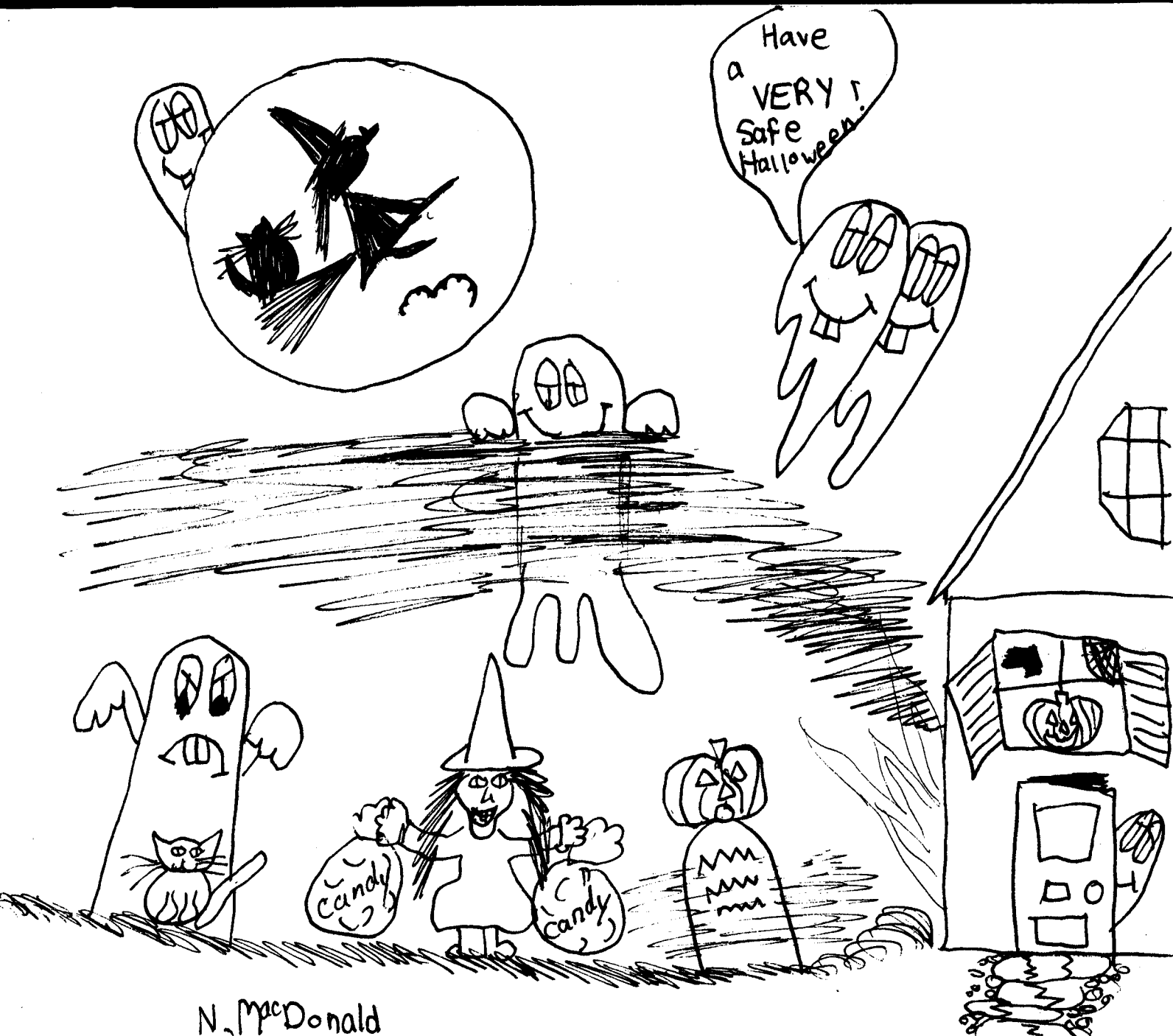

BLACKBURN HAMLET - THE REGION'S DUMPING GROUND?

I AM SURE THAT MOST RESIDENTS ARE AWARE OF THIS ISSUE AS A RESULT OF THE B.C.A. ACTIVITY OVER THE SUMMER, HOWEVER, I WOULD LIKE TO USE THIS FIRST ISSUE OF THE BANAR TO REVIEW EXACTLY WHERE WE ARE - AND WHERE WE ARE GOING !!

BACKGROUND:

Over the past two years the Regional Municipality has had a WASTEPLAN TASK FORCE investigating the option for solid waste (garbage) disposal, in anticipation of the existing landfill sites reaching their capacity in the late 1990's. The task force is a political body with representation from the effected municipalities (and also lay members from the community) and it has contracted a consultant (MACLAREN ENGINEERING) to perform the technical analysis and make recommendations.

