## NOTICE

Pursuant to the provisions of By-law 172 of 1975 of the Corporation of the City of Gloucester and the amending resolutions of Council, the following are the particulars of the upcoming Annual General Meeting to be held on December 17, 1985.

1. The meeting will be held on December 17th, 1985 at 8:00 p.m. in the Library of Glen Ogilvie Public School, Blackburn Hamlet.
2. Each resident is entitled to file either one statement of support or one statement of opposition to the proposals which are referred to herein. The statements shall be forwarded to the Committee, whose postal address is:

Statements submitted by mail and written statements submitted by residents at the Annual General Meeting shall have the same force and effect upon any decision taken by the Committee concerning proposals and all written statements shall form part of the documentation submitted by the Committee to Council.

All statements of opposition or support must be received at the above noted address no later than December 16, 1985.

The C.R.C.C. will also receive community ideas for projects for 1987, thus if there are projects that you wish to see undertaken in your area, this meeting constitutes an active means by which you may be heard. You may also mail in your ideas, before March 16, 1986 at the above noted address.

3. The object of the Annual General Meeting is to ensure that residents and Council are kept fully informed of the activities of the Committee and as well, to determine the extent of the support or opposition to the proposals put forward by the Committee.
4. During the past year (1985), this Committee has held meetings at which it:
  - a) Saw to the upkeep and maintenance of all existing park facilities which are the responsibility of the Committee within the confines of Blackburn Hamlet;
  - b) Entered into an agreement with the Blackburn Community Association Tennis Committee for the operation of the tennis courts;
  - c) With the assistance of the City Recreation Department, established rates and policy with regard to the Bearbrook Swimming Pool and saw to the operation of that swimming pool during the 1985 season;
  - d) Dealt with the concerns of the residents with respect to the parks and structures under the control of the Committee;
  - e) Conducted studies in conjunction with City Staff, of requirements that exist for maintenance and capital projects of Parks and Recreation Facilities within Blackburn Hamlet;
  - f) Reviewed a comprehensive report by the City Staff which provided cost estimates for projects to be completed in 1986 and after;
  - g) Received a revenue and incurred the expenses as hereinafter set out in the financial statements;
5. Proposals for 1986

The Committee has approved Capital Expenditures in the amount of \$55,985 for 1986 which will result in the enhancement of our neighbourhood parks, upgrading of Bearbrook Park and the Pool building and completion and upgrading of the pathway system within the Hamlet.

- A SAFE PLACE TO LIVE



The 1984 Canadian Crime Statistics have just been released by the Canadian Centre for Justice Statistics. Chief Lester Thompson is pleased to report that the City of Gloucester has the lowest crime rate per 100,000 population of all the cities in Ontario, having a population between 50,000 and 99,999. This indicates that the City of Gloucester is a very safe city to live and work in.

Mayor Mitch Owens, as police commissioner and a former police officer, is very proud of the fact that the City of Gloucester is the safest community in Ontario, and wishes to state that the credit for this enviable record should go to all our dedicated police officers in Gloucester.

On Sunday September 29th, 1985, 29 Gloucester Police officers took part in the eight Annual Memorial Service on Parliament Hill, commemorating those Police and Correctional Officers who were killed in the line of duty.



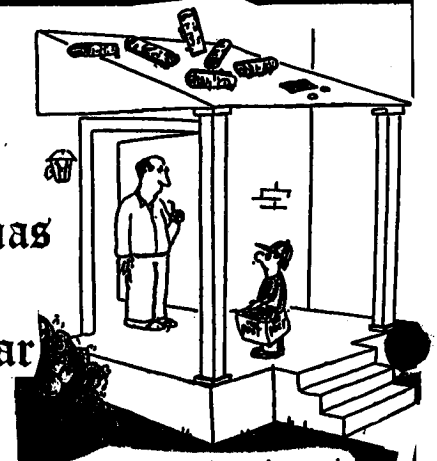

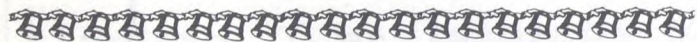
On November 17, the Club presented a demonstration by their competitive skaters who skated at Eastern Ontario Sectionals in Nepean from November 28th to December 1st.

