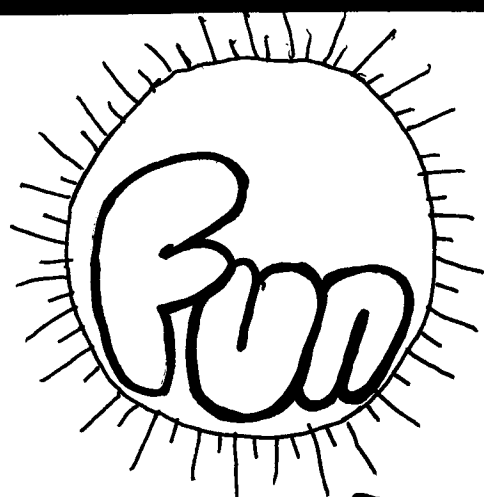
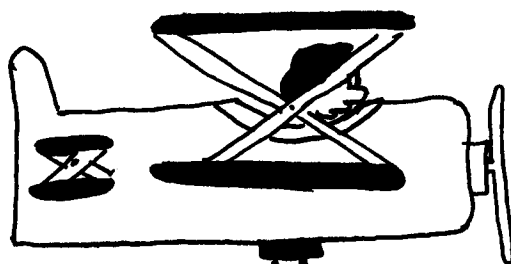


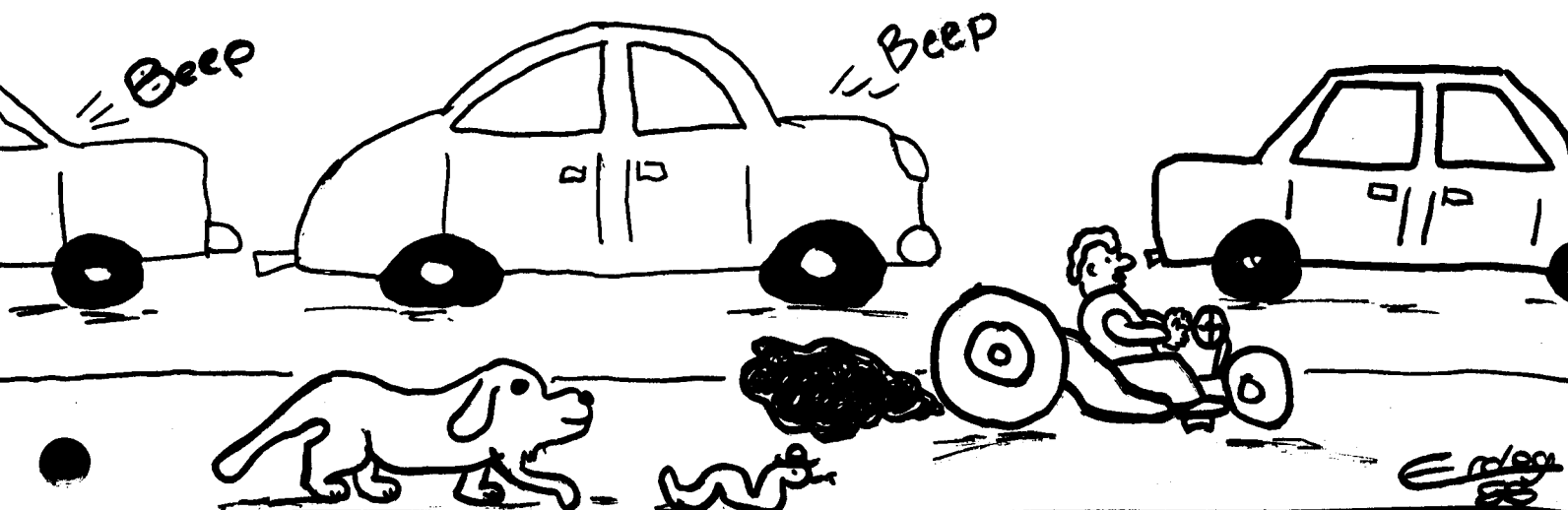

From the President

On April 27, 1988 the BCA held its Annual General and Ratepayer's Meetings. Warren Hanstead, our Treasurer, presented the Statement of Revenue and Expenditure for 1987, the 1988 Budget, and the Distribution of the 1988 Recreation Grant.