This consultant, based on guidelines from the provincial Ministry of the Environment, came up with a number of options for waste disposal:

- DIRECT TRUCKING TO LANDFILL SITES (AS PER EXISTING PRACTICE)
- CONSOLIDATION OF REFUSE AT A TRANSFER STATION, AND SUBSEQUENT TRUCKING TO A LANDFILL SITE.
- INCINERATION (WITH STEAM OR ELECTRICITY GENERATED : ENERGY FROM WASTE = EFW), AT ONE OR MORE SITES.
- A COMBINATION OF THE ABOVE.

This activity is now coming to a conclusion. In a report issued this Spring the consultant identified 10 PREFERRED SITES (out of an original total of 34) as targets for siting the waste processing, transfer and disposal facility. The B.C.A.'s concern results from the fact that one of these - SITE #22 - is located at the intersection of St. Joseph Boulevard and Bearbrook Road. The actual site may extend into the Francon Quarry Property, and it is a potential location for either a very large INCINERATOR (1 of 4 preferred sites), or for a TRANSFER STATION (1 of 5 preferred sites).

IMPACT ON BLACKBURN HAMLET:

The INCINERATOR is the worst possible option in that it would emit very toxic air pollution. Specifically, recent studies have shown that the majority of DIOXINS in our environment come from incineration. Given the concern and uncertainty over this powerful carcinogen (and possible genetic mutagen) it is almost unbelievable, but the Ministry of the Environment 'requires' all municipalities to include incineration in their waste disposal plans. This has been challenged by Pollution Probe but to date no response has been forthcoming. In our case this plant would burn over 600 tons of garbage a day in a building the size of a football field, with a 200 foot chimney stack. This garbage would be trucked here all day long from across the Region, at a rate of over 500 trucks a day - one per minute, every minute, 10 hours a day! This traffic would also result if SITE #22 was to be designated as a TRANSFER STATION. Although this option wouldn't produce the dioxins in our neighbourhood, we would have the garbage, the rats and seagulls that accompany it, and also traffic safety problems. We are all too familiar with Francon's trucks, and the recent increase in traffic as a result of the cement plant - imagine the addition of one truck a minute to that in the winter! In the spring, summer and fall the bicycle and pedestrian traffic along Bearbrook (e.g., to Louis Riel School and the Hornet's Nest Soccer Fields) will bear the brunt of this overload.

B.C.A. ACTIVITY:

The B.C.A., anticipating the community's reaction to having a facility of this nature dumped in our backyard, took the initiative this summer and organized an awareness campaign in the Hamlet. We have a team of very concerned residents working to ensure that everyone is aware of this potential threat.

From the strong response to our booth at the Fun Fair, we built up an organization of over 100 people to distribute the 'NO GARBAGE HERE' flyer to every household in July, and to canvas for our petition in August. Although we received strong support, many people were away on holidays, we still need your signature and support. We were also able, through Ed Campbell's involvement, to get Gloucester council to authorize funds to pursue our goal.

The team also arranged and held a very successful public meeting at Louis Riel School on August 26th. Over 400 people from the Hamlet, and from Chapel Hill, turned out and packed the hall. We received strong support from Gloucester Council (see Mayor Allen's letter in this issue), and from our MPP Gilles Morin. The Chairman of the WASTEPLAN TASK FORCE, Nepean alderman Frank Reid, explained the background of the process as I have above. However, he was unable to provide any assurances to the concerned residents, or to refute any of the issues raised by the invited speaker from POLLUTION PROBE. The key point raised was that we must not be compacent - we must continue to use whatever means are at our disposal to reject incineration as an option, and to fight against the use of Site #22

WHERE TO?

The Region will be holding a FINAL PUBLIC HEARING on NOVEMBER 27th to listen to submissions from concerned groups. This will be our last chance to have our voices heard before the decisions and site selections are made. The B.C.A. will be presenting a brief opposing SITE #22 (as will Chapel Hill). Please give me a call if you would like to assist in this task.

Unfortunately, the Region postponed this meeting from early September, and as a result it is essential to continue to make your views known. Frank Reid and Gilles Morin were receiving 3-4 letters a day from our community this summer opposing SITE #22 - this must not stop. Make sure that these people, as well as those at the municipal level such as Claudette Cain, Gloucester's representative on the Task Force, know your feelings and views. I am including a list of names and addresses to whom your grievances can be addressed. Please feel free to copy the B.C.A. or myself, but be sure to write in October and to also encourage your neighbours. **THE REGION'S DECISION WILL AFFECT ALL OF US!!**

In summary, Blackburn is now well informed on this issue and is united in it's strong opposition to the use of SITE #22. The B.C.A. will be continuing this opposition on your behalf with a brief to the Regional Task Force in November - but **YOUR DIRECT INVOLVEMENT BY INDIVIDUALLY EXPRESSING YOUR VIEWS MUST CONTINUE.**

Tower at the Glenview Park

of the second office tower at the Glenview
Park of Commerce on Friday, September 5,
1986 at 11:00 a.m., at the construction site.
Mayor Allen and Mr. Shabinsky will partici-
pate in the pouring of the foundation.

