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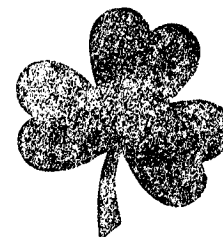

## FROM THE PRESIDENT

In this issue there are three issues I'm like to discuss: 1- Distribution of the recreation grant, 2- Volunteers, 3- An amendment to the BCA Constitution.

### Distribution of the Recreation Grant

This is the second year in a row that the City of Gloucester has significantly reduced the recreation grant to the BCA. In 1991 the grant was \$46,595 in 1992 it was \$43,323 and his year, 1993, it is \$38,056. The overall grant is approved by City Council and then distributed to the Recreation Associations. The distribution is based on a fixed rate per individual living in the area. The rate this year is \$3.50 per person and we have 10,873 people living in our area.

We received requests for over \$58,000 in grants in grants this year, over 50% more than we had to distribute. The fairest distribution that we could come up with was based on reducing the grant per participant to 92% of last years level. This matches the decrease in the City grant. This has left over \$1500 that has not yet been distributed. This distribution will probably take place at our budget meeting in March. In other words if your group would like part of the balance, be at the meeting and be prepared to justify your request.

### Volunteers

In Blackburn Hamlet I feel we can be proud of the very large number of volunteers we have. These people are individuals who find the time to do things. They make a lot of good things happen in and around our community.

Unfortunately, from time to time, what volunteers do doesn't satisfy some of the 10,873 of us living here. This month I've heard a number of complaints. Some of them were complaining about their groups treasurer, some about the BANAR publishing Mr. Bellemare's letter in french only and some about the amalgamation of Blackburn Public and Glen Ogilvie schools.

It's easy to sit back while the work is being done and then complain that you don't like the results but it usually doesn't accomplish very much. If you're not happy with what the executive of your group is doing , don't complain, offer to help. As far as school changes go, half your property tax goes to the school board, \$1,000 to \$2,000 on average here in Blackburn. If you don't like how it's spent or the changes in the schools, phone up the trustees or go to a board meeting and address the board. They are the decision makers.

In the case of the BANAR we have been trying to keep costs down, this sometimes limits the amount of available space in each issue. We try and fit things in as best we can.

### Amendment to the Constitution of the BCA

Our Constitution requires that each year the financial accounts be audited. This costs us about \$1,300 per year. In discussing this with the Directors we see little need for this expense. The books would be audited if the directors , or the City of Gloucester requested it but normally be prepared without audit. I have instructed the Treasurer and Vice President to prepare this years statements without audit. We will present these at the budget meeting for acceptance by the community. If not accepted we will have them audited in compliance with our Constitution.

A motion to amend the Constitution of the BCA to delete the audit requirement will also be presented for vote at the March meeting.

Your Councillor's Report

Regional Wide Assessment



Gloucester

Regional Council approved the revision of the assessment base in October, which has the effect of providing a more realistic value for assessment on a regional basis. In a previous article, I had noted that it would likely be necessary to have a phase-in process, in view of the heavy impact on many, particularly the business community.

Gloucester faces a rather peculiar situation because RWA decreases taxes on the majority to the amount of \$10.8 million, but increases taxes on others by \$15.2 million, a difference of \$4.4. In most municipalities the increases and decreases can be phased in concurrently with little impact, because they wash for the most part.

The Region provided a one-time grant of \$1.66 million to assist in the transition, but that is far from sufficient to do this. One of the pluses of RWA was that grants-in-lieu from the federal government would bring in an extra \$1.3 million a year. It was expected that three years of that could have been used to assist in the phase-in. Although RWA is for the most part revenue neutral on a regional basis, it would at this point appear that the federal government will not be basing grants on the revised assessment base, but rather continue with 1975 values. Probably no \$1.3 million for 1993.

At the last meeting of January, Council had to take some action since the tax bills had to be prepared. It had to find a phase-in program within its means, even if the \$1.3 million were not to come through. As a result, it was decided to go to the Non-Growth Capital Requirement Reserve, which would contribute \$3.3 million over a three year period, coupled with the \$1.66 million from the Region.

The plan will result in full levels by 1996, with the first year giving decreases to the greater of 10% of 1992 taxes or \$200.00, with the remaining following in the next three years in equal instalments. For increases, the impact is smallest in 1993, allowing people to adjust. Those residential properties that would face a maximum of 95% increase over 1992 taxes will have an increase for 1993 of the greater of 15% of 1992 taxes or \$500.00. For businesses it will be the greater of \$1000.00 or 15% of 1992 taxes. There are other categories.

With more frequent reviews of the assessment base, as is proposed, this type of remedy should not be required again.

Late applications will be based on funds available. Steve questioned the grant distribution and is to re-evaluate the needs of each group. Do some of these organizations need a grant?