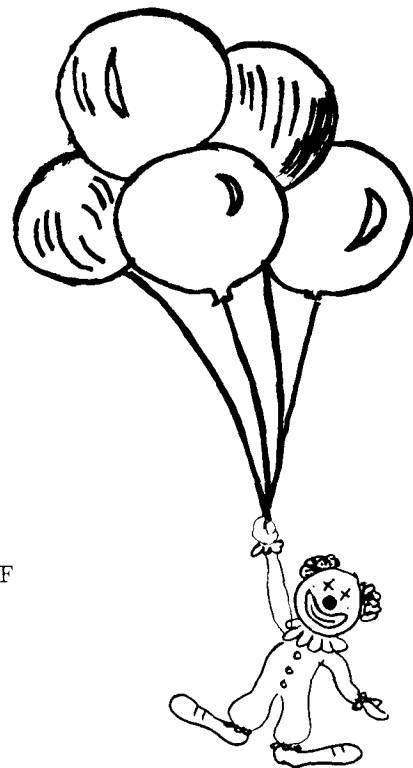

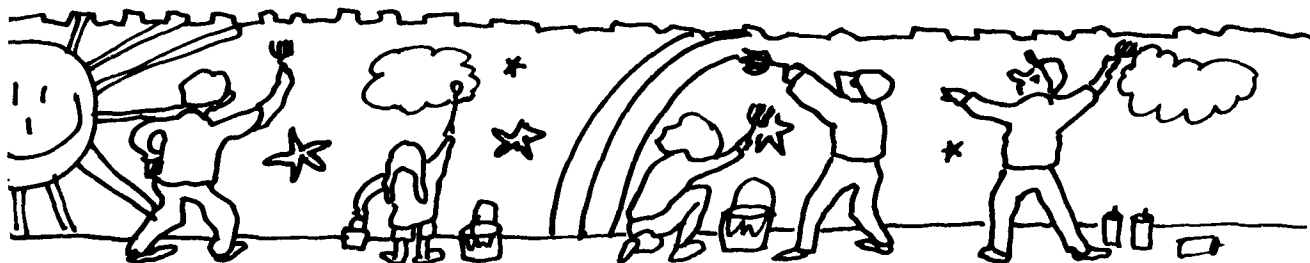

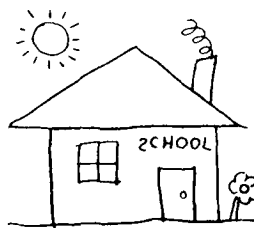
# Blackburn Ringette Association

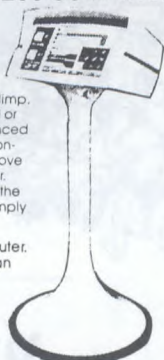

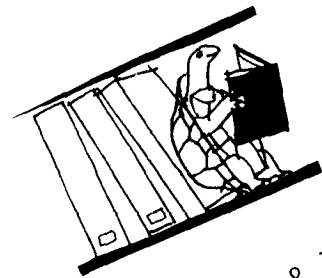

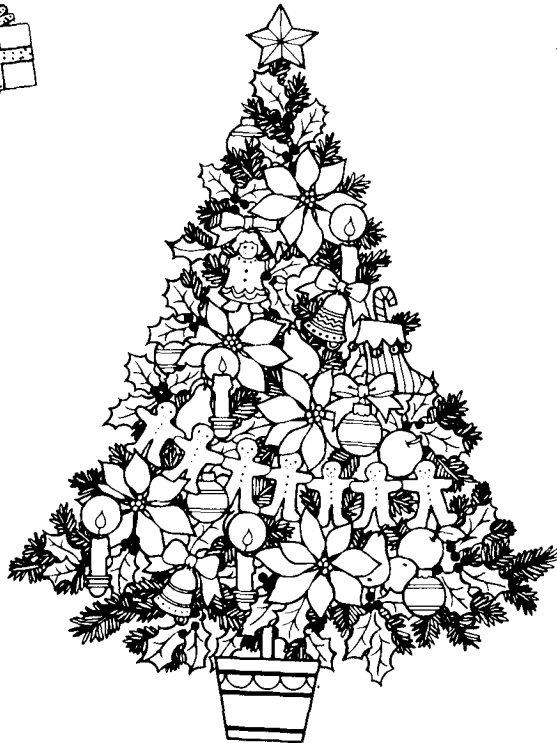

Two new programs have recently been introduced at the GLOUCESTER CENTRE FOR COMMUNITY RESOURCES. For the first time in the City of Gloucester, an outreach crisis service is being offered. A bilingual full and part-time counsellor have been hired to provide crisis intervention service for battered women. The program's aim is to be an outreach service for the women living in the rural areas of Gloucester where very few resources exist and to link these women with the appropriate services.

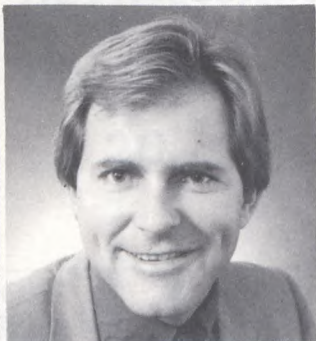
Long-term counselling will not be provided but a support group will be organized in the near future. If a woman is thinking of leaving the family home, the counsellors will link her with a transition house and if she's going to court to lay charges, then necessary support will be provided.

The program offers the single parent help in planning a career change and info about financial assistance and day care. Its aim is to help the single parent make the right career decision which hopefully will lead towards independence. Individual and group counselling is provided in both official languages and is available free of charge to both single mothers and fathers.

**ALL-CANDIDATES MEETING**

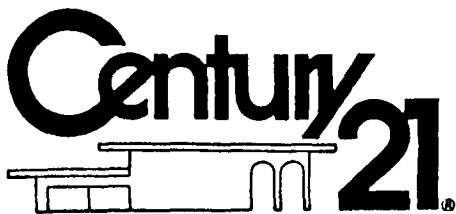
By the time you read this, we will all know the outcome of the Municipal Elections held on NOVEMBER 12, 1985 and maybe there will have been some changes!