An audited Statement and detailed figures for the Budget and Recreation Grant will be published in the BANAR. A few highlights follow:

- Revenues and expenditures for 1987 (unaudited) were \$228,499.50 and \$228,590.17 respectively.
- The deficit forecasted for 1988 is \$6,638.00 based on revenue of \$227,325.00 and expenditure of \$233,963.00. Expenditures on Administration and the BANAR are major contributors to the imbalance.
- The BCA will distribute \$45,865.00, where as the Recreation Grant will be \$45,035.00, the difference being provided from BCA funds.
- The BCA is providing over \$3,000.00 (included in Administration) to support a variety of community groups in addition to sports groups, such as Les Chansouniers, Orleans Community Care Centre, Children's Welcome Centre, Greenbelt Riding Association (handicapped participants) and the Blackburn Chorus. Other recent requests for assistance are pending approval.

The following notions were unanimously approved:

- The the unaudited Statement of Revenue and Expenditure for 1987 presented by the Treasurer be accepted by the BCA, subject to final audit (moved by R. J. Madill, seconded by W. Hanstead).
- That the 1988 BCA Budget and Distribution of the 1988 Recreation Grant presented by the Treasurer be accepted by the BCA (moved by H. Wildenburg, seconded by R. Jaimeson).
- That the residents of Blackburn Hamlet appreciate the efforts of Board members and other volunteers who have invested their time in community activities (moved by R. Pyper, seconded by P. Flynn).

I wish to thank Board members who have worked with me, and those of you who have volunteered to assist community programs in their various forms. I have enjoyed my terms on the BCA Board. My best wishes to the incoming Directors.

