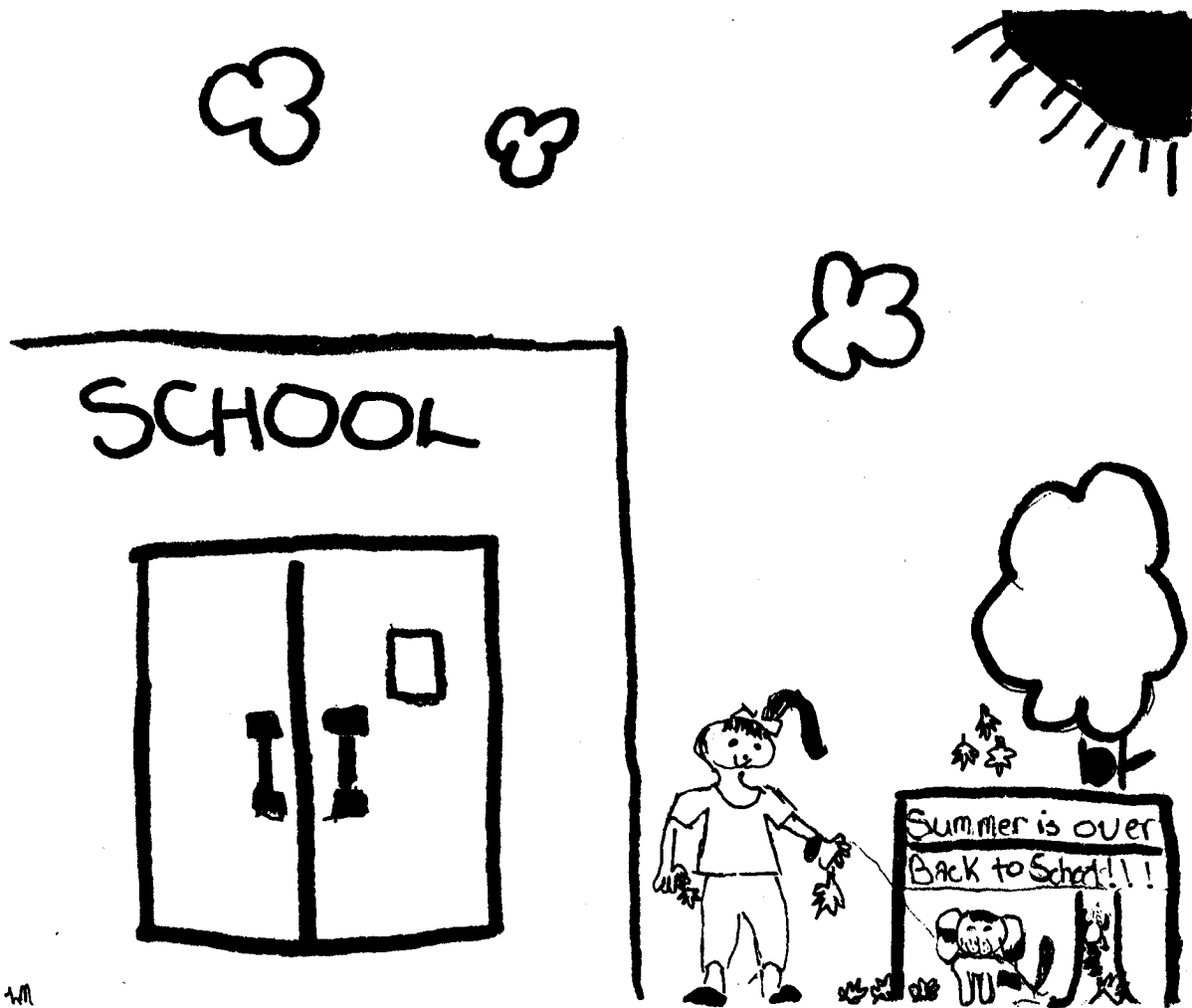

Your Councillor's Report

Election '94

Bill 143, which brings Regional reform to Ottawa-Carleton and shifts more responsibilities to the Regional level of government, is now law. As a result, after the upcoming November election, Regional Council will be comprised of directly elected councillors who will no longer serve as City councillors in their respective municipalities. Their mandate will be to focus, as a group, on the best interests of the entire Ottawa-Carleton Region, at the same time keeping tuned in, as individuals, to the views and needs of their own particular constituents.

