school bus than while riding it. Each parent must assume the responsibility for children at or near the school bus stop. School authorities can instruct each child on correct behaviour, but it is up to parents to enforce the teaching.

The Canada Safety Council reminds all drivers to keep alert for school buses and their flashing red stop signals: Provincial law requires all approaching, as well as following, drivers to stop their vehicles when a school bus is loading or unloading passengers and the overhead lights are on. Children may be unpredictable, but your responsibilities as a driver are clear.
