Proposed Bingo Hall

Mr. Ken Parker, a nearby resident addressed the members of the BCA to express his views and concerns regarding the new Bingo Hall. Mr. Parker claims that the existing zoning prohibited what is now going to take place. A petition to that effect was signed by 184 of his neighbours but the City of Gloucester planning department agreed that the bingo hall is appropriate with a residential area.

Mr. Parker has tried every channel to find someone who would listen to their reasonable arguments. They even fought the issue at the Ontario Municipal Board hearing but the OMB ruled against them.

Steve asked Mr. Parker what would you like the BCA to do about it? Mr. Parker asked that the BCA meet with Council at the hearing of March 8 and reflect the position of the residents who are not in favour of the proposed new Bingo hall. The residents are concerned about traffic, parking and noise that will result from using space over an existing restaurant as a 250 seat bingo hall. Steve believes that the BCA recognizes the residents concerns and mentioned that the BCA would make a representation at the hearing. There are reasonable issues we could ask for that is important to the community such as: respect for the residential area, safety issues, lighting and damage control.

Directors Report

Fun-Fair

The BCA has requested that the 1st Blackburn Scout Group ask for volunteers for this year's Fun-Fair. Unfortunately the new Director of Fun-Fair has resigned because he is in the process of moving. In addition to this vacancy there are several other positions available. If these positions are not filled there is a possibility that there will be no Fun-Fair this year due to a lack of volunteers. The 1st Blackburn Scout Group benefits from this event as it is a major source of revenue to the Group, which helps fund the Scouting program in Blackburn Hamlet. Environment

Jim mentioned that he got good support from the residents concerning his idea of planting trees near the rented garden lots. He will go to the NCC for approval. Your Councillor's Report

Gloucester City Hall - To Buy or Not to Buy

You may have read recently that Gloucester City Council is re-considering the City's current leasing arrangement for our facilities at 1400 Blair Place. At present, the City rents five floors of an office building owned by The Glenview Corporation with an option to purchase the entire building at a set price. The City's former Chief Administrative Officer Barry Coopersmith had begun investigating the purchasing option some time ago. An analysis completed by our Finance Department has indicated that, given current economic conditions, over the long term, buying the building would be marginally more economical than leasing. Nevertheless, there are some drawbacks to purchasing a particular building. Some feel the asking price is high. Negotiations with Glenview have not been particularly successful. A new commercial office building could be built on the site, seen by some to be extremely cost-effective. Is the landlord responsible for the building doesn't need?

Not surprisingly, the City is reassessing its current deal of interest in a new facility, which could be built on the "home." The City could be interested in a long-term lease of being a landlord. This meets the needs.

The other concern I have is one which I have stated previously. With Regional Reform becoming a reality, some of the responsibilities which are currently municipal may be gradually shifted to the Regional level of government over the next several years. Any move on our part right now might therefore be ill-timed since our long-term needs cannot easily be specified. Municipal governments across the region may, in fact, be downsizing in the years ahead. We might be better advised to let the dust settle on the new Regional system before making any drastic changes.

There are those who would have this potentially controversial issue out of the way, and, more importantly, out of the public eye, well before the elections next November, taking a leaf from the book of Kim Campbell who suggested that some issues are best not discussed during an election campaign. Rushing through the necessary stages of research, evaluation and discussion which such a process involves however, though politically convenient, could lead to sloppy decision-making with serious repercussions in the long term.

She holds the Bantam and Junior age category records for the 60, 100, 00, 400 and 800 meter races in Ontario. Even though she is still of Bantam age, Caitlin competes as a Junior and d at the provincial level competes in the open class. She has competed in two provincials to date and won a total of 8 metals, all gold. Caitlin also holds 4 meet records in Tampa Bay, Florida.

