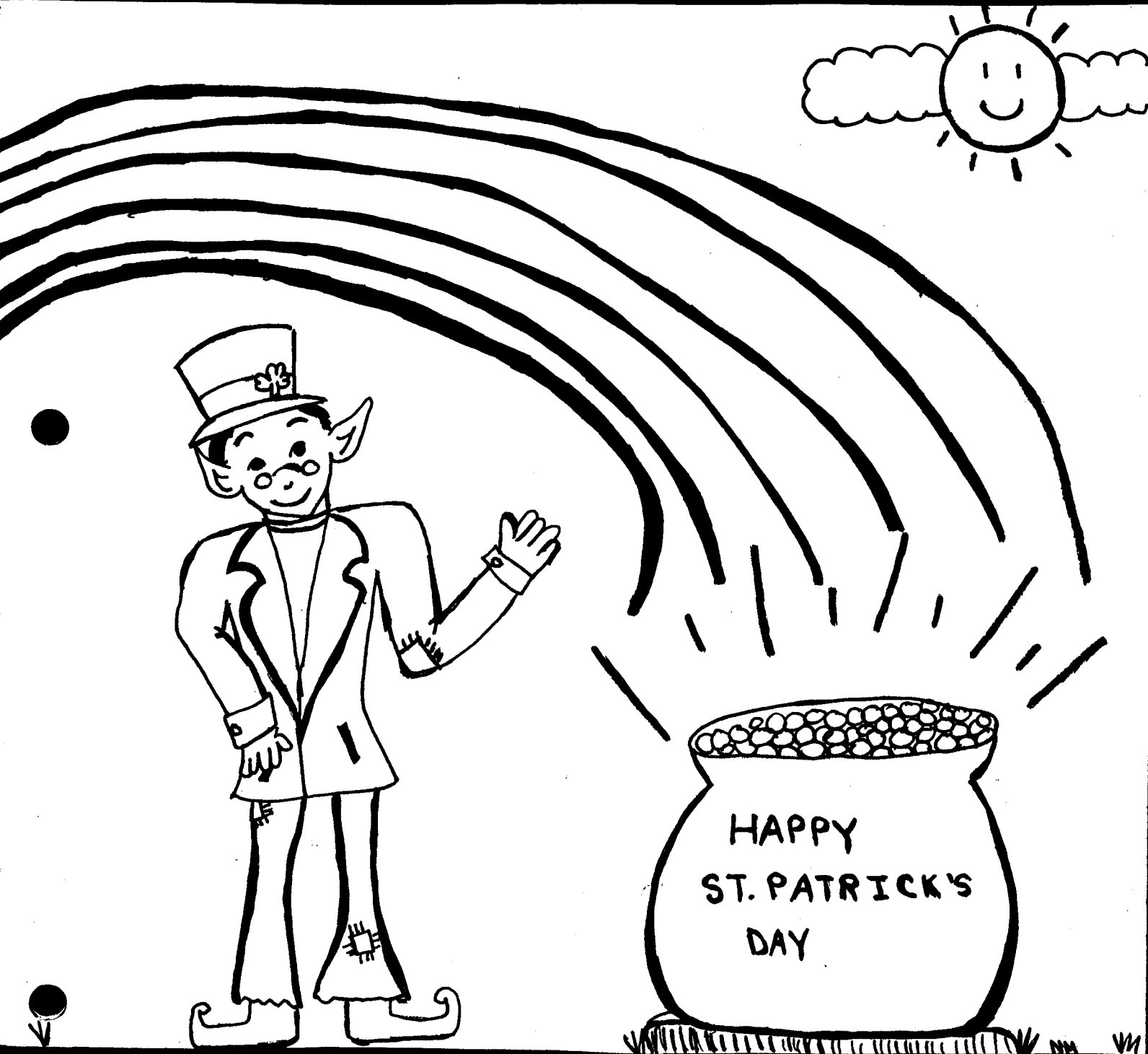

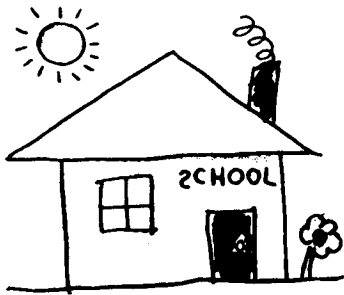

Good for Them. Good for YOU

Surprisingly enough, as parents, you get almost as much out of our cooperative program as your children do. It's a chance to get involved in the very beginnings of your child's education; a chance to actively participate outside the home, in what is considered to be the most influential period of a child's life. Our cooperative program invites all parents to contribute in a variety of ways, depending on your schedule and other demands.