Tower One of the Glenview Park of Commerce
began in April, 1986. At that time City
Hall announced its decision to relocate
City Hall to this tower from 4550 Bank Street.
With the signing of the lease agreement
between the City of Gloucester and Glenview
Corporation Limited, Glenview stated their
commitment to commence construction of Tower
Two within ninety (90) days. Construction
of Tower Two began in late August and it
will be completed for occupancy by May 1,
1987. The remaining three towers will be
construction by 1990. The total value of
the five office towers will be 100 million
dollars.

Glenview Corporation Limited is presently
negotiating with a major hotel to locate
a 200 room hotel, complete with banquet and
health club facilities in the Glenview Park
of Commerce.

With the completion of the transitway, a bus
terminal will operate at close proximity to
the Glenview Park of Commerce.

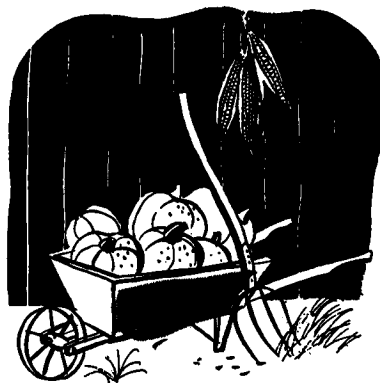

Waste management

A well attended meeting at Louis-Riel demonstrated the opposition to the use of Site 22 for any sort of waste management. I was pleased that Gilles Morin, our Provincial Member, was able to attend and that he is able to give us his whole-hearted support.

As indicated at the meeting, I presented a resolution to Council in July, seconded by Alderman Bellemare, to oppose the use of Site 22. The resolution was adopted and Council clearly supports the community. Part of the resolution was an approval for the use of funds to support the community in the fight against the waste proposal.

City Facilities

Work on the new City Hall is progressing and we expect to move into it by December 1, 1986. That will have a major impact on the delivery of services, but it is not by any means the end of the line. Our Police Department requires new or additional premises. Part of the fire station building on Blair Road will become available, but at best that is a temporary solution. In the long run the more efficient alternative would be a new police station, better located.

As a growing City we have needs for more or better facilities for our libraries and for our other social services and groups, including our seniors. The Blackburn Library, the best used in our system is an example. There was a missed opportunity 3 years ago to solve its space problems and will report to you on it in the near future.

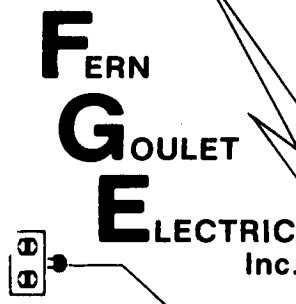

WASTE MANAGEMENT

I am writing at this time to reiterate the position that I presented before the Waste Management Master Plan Task Force at the May 29th meeting held at Cyrville Community Centre. There was a good attendance at this meeting and citizens of Blackburn Hamlet and adjacent communities provided very sound, well-rationalized arguments against the construction of a Transfer Centre/Incinerator at the Bearbrook/St. Joseph Boulevard site.

In speaking at this meeting I made it very clear that I am categorically opposed to this site being used for a Transfer Centre/Incinerator site. I elaborated site by site how Gloucester as a municipality had up to now accepted more than a fair share of the Region's waste. With the planned enlargement of the Green's Creek Pollution Control Plant all of the Region's sanitary waste will be precessed in Gloucester. This is more than any other municipality has accepted and to propose another waste management site for Gloucester is going well beyond the realm of reasonableness.

The Green's Creek Pollution Control Plant is located in a valley and has an impact on the quality of air in the general neighbourhood. To add another layer of pollution to the air in this area exposes the Beacon Hill, Orléans and Blackburn Hamlet communities to a risk that is environmentally non-acceptable. These additional toxic emissions could conceivably break through the tolerance levels and place the entire community at tremendous risk. Gloucester City Council will take whatever action is appropriate to protect our quality of life. We have set up a committee of specialists on environmental matters and we have already expended funds in order to achieve the highest level of professional opinion concerning the Green's Creek Pollution Control Plant expansion. Gloucester has made a valuable input to the design process for this plant expansion and the Regional Government accepts and recognizes the professional advice of our experts.

Gloucester Council has recently authorized contingency funds to seek independent expert opinion on the matter of environmental impact should an incinerator continue to be proposed for the Bearbrook Road site. Should the Region insist on locating the incinerator at this location we will be ready to represent the best interests of our citizens before an Environmental Assessment Board hearing.