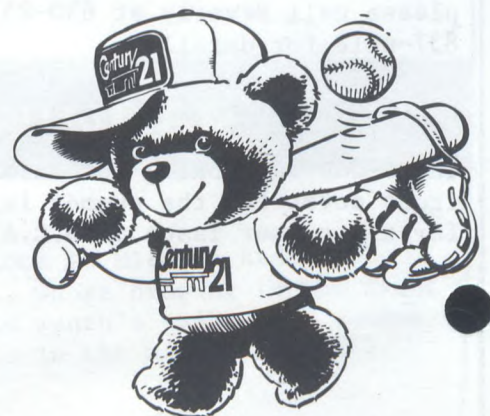

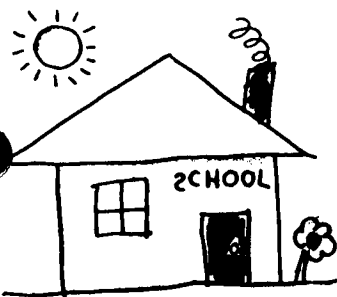

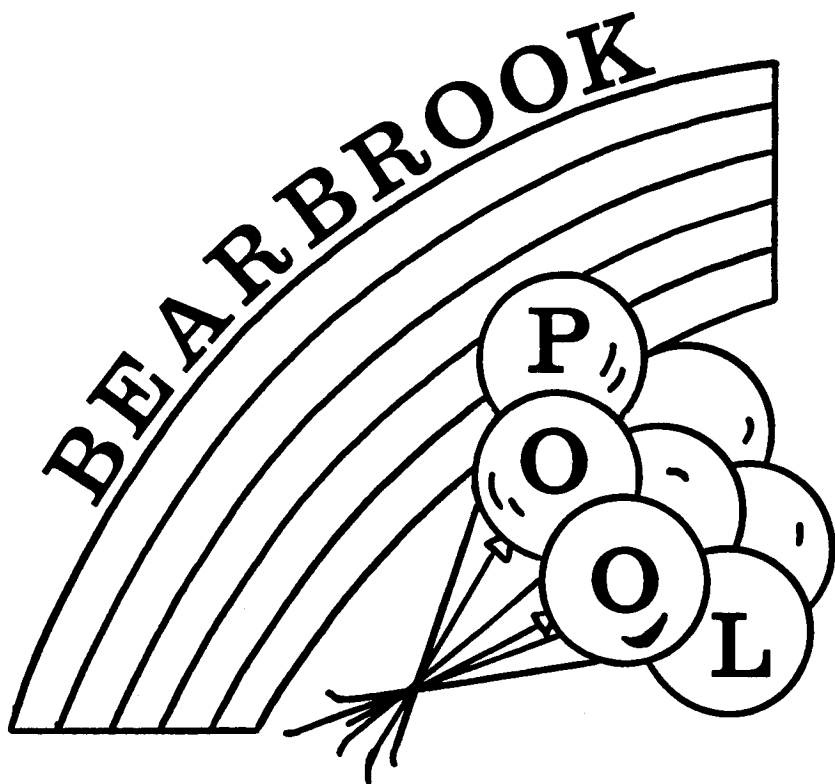
Pyjama Time

STATUS OF PROPOSED BLACKBURN HAMLET BYPASS

Environment Blackburn wishes to brief readers of the "BANAR" as follows:

On April 27, our Regional Council approved the proposed tight alignment for this bypass, thus ignoring the objections we made on behalf of the roughly 250 households who have so far expressed support for our opposition to this alignment. The next step is the publication expected on May 7 of the Region's Environmental Study Report (ESR) in accordance with the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act. This Act obliges municipalities to undertake an environmental study of proposals, such as new roads. Once the ESR is made public, citizens who object to the ESR have 30 days to request the Minister of Environment to intervene and "bump-up" the environment study. A "bump-up" requires the municipality to make a full environmental assessment, which is then reviewed in terms of acceptability by the provincial authorities, before these same authorities eventually decide whether or not the proposal should be allowed to go ahead. A "bump-up" thus removes the main responsibility for a decision from the municipal to the provincial arena. There is ample room for public inputs in the decision-making process, once a "bump-up" has been decreed.

Environment Blackburn has already informed the Minister of Environment that we intend to request a "bump-up", once we have examined the ESR. Citizens have 30 days from the date of publication of an ESR to request a "bump-up", whereupon the Minister has 45 days to decide whether or not to agree to such a request. From what we have been advised, ESR's are only acceptable for small scale projects with relatively minor environmental effects. We believe that a project costing up to \$40 million and destroying 75 acres of parkland is certainly not such a project. Another important criterion is public concern. Again we believe that the opposition of at least 1000 residents indicates considerable public concern.

We are also in the process of contacting various non-governmental organizations which take an interest in enhancing the environment and wildlife habitat and advocating rational transportation systems. We expect these contacts to lead to further support for our opposition to the present bypass alignment.




The sealing program has a positive effect on the roads and helps prevent further breaking of the pavement.

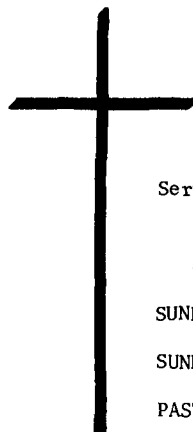

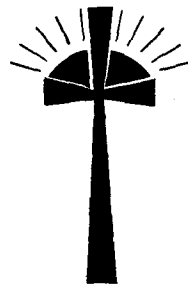

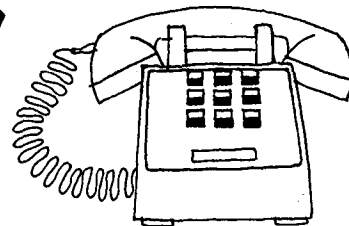