Certainly most of us feel ourselves a part of the Ottawa-Carleton Region as much as a part of our own neighbourhoods or municipalities. We shop, visit friends, do business and enjoy leisure pursuits across the Region. It is in all of our best interests to have one group concentrating on the Regional picture, elected to promote and develop all of Ottawa-Carleton and to keep it functioning efficiently with uniform services and levels of service for all.

In November, Blackburn Hamlet and Chapel Hill south residents will vote for a candidate for the mayoralty and choose a City councillor to represent our municipal ward, Ward 3, at Gloucester City Hall. As well, however, beginning with this election, we will join Orléans South residents to form Regional Ward 2. Although Gloucester residents are included in four Regional wards, Ward 2 is one of only two Regional wards comprised entirely of Gloucester residents. This ward will elect one representative to sit on Regional Council.

The new system need not be confusing nor need it in any way impact negatively on the Blackburn area. Watch for an information campaign in area media, funded jointly by the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and area municipalities, designed to ensure that all voters have a clear understanding of the changes being made.

## Blackburn Taxfighter To Run For Council

Blackburn Hamlet resident, **Rainer Bloess**, best known for fighting for lower taxes and for challenging local politicians on issues such as severance pay, has announced his candidacy for Gloucester Council (Ward 3).

**Rainer Bloess** who has been involved in various community issues for a number of years is recognized as one of the activists who successfully fought for Region-Wide Assessment in Ottawa-Carleton. RWA resulted in reduced taxes for the vast majority of Gloucester residents.

Over the past years, Mr. **Bloess** has demonstrated a common sense approach to municipal issues, especially in the area of taxes, expenditures and regional reform.

**Rainer Bloess** continues to advocate more efficient and less costly local government. In particular, **Bloess** will continue his fight against wasteful fiscal policies.

The **Bloess** campaign will also be promoting a community effort to revitalize the heart of Blackburn Hamlet. **Bloess** states "the core of the Hamlet needs to be rejuvenated to make it attractive to local residents and more conducive for local businesses."

### BCA INFORMATION LINE

786-1405



The BCA has just started a community telephone information line where residents can call and find out what is happening in the Blackburn Hamlet community. Residents can also leave messages for the BCA executive.

The information line will be updated weekly with news on community activities, sporting events, fundraising and dates of various group registrations.

If your community group or sporting group would like to have their event advertised on the BCA information line, just leave the message you wish reported on the information line together with your name and telephone number where the BCA can reach you for any clarification. The next time the information line is updated, your message will be added.

This is a free service that the BCA is offering to assist community and sporting groups to get their news across to the residents of Blackburn Hamlet and also to help meet the information needs of the residents.

## BANAR ANNOUNCEMENT

This is the first issue of the BANAR produced according to our reduced cost model. The biggest change is the reduction in the number of BANAR issues from 9 to 5. The schedule below tries to optimize the distribution of the BANAR relative to major community event announcements such as sports registrations and the Fun Fair; however, as experience is gained with the new publication frequency, we may have to tinker with the time frames a bit. As such, please pay close attention to the BANAR deadlines published in each issue. To help compensate for the reduced frequency of the BANAR, and to keep Blackburn Hamlet residents informed in between issues, the BCA has started a telephone information line. This service is described in more detail elsewhere in this issue of the BANAR. The service is available immediately. The phone number is: 786-1405.