Yes Gloucester has accepted more than it's share, and we are not going to stand by idly and let the Region "dump" on us. The quarry, the expanded Pollution Control Plant and an incinerator - No Way.

We have had our fair share of the minuses in the Ottawa-Carleton Region and it is now time to accentuate the positive in a much more aggressive manner. For a prime example, we need only look to our doorsteps and the Regional Detention Centre ("The Home Away from Home"). And lest we forget, we have an existing sewage treatment plant being expanded to handle all of the region's sewage only meters away from Green's Greek Conservation Area.

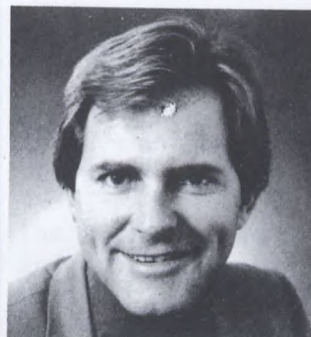

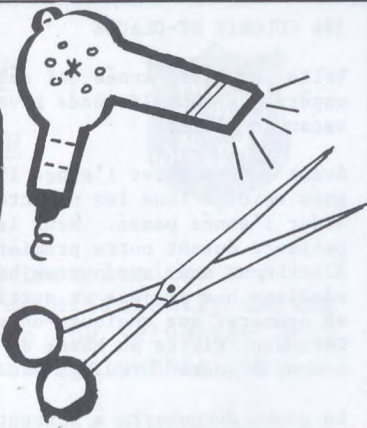

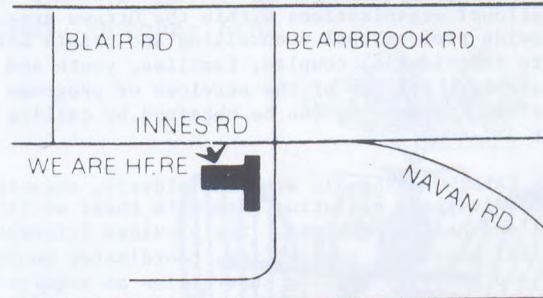

GLOUCESTER CENTRE FOR COMMUNITY RESOURCES
CENTRE DES RESSOURCES COMMUNAUTAIRES DE GLOUCESTER

The GLOUCESTER CENTRE FOR COMMUNITY RESOURCES is located at 2040 Arrowsmith Drive (at Jasmine Crescent) and serves Gloucester and adjacent areas.

The Centre has been in operation since March, 1979 and is funded primarily by the Regional Social Services Department, with contributions from local organizations, service clubs, provincial programs, voluntary social service agencies, private citizens and businesses. Staff is provided by the Region, the City of Gloucester, social service and educational organizations within the Ottawa area. The staff provide professional counselling and crisis intervention to individuals, couples, families, youth and single parents. For any of the services or programs listed below, information can be obtained by calling the Centre at 741-6025.

A SPECIAL CARE WORKER deals with the elderly, chronically ill and handicapped, assisting them with their social, financial and health problems. She provides information and referral services, counselling, coordinates support services and provides ongoing supervision as required. A TEACHING HOMEMAKER provides guidance, direction and support to individuals or families to enable them to become more self-sufficient, independent and skilled in various aspects of homemaking (budgeting, household management, meal planning, cooking, shopping and crafts, etc.). HOME HELPERS are hired by the Region to work on a part-time basis to do light housekeeping, baby-sitting and provide personal support to families/individuals in financial need. If you are reliable and mature and would like to work as a HOME HELPER or require one of these services, contact the TEACHING HOMEMAKER at the Centre.

CRISIS OUTREACH WORKERS work with battered women living in the urban and rural areas. Crisis intervention, counselling, home visits and a support group are available.

ACTION FOR CAREERS AND TRAINING (ACT) PROGRAM helps single parents receiving GWA/FBA decide and aid them through major changes such as going back to school or looking for work.

PROGRAMS AND RESOURCES :

SENIORS' EMPLOYMENT COUNSELLING - a volunteer from the Seniors' Employment Bureau (a voluntary, non-profit placement service for seniors 55 years and over) is in the Centre on Mondays. Call for an appointment - 741-6025.

LEGAL AID CLINIC - a free legal aid clinic is held every Tuesday from 4 - 8 p.m. on a first-come, first-serve basis.

MEALS ON WHEELS - volunteer program to deliver hot, nutritious meals to the homebound, elderly or disabled every weekday at noon. Meals are prepared by a local boarding home and cost is \$15 per week. Anyone knowing of a homebound individual who could benefit from this service is asked to call the co-ordinator, Iveagh McGilp at 749-0939.

PRE-NATAL AND POST-NATAL CLASSES - sponsored by the Regional Health Unit and conducted by a public health nurse. Register with the Regional Health Unit at 722-2242 (no fee).