If your children are two and a half to four years old, (three years by March 31st, 1989), they can attend class two or three days a week in either the morning or afternoon. Each program is staffed by three professional teachers of Early Childhood Education, along with two volunteer parents.

A Busy, Happy Place to Be

The staff at Blackburn Hamlet Preschool is proud of the rich and varied curriculum offered to 'their' kids. Activity centres, sing-along, circle-time, supervised outdoor play and planned crafts are just part of each lively day.

February's activities included a trip to Winterlude, taking advantage of a fun-filled outdoor event in our nation's capital.

A dental hygenist came, toothbrush in hand, to talk about good food and great teeth. The kids still like candy but at least now they know why YOU don't.

February 14th was a very important day for all the preschoolers. They were busy making valentines, exchanging them and generally having a lot of fun in the craft corner.

Need a letter mailed? Blackburn Hamlet Preschoolers know all about mail delivery. In February they set up their very own Post Office.

There's always something new, something special going on at Blackburn Hamlet Preschool. Parents tell us they have a good feeling knowing that their kids are not just having fun, but are developing a positive attitude towards school and learning.

It is our goal to provide an important bridge between home and school, helping preschoolers to develop physically, socially, emotionally and intellectually. Best of all, to them, it's just a whole lot of good, clean fun!

YOUR ALDERMAN'S REPORTINNES ROAD WIDENING AND THE BY-PASS

The Region has committed 1.3 million dollars in 1988 for the engineering work for Innes Road from Blair Road to the Hamlet and for the By-Pass around Blackburn. They propose to carry out the widening of Innes from Blair Road to Anderson Road this year which will improve the accessibility at Anderson.

The maximum effectiveness of the By-Pass depends on Innes being widened west of the Hamlet. A four-lane By-Pass would thus carry an effective flow of traffic around the Hamlet and maintain that flow to Highway 417 and points west.

The work being undertaken this year is evidence of the intention to resolve the traffic problems which plague us.

DOG LICENSING

Gloucester Police will be coming into our area during the month of March (dates still to be determined, but watch local newspapers) to issue dog licenses. Last year the police set up shop in the Blackburn IGA and will probably be at the same location this year. Spring is also the perfect time to have your animals vaccinated against rabies because the change to milder weather usually means an increase of rabies in wild animals, especially foxes and skunks.

SPEED LIMITS

The speed limits on Innes Road have been a bone of contention for a long time, especially in the Chapel Hill area immediately preceding the traffic lights at Innes/Navan Roads. The Regional Municipality of Ottawa-Carleton has now agreed, after intense pressure from both the City and residents, to lower the speed limit in that area to 60 km per hour. Although this action will not decrease the amount of traffic, hopefully having a consistent speed limit to the limits of Blackburn, where it is 50 km per hour, will cut down on the amount of speeding at this busy intersection.

CELEBRATION '88

The Federal Government instituted an awards program for 1988 in conjunction with the Olympics. It was to recognize people who have made outstanding contributions, in the spirit of the Olympics, demonstrating hard work, determination, moral character and dedication. Medals were to be given related to winter sports and certificates to those who have improved the quality of life in the community.

From Blackburn, CARL BRENT was awarded the medal for coaching and HEDY BURTON and TERRY HEASLIP were given certificates for their outstanding contributions to the community. Congratulations to you all.

RESOURCE CENTRE TO SPONSOR CONFERENCE ON
WIFE ASSAULT

The Gloucester Centre for Community Resources will be sponsoring a two day Conference March 10 and 11, at Pineview Municipal Golf Club, on the subject of wife assault.

The Gloucester Services for Abused Women, a program of the Resource Centre, has been running support groups for victims of wife assault for a few years.

'Wife Assault - Together We Can Make a Difference' is the theme of the coming conference.

Registration is limited to seventy people who are service providers in the field and subsidies will be available for any one interested in attending who is, or has been, in an abusive situation.

Keynote speaker on March 10th is Barbara Pressman, Social Worker in Residence, Faculty of Social Work, Sir Wilfrid Laurier University.

There will be English and French workshops and simultaneous translation available.

RESOURCE CENTRE OFFERING ASSERTIVENESS
TRAINING FOR WOMEN

The Gloucester Centre for Community Resources is offering a mini-course in 'Assertiveness Training for Women'.

Sessions will be held from 9:15-11:15 a.m. on Thursday mornings, March 3rd to April 1st, in Room 'B', Gloucester Community Centre (downstairs, Beacon Hill Shopping Centre, 2339 Ogilvie Road).

Participants in the program 'Assertiveness Training for Women' will have opportunities to learn fundamentals of assertive communication, to evaluate their own behaviour and practice asserting their own positions firmly.