**SPORTS:** The BCA is to allocate funds for the scheduling and supervision of the rink monitors. However some issues of concern were discussed: emergency training, supervision of employee, salary wages and costs. Steve suggested to Jim and Darrel to put together a proposal if they decide to take this assignment on a contractual basis. Steve would like to be consistent on these issues. Marjorie is to supply Darrel with a copy of emergency procedures and will organize a session for training. This was agreed to.

There being no other business, the meeting was adjourned at 09:30 PM.

**THE BRANCH BOOKIE'S BEST BET****BLOCK, LAWRENCE. Sometimes They Bite. New York, Avon Books, 1992. 285 p.**

In this collection of 18 short stories the best one is the last. It's also the only one about Matthew Schudder, Block's longstanding detective hero. Although the rest of the stories are well crafted they seemed to lack a completeness, a certain I-don't-know-quite-what that makes other short story mystery writers, like Isaac Asimov, so interesting.

There was one, "Nothing Short of Highway Robbery" that had a certain sense of obtuse justice to it and another, "The Dettweiler Solution" which just seemed silly despite the humorous style of writing. I also had that faint feeling that I'd read similar stories elsewhere and that they'd been carried off more successfully.

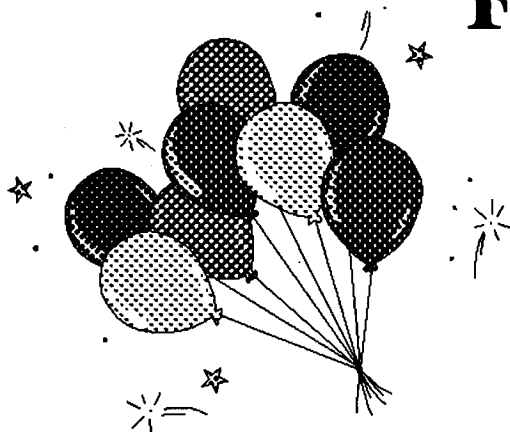
However, if you like light short stories, you could certainly do a lot worse than sitting down with this paperback.

## Hypertension — The Silent Disease

Over 60 million North Americans have high blood pressure (hypertension). It is called the “silent disease” because a person can feel fine but have years of high blood pressure that quietly weakens the heart, kidneys, and arteries. The average person with untreated hypertension is three times more likely to develop heart disease, six times more likely to suffer heart failure, and seven times more likely to have a stroke than the average person with normal blood pressure.

As blood is pumped through the arteries by the heart, it pushes against the artery walls. This force from the blood flow is called blood pressure. The pressure is recorded as two numbers, for example 120/80 (spoken as “120 over 80”). The first number (120) is called the systolic pressure and is the pressure when the heart contracts to pump blood out. The second number (80) is called the diastolic pressure and is the pressure when the heart relaxes between beats. The more difficult it is for blood to flow through the arteries, the higher both numbers will be and the greater the strain on the heart and arteries. A healthy blood pressure is less than 140 systolic and less than 90 diastolic (140/90).

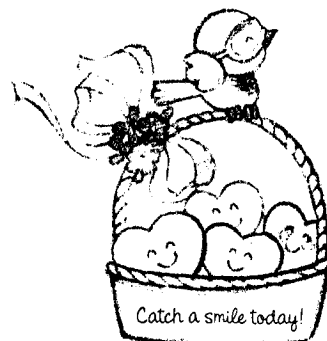
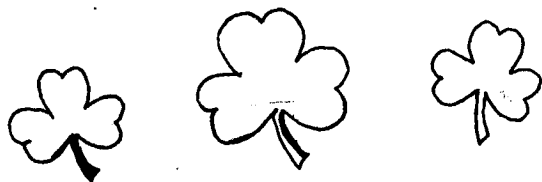
If any close relatives have high blood pressure, you’re more likely to also have it. If there is a family history of stroke or heart attack before age 55, you are at even higher risk of having hypertension. Diabetes, obesity, and heavy alcohol use also increase your risk of developing hypertension. Hypertension is more common in men than in women, and usually occurs after age 35 years.

Hypertension usually has no symptoms, so it is wise to have your family doctor check your blood pressure each year. Hypertension is not diagnosed with only one high measurement, because your blood pressure changes during the course of the day, at different stress levels, and during different activities. A doctor should take several measurements over several appointments before diagnosing hypertension.

If you are diagnosed with mild hypertension, you may be able to lower your blood pressure with changes to your lifestyle. Giving up smoking, losing extra weight, exercising, decreasing alcohol use, and following a low-salt, low-fat diet, can all help lower your blood pressure. Your family doctor can help you implement these healthy changes.