Caitlin Renneson, an eleven year old athlete from Blackburn Hamlet, received the Junior Female C.P. Athlete of the year Award from Sports for the Disabled of Ontario this past weekend (Feb. 19)

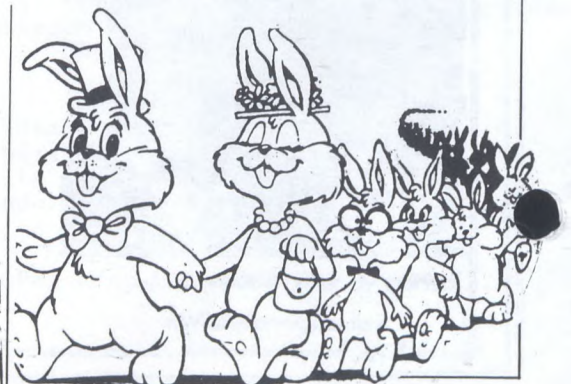
Caitlin has competed at the provincial level for the past two years. In her last meet, she unofficially bettered the standard set to compete at the national level in the 800 meter race and was within 1 second of matching the standards in the 200 and 400 m races.

Caitlin was introduced to wheel chair sports at the age of 6 when she joined the Ottawa Sports Development Program. While continuing to enjoy the benefits of the development program, Caitlin is also a member of the Ottawa Track and Field competitive club.

Even though Caitlin rides horses on weekends, takes piano lessons, practices archery and excels at school, she still finds time to dedicate herself to 2 track practices per week and an out-of-town competition every 5 weeks. Each competition shows an improvement in her race times.

In the 1994 provincials, Caitlin hopes to qualify for the Nationals in four or five events. Eventually Caitlin would like to compete for Canada in the Para-Olympics.

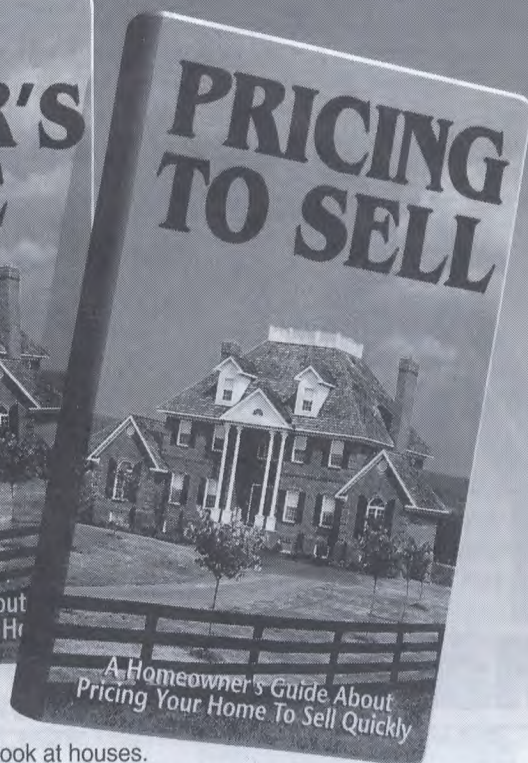
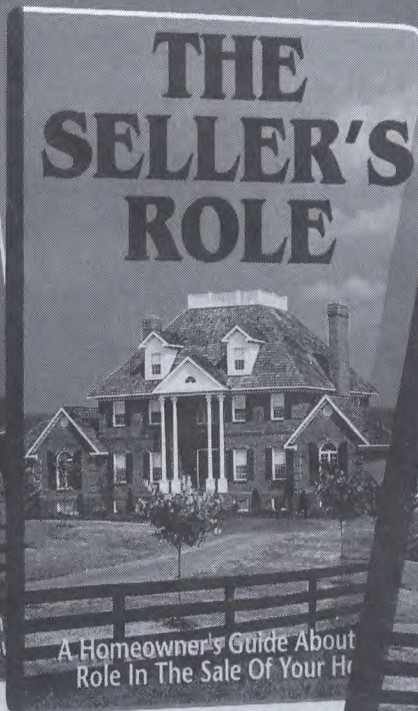
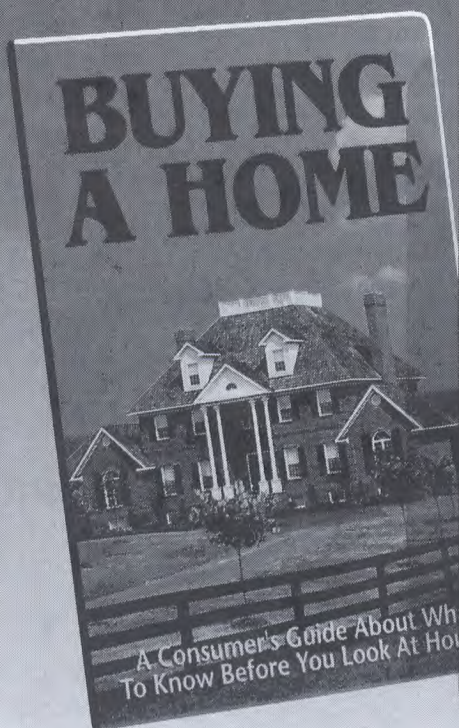