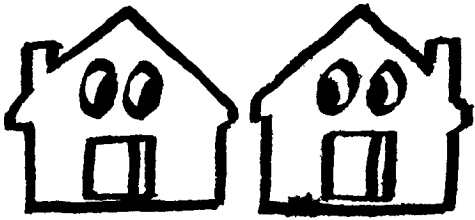
Again, the main topic of interest was the transportation and road issues - it seems we have been listening to the BLACKBURN BY-PASS dilemma for the past ten years!

# NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

## WHAT IS NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH?

Neighbourhood Watch is simply a program of neighbours watching other neighbours' property during times when burglaries are likely to occur. A police officer patrolling our community may not recognize a stranger in your yard -- but your neighbours would.

## HOW DOES IT WORK?

The program works through mutual aid -- NEIGHBOURS WATCHING OUT FOR NEIGHBOURS. Neighbours know who you are, what type of car you own and may be the first to notice a burglar at your window or door. Each neighbour can effectively watch those homes to each side, the front and the back of his own home.

With the assistance of a number of interested residents of our community, a Steering Committee was established, aided and guided by the Gloucester Police Department.

One of the first actions of the Committee was to organize a General Meeting of the community. This meeting was held on November 26, 1985 at Louis Riel High School.

Prior to the meeting, members of the Steering Committee approached residents of Blackburn Hamlet on an individual basis to seek support for the program. Although generally successful, this individual attention was not possible in the Eastpark and Navan Road areas. Volunteers from residents of these areas are urgently required to ensure their participation in the Neighbourhood Watch Program.