This course will be useful for women who find it difficult to stand up for themselves with partners, parents, friends, bosses, teachers, etc.

The course will be co-facilitated by Janet Brown and Marilyn Latreille, social workers with the Gloucester Centre for Community Resources. There is no charge for the course, but participants need to register in advance by calling Janet Brown at 741-6025.

INCOME TAX CLINIC IN GLOUCESTER - MARCH 10TH

If you need help completing your income tax return and if you qualify under the above income levels, please call 234-8479 after February 15th. You must arrange an appointment through that number and specify that you wish to attend the Gloucester Clinic.

GLOUCESTER BLOCK PARENTS



WHY IS A BLOCK PARENT PROGRAM NEEDED?

To provide the community with an organized method of protecting its children and to aid in prompt reporting of emergency problems to the agency concerned, i.e., Police, Fire Dept, etc.

WHEN IS THE BLOCK PARENT SIGN DISPLAYED?

A BLOCK PARENT does not have to be home and available 24 hours a day. When unavailable, the sign is simply removed from the window. Absence of the sign does NOT mean the house is unattended.

WHAT IS THE BLOCK PARENT SIGN?

The official symbol of the BLOCK PARENT Home and the Program itself, which should be displayed in a window visible from the street. An indication to children passing by that this home is open to them for immediate help in an emergency.

WHEN ARE THE CHILDREN TO USE THESE HOMES?

Only in case of emergency - when they are lost, frightened, bullied or followed by a stranger or stray animal. If they need help because of illness or injuries.

HOW WILL THE CHILDREN RECOGNIZE THE SIGN?

The parents, schools and Gloucester Police Safety Program will teach our children how to recognize the sign and when to use it. Children are taught how to recognize the SIGN, not the home. If they see no BLOCK PARENT signs, the children are to run to the nearest door but not to go inside.

WHAT IS A BLOCK PARENT?

Any responsible adult who cares about the well-being of children and other persons to volunteer their home as a safe refuge when the need arises. A BLOCK PARENT has no legal status except as a private citizen volunteering to act responsibly in an emergency.

WHAT ARE THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE BLOCK PARENT?

To offer your home as a place of safety from dangerous or frightening situations
To offer assistance to people in distress and telephone the appropriate emergency service.

To assist the police by reporting suspicious or criminal activity in the community.

WHAT IS NOT EXPECTED OF A BLOCK PARENT?

To provide food and beverage, toilet facilities, transportation, or administer first aid. To leave his or her home and break up a fight. To actively engage any dangerous person.

HOW IS A BLOCK PARENT SELECTED?

Everyone over the age of 16 in a prospective BLOCK PARENT home will be screened by the Gloucester Police Dept.

HOW DOES ONE APPLY TO BECOME A BLOCK PARENT?

By obtaining an application form from the Gloucester BLOCK PARENT Committee or contacting the Gloucester Police Dept. Community Relations Branch - 822-2916.

TRAVEL TIME

BRITAIN '88



Would it be your first visit to Britain? Would you be returning home to visit family and friends? Perhaps, your visit to Britain in '88 would be an opportunity to explore some of the sights and experiences you missed your first time around. Two thirds of Britain's visitors are returning for their second or third time. Whether it's your first, second, or subsequent visit to Britain, the opportunities for an enjoyable holiday abound.

The United Kingdom, composed of England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland, is very compact - about two-thirds the size of California. Close to 7 million people reside in London, a truly cosmopolitan capital, full of history, entertainment, ceremonial displays, shopping and much more. The countryside is noted for the beauty of its natural landscape and the pastoral charm of the villages.

Irrespective of where else you go, a few days stay in London is a must on everyone's itinerary. To get around London, you need only purchase a Travelcard. This allows you unlimited travel on London's famous, red double-decker buses and the 'Underground' (the Subway or Tube). A Travelcard for three days will cost \$15.00 CAN for an adult and \$5.00 for children up to the age of 15. Discounts at various museums and shops in London will be included with the price.

Day trips from the city to Canterbury, with its famous 11th Century cathedral, to Windsor to visit Windsor Castle, or to Oxford and Cambridge to tour the universities are easily accessible by train. Britain's rail system has 15,000 trains travelling to over 2,400 points every day.

You can see most of England, Scotland and Wales with a BritRail Pass at incredible savings. Passes are available for 8, 15, 22 days or monthly for either first or economy class travel. There are additional savings for children, youths or senior citizens. A BritRail pass must be purchased in Canada or the U.S., so mention to your local travel agent while booking your flight that you would like to take advantage of this special value.