The second major change to the BANAR is its size. We are limiting the number of pages to 24 per issue. As such, we are asking that people be economical in their writing and reduce the amount of white space in their submissions. In order to accommodate everyone who contributes, some photo-reducing of articles will take place resulting in a publication with smaller print than has been the case in the past.

The third major change is in advertising costs. We have operated on a "break-even" basis in the past; however, this is no longer sustainable. The advertising costs have been increased by 50%.

We will continually monitor how things are going and make whatever changes are reasonable to continue to produce a useful publication for the community. If you have any suggestions, please call Michael Martin at 830-5530, or leave a message on the BCA Information Line.

## CIVIC AFFAIRS UPDATE

Over the past months, the **BCA** has been involved in a number of municipal issues.

On June 16, the President and the director of Civic Affairs for the **BCA**, along with several other residents of the Hamlet, met with **Mayor Claudette Cain** as she launched her re-election campaign in Blackburn.

The issues raised included the development of the Bingo Hall, the condition of the Old Innes strip, police services to our community, city finances, options on our city hall as well as future developments in Gloucester.

As you may have noticed, at the time of writing, the **Bingo Hall** was well underway to becoming a reality by late September. Nevertheless, some community concerns remain, especially for those residents in the immediate vicinity of Wally's. To allay these concerns, the City has pledged to carefully oversee the operation of the Bingo Hall to ensure all by-laws are respected and the neighbours are not unduly inconvenienced.

Our Association was also proud to present the **BCA Citizenship Award** to **Sarah Sy** at the **Good Shepherd** graduation in June. Congratulations and best wishes to **Sarah** and all the Hamlet Grads.

Upcoming issues will of course center around this fall's **municipal election**. For the first time, local voters will directly elect their regional councillor. In light of regional reform and developments in Gloucester, you should make every effort to fully understand the issues and to scrutinize the candidates.

To help the residents of Blackburn Hamlet appreciate the issues, the **BCA** will be sponsoring an **All-Candidates meeting** in October, after nominations close. Details about the time, date and location will be released later.

The next meeting of the **BCA** is **September 15** at the Glen Ogilvie library. This is an opportunity to participate in your community. Your feedback allows the **BCA** to act on your behalf and to promote the type of community you desire and deserve. However, without your participation, it is difficult for the **BCA** to know your concerns and to represent your interests.

### CANVASSING STARTS IN OCTOBER

1. Publishes the Banar, a community news magazine to keep the residents informed on community matters
2. Maintains the BCA Information Line to provide up-to-date information to the residents
3. Operates the BCA Children's Day Camp every summer
4. Organizes and supports a 3 day Fun Fair in June
5. Supports sporting groups, independent youth and senior groups (Membership entitles discounts at sports registrations)
6. Strives to make the community safer for our children by requesting sidewalks, streetlights and changes to traffic control and parking
7. Keeps abreast of proposed re-zoning and development and opposes them if they are not in the best interest of the community
8. Makes representations to various levels of government setting out the concerns of the community

To support all these activities the BCA raises funds through a yearly \$10 family membership. Every October the Hamlet is canvassed, so please support your community by joining the BCA when a canvasser knocks on your door.

It was a great experience to lead this team which ensured that a 23 year old tradition continued in Blackburn Hamlet, providing an opportunity for " Family Fun " for all. In the seven weeks available to the Committee, we managed to retain most of the popular features of the Fair, and even add several new events.

Activities for the Pre-teen age group and an expanded snack bar were added Friday evening. The parade was embellished with the musical colour of Blair Buchanan's bagpipes and the Gloucester Community Band. The Karaoke group sponsored by Wally's Roadhouse returned for the enjoyment of all.

New features on Saturday included a Bicycle Rodeo (sponsored by the Club Optimiste, Canadian Tire, and the Gloucester Police) , a Soccer Target Shoot. The Petting Farm was sponsored this year by the new owners of Petro-Canada - J & S Service Station . The Fun Jog and the Volksmarch returned; and a Silent Auction was held at the Supper Dance.