DON'T MISS ON GARDEN PLOT

Longer daylight hours work magically on nature and gardeners alike. Tomato and pepper plants growing in a southern window are a sure sign that spring is just around the corner.

Preparing flats is a good start, but the layout of your vegetable garden is just as important. A scale map locating your vegetables can be very useful, especially in jogging your memory after the seeds are in the ground.

If space is getting scarce around your house, there's an alternative. The Gloucester Allotment Garden Association still has plots available at both Orient Park and Anderson Road sites. Plots measure 7 x 14 metres and the association performs tillage and provides water and compost fertilizer.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

This letter is in response to Mr Parker's letter published in the March issue of the Banar. As a resident of Blackburn Hamlet for the past four and a half years, I feel that a reply is warranted. I found his letter to be over exaggerated and was written in a way to gain votes against rather than in favour of a Bingo Hall.

I have been attending various Bingos in the Ottawa area for approximately the last twelve years and have seen numerous residents of the Blackburn area in attendance (even the elderly from the Blackburn Hamlet Retirement Home). There are a few points in Mr. Parker's letter that I would like to dwell upon. First, the heading "**Welcome to Bingo Hamlet**" tends to make people believe there would be a Bingo Hall almost on every corner. It was stated; quote, "the site plan calls for a one hundred and eleven car parking lot surrounding the existing facility with a renovated seating capacity of two hundred and seventy people. On some nights there are already forty cars parked at Wallys, leaving seventy-one spots for two hundred and seventy patrons." Anyone who has ever attended a Bingo knows that for a crowd of one hundred and fifty people there would be a maximum of sixty to seventy vehicles. The letter in question, leads readers to believe that every patron attending a Bingo is arriving alone in one vehicle. People arrive at a Bingo in various ways. For example, by bus, taxi, three or four to a vehicle, and very few attend alone.

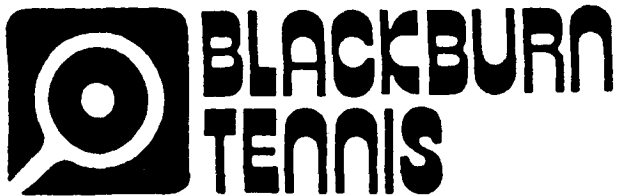
Regarding the statement referring to the Bingo at Innes Road and Bantree (really Innes and Newmarket), I have the occasion to pass by that area daily and have seen the Bus referenced in Mr. Parker's letter parked there for a period of approximately two weeks. On Sunday March 6, 1994, at approximately 9:30 a.m. the Bus referenced was still parked there (the first Bingo starts at noon). Upon my return at approximately 10:30 a.m., the Bus in question was gone.

There was no mention of the congested traffic on Bearbrook Road during the summer months at the Soccer fields; where cars are parked on the both sides of Bearbrook and should you meet a car you almost have to come to a complete stop because of the parked cars and the pedestrians walking to and from the field. Also, there was no mention about the traffic congestion on Glen Park at Tauvette Park during the Baseball and Soccer season.

Finally, I would like to say that in my years of attending Bingo in the Ottawa area, I have yet to be in attendance at one that was filled to seating capacity.

In closing, I was going to bring up these points at the Public Hearing on March 8, 1994 (not the 5th as indicated in Mr. Parker's letter) but was unable to attend due to illness. Therefore, I would like at this time to thank the Mayor of Gloucester for approving the Bingo Hall on Innes Road.