Britain still has a lot more to offer you. Britain's bed and breakfast program makes it possible to enjoy your stay at a surprisingly low cost. In both the urban and rural areas you will find that comfortably furnished rooms with double or twin beds and a bathroom with a shower are available. The rate is approximately \$25 CAD per person. This price includes a full English breakfast and, possibly, the attentions of a fascinating host family.

Even hotel rooms in London during high season (April 1 to Oct. 31, 1988) are affordable. If you fly with Air Canada and book in advance with your travel agent, a three night stay at the Tavistock in London, including a continental breakfast, service charge and tax would be just \$118 per person, double occupancy. Singles, children's and triple rates are also available. Twenty-one other London hotels in different categories are offered at similar savings.

Travel Time....

For the independent traveller, self-drive holidays give you freedom. The cost of renting a car is far cheaper if you arrange the rental in Canada before you leave. Again, consult your travel agent. Rates are as low as \$144 per week. In conjunction with a Swan National rental car, a voucher system for hotels in the U.K. countryside and major towns is available starting at \$34 per person per night. A price which includes a full breakfast and telephone charges for hotel staff to call ahead to make your next night's reservation. Vouchers can be exchanged at nearly 2,000 hotels and guest houses throughout England, Scotland and Wales.

For those visitors to Britain who want someone else to show them the sights, fully escorted tours from three days to a complete 24 day Ireland and Britain tour are available. Your travel counsellor will be able to assist in selecting a tour to best suit your requirements. Excellent packages are provided by several companies with generations of experience.

It will probably take more than one visit for you to experience all that is offered in Britain but this year is a good year to travel. As of early February, airfares to London from Ottawa have been dramatically reduced in cost. In the summer of 1987, the lowest fare you could find was \$748.00. For this summer from May 13 to Sep. 24, the lowest fare has dropped to \$488.00 return. In addition to low fares, there are also some new services and routes being offered.

With a savings of \$260 on airfare from last years's prices, I'm ready to pack my toothbrush and passport and try my luck at sighting the Loch Ness monster! How about you?

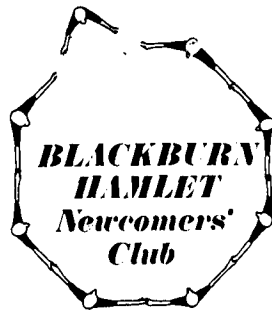

Letter to the Editor

I would like to bring to the attention of your readers certain changes that have taken place concerning soccer in Gloucester. This summer, 5, 6 and 7 year-olds will be playing in the mini-soccer division. In this division, the teams have 12 players and the game is played on half of a regular field with 7 players a side. This extension of mini-soccer to include 7 year-olds complies with the direction given to local soccer clubs by the governing bodies (Canadian Soccer League; Ontario Soccer League) that field size be graduated to age. The rationale is that this provides young players more opportunity to touch the ball during the early years of skill development. As a result of this arrangement, the novice division will be composed only of 8 year-olds.

In response to the dramatic residential development in Orleans in the past couple of years, the GSA has formed a north and a south area in Orleans with St. Joseph's Boulevard as the dividing line. Our area will consist of Blackburn Hamlet and Pineview, and I am pleased to welcome our soccer friends from Pineview who last year were with North Gloucester.

I would like to comment briefly on the matter of registration policy. In the past our policy has been to say the least "flexible". While this was no doubt convenient for people who forgot, procrastinated, changed their minds, etc., it did cause some inconvenience for those who were organizing schedules and teams, and generally getting the season under way. In the interest of fairness to all, I think that we should provide a reasonable opportunity for individuals to register and an adequate period for organization. With this in mind, we are holding registration on SATURDAY, MARCH 5, 1988 from 9 A.M. to 1 P.M. at Glen Ogilvie Public School. So, consult your children, tell your friends, and come and register on March 5th.

We have been very fortunate over the years that our sense of community has spawned a good number of volunteers for a variety of activities. I appreciate the assistance of the many people who made last year a successful soccer season. (The weather on soccer day was dreadful but that couldn't be helped!)

I have noticed a certain reluctance of parents to get involved in teams at the peewee level (13 and 14 year olds) where the numbers are still fairly high. Although I realize that teenagers pose a particular "challenge" to adults, I would submit that organized activities with adult role models who reflect the values of our community are particularly important for this age group.

Gazing at the Hornets' Nest fields dotted with orange, white, red, green and gold shirts darting in a frenzy of activity engenders a feeling in me that I find difficult to describe. If you have ever had that feeling, and you would like to help get soccer going this summer, give me a call at 830-2049 or fill in a volunteer form at registration on March 5th.