Most people with hypertension require lifelong daily medication. There is now an excellent selection of antihypertension drugs with minimal side effects. If you are on medication for high blood pressure, have your blood pressure checked frequently and do not hesitate to discuss with your doctor any questions or concerns you may have.

# CITY COUNCIL GRANTS ADDITIONAL FUNDS TO THE ARTS IN 1993!

Gloucester City Council has added to the Gloucester Arts Board's budget for 1993 an additional \$60,000.00 in new funding and reallocated \$30,000.00 of staff support within the Recreation, Parks and Culture Department. The incremental funds will be used for the development of the arts facility. This funding is very encouraging to the arts community and will boost the enthusiasm already growing for a facility. City council is to be commended for its vision and support of the project. All councillors were in favour of increased funding to the 1993 arts budget.

### ARTS FACILITY UPDATE

The Facilities Committee has been hard at work organizing consultations with Gloucester artists to gather information about the specifications for and uses of a proposed facility.

On January 19, the first consultation was held with the performing artists. It provided an opportunity for the artists to share their expertise and state their requirements for performance space within a new facility. The Gloucester Arts Council will forward this information to the Gloucester Arts Board for its consideration.

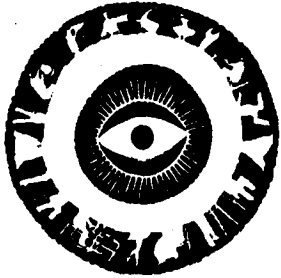
The next session, with visual artists, will determine the specifications and usage of studios, display areas and galleries.

# FESTIVARTS



FESTIVARTS'93 is a week-end of artistic and cultural activities by artists and artisans in Gloucester. It is being held at Gloucester High School in conjunction with the Gloucester Craftsmen's Guild's Spring Market.

The organization of FestivArts is primarily the responsibility of the Gloucester Arts Council (GAC) with assistance from volunteers and the artists of our community.

The participants are members of the Gloucester Arts Council who wish to advertise and promote their organizations to the public and demonstrate their skills and expertise in their various art forms. Opportunities for the public to become involved in the activities as participants as well as audience will be offered.

The need to advertise arts and culture as an alternate leisure activity to sports is important to the development of the arts in the community. FestivArts is a perfect venue to inform the public about the activities of the arts and cultural community and is particularly important now to support the building of an arts facility.

The first FestivArts was held in 1987. Nineteen ninety-one saw the first month-long FestivArts. Various arts organizations collaborated to combine activities and share the advertising and publicity costs of all events. A meeting held in June, 1991, with input from all of the organizations, indicated that there was a need to combine forces on an ongoing basis to share costs and increase the public's awareness of the existence of the arts and culture in this community. The lack of "cultural identity" was cited as a major problem for our groups. We determined that we do not have a "cultural identity", but in fact we have about 50 "cultural identities". The GAC would like to see that become one identity, and FestivArts is the perfect way to do this.

The Ministry of Culture and Communications gave a \$10,000 grant to produce FestivArts. Some of these funds were used to print PMT's of logos, and a large number of posters and name badges which need only overprinting of current information each year. This brings down printing costs to a minimum in subsequent years of running the festival.

In 1992, FestivArts was compacted to a weekend of activities, but encompassing a wide range of activities, i.e., a community

dance, a regional variety show, a showcase of displays and demonstrations, and the inclusion of Write-on-Kids, a children's literary competition. The expected grants did not materialize and all expenses of FestivArts were met with fundraising, ticket sales and GAC funds.

At this time, keeping in mind the importance of having the festival, the decision was made to produce FestivArts '93 on a scaled-down version. The Gloucester Craftsmen's Guild proposed that the 1993 event be held at the same time as their Spring Market, allowing the GAC to tap into their audience and, in turn, attracting more people to the market, thus being advantageous to both organizations. How could we say no? - collaboration between artistic groups toward the same goal!!!





Because of the lack of cultural (in fact, any!) facilities in Gloucester, it is difficult for our groups to attract audiences to their performances or exhibitions. FestivArts will make the public much more aware of the activities of the arts community.

1. Items which you are permitted to sell at FestivArts booths:
  - tickets for performances, concerts, series;
  - organization memberships;
  - fundraising items, i.e. sweatshirts, buttons.
2. Display booths should be manned at all times. Tables should be covered (black and beige tablecloth material is available from GAC on a first-come-first-served basis).
3. Special equipment for videos, monitors, etc., must be provided by the individual organization. Ask the GAC if you need anything that you do not have.
4. 8'x4' white pegboards will be available for display free-of-charge from the GAC. There are 20 boards available on a first-come-first-served basis.
5. Arrangements for tables can be made through the Gloucester Arts Council. Requests must be in by February 26.
6. Demonstrators will provide their own equipment. The GAC will use whatever resources it has to help.
