PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I am pleased to announce that Roland Sanders has joined the BCA as the Director of Seniors' Services. Seniors are encouraged to give Roland a telephone call at 824-6237 if they have any concerns or comments. I also would like to welcome Iris Phillips as Director of the Environment. Anyone having an environmental issue, please give her a telephone call at 824-3641. There are still vacancies on the BCA, so please call me at 830-9295 if you are interested or require further information.

I am writing this message during a snow storm, so with two feet of snow on the ground the topic I am going to discuss is probably the furthest thing from your mind. Blackburn Hamlet is unique with all its forests and open areas and being surrounded by the Green Belt. But the downside to all this is that when all the snow melts we have a mosquito problem. The mosquito problem is not unique to Blackburn Hamlet but exists throughout the Ottawa region. Residents have been complaining about the mosquitos for a long time and nothing has been done to attempt to alleviate the problem.

There are alternatives. I have spoken to the Ministry of Environment and they advised that numerous cities and property owners treat their properties for mosquitos and have been doing so for many years with success. The Department of National Defence has informed me that they have been treating their military bases for mosquitos for many years. The City of Gloucester also does some spraying for mosquitos.

In September and October I made a number of enquiries with individuals and companies that provide mosquito control programs to cities, communities, land owners and government departments. Dr. Barry Tyler, an entomologist from Bacentocn Tech International Inc. came to Blackburn Hamlet to discuss a mosquito control program. He travelled within and around Blackburn Hamlet and was permitted access onto the DND LETE Lands and the Francon Lafarge property to assess the land for being conducive to mosquito development. Subsequent to this preliminary assessment Dr. Tyler made a presentation on a mosquito control program at the November BCA meeting to the Directors, representatives from the City of Gloucester, the National Capital Commission and the Department of National Defence. At this meeting Dr. Tyler explained that the most effective means of mosquito control is the application of an insecticide with its active ingredient being a bacterium which occurs naturally in the environment. This bacterium insecticide would be applied to sites identified as being prime locations for mosquito development. It effectively controls mosquito and black fly larvae and is not harmful to humans, animals or other insects. This bacterium insecticide has been used for over 15 years across Canada and the United States with a very good success rate. The mosquito control program costs from \$20,000 to \$120,000 annually depending on the assessment which includes types of mosquitos involved, size of area to be treated and the number of applications requested.

This undertaking by the BCA is an attempt to improve the quality of life in the Hamlet. You are being informed at this time so that the BCA can assess the opinions of the residents on this matter. If we proceed with this mosquito reduction program, it will require extensive consultation with the City of Gloucester, the large property owners surrounding Blackburn Hamlet and the residents to discuss the implementation of the process and the cost sharing of such a program. Cooperation of all concerned is essential to deal with the matter successfully and reduce the mosquito problem in Blackburn Hamlet. This project requires a large lead time to consult, inform, assess and co-ordinate, so that if agreed it can be started this spring.

Dear Residents of Blackburn Hamlet:

Firstly let me take this opportunity to wish everyone a very healthy and happy New Year.

I am pleased to say that much needed capital improvements will happen over the next five years in your community.

Major repairs are planned for the Bearbrook pool, starting this year with \$50,000 of electrical work and finishing in 1998 with repairs to the filtration system (\$135,000). A \$125,000 project is also planned for 1998 to make the pool accessible and to upgrade the area to include a sun shelter and improved water play features.

An investment of \$100,000 is planned for Bearbrook park over the next three years, to upgrade the park, replace lights at the outdoor rink and replace the play structure.

Through the City's accessible parks program, many features in Blackburn's parks will be changed so that they can be enjoyed by all our residents. In 1995, pathway work is planned of Blackburn, Centre and Tauvette Parks. The 1998 workplan includes new accessible features in Bearbrook, Bush, Centre Keystone and Red Maple parks.

Our biggest capital project for Blackburn Hamlet is the much needed Blackburn Arena renovations. Council has budgeted \$30,000 for 1995 to do a thorough analysis of the works required and has earmarked \$520,000 for the work in 1996.

The budget deliberations are always very challenging for we must seriously balance the needs of the various areas of the City with affordability.

I invite you to share your ideas with me as to how we can continue to improve our services to you.

Cher (ères) résidents de Blackburn Hamlet,

Tout d'abord, je profite de l'occasion pour souhaiter à tous une Bonne Année et la santé en 1995.

Je suis heureuse de dire que beaucoup d'améliorations nécessaires dans les immobilisations se produiront au cours des cinq prochaines années dans votre communauté.

Des réparations majeures sont prévues à la piscine Bearbrook soit, dès cette année, des travaux d'électricité de 50 000\$, ainsi que, en 1998, des réparations de 135 000 \$ au système de filtration. Un projet de 125 000 \$ est également prévu pour 1998 de sorte que la piscine soit accessible et que soient aménagés dans l'aire de jeu un abri contre le soleil et de meilleurs jeux aquatiques.

Un investissement de 100 000\$ est planifié pour le parc Bearbrook sur les trois prochaines années, pour l'amélioration du parc, le remplacement des projecteurs de la patinoire et le remplacement des éléments de jeux.

Par l'entremise du programme d'accessibilité aux parcs de la ville, de nombreux aspects des parcs de Blackburn seront modifiés de sorte que tous nos résidents puissent en bénéficier. En 1995, des sentiers seront aménagés dans les parcs Blackburn, Centre et Tauvette. Le plan de travail de 1998 prévoit de nouveaux éléments accessibles dans les parcs Bearbrook, Bush, Centre, Keystone et Red Maple.

Notre plus important projet d'immobilisation dans Blackburn Hamlet sont les renovations tant attendues de l'aréna Blackburn. Le Conseil a prévu 30 000 \$ au budget de 1995 pour une analyse complète des travaux requis et a affecté 520 000 \$ aux travaux en 1996.

Les délibérations sur le budget sont toujours très exigeantes car nous devons soupeser avec soin les besoins des divers secteurs de la Ville d'après nos moyens.

Je vous invite à me faire part de vos idées sur les façons de continuer à améliorer les services que nous vous offrons.

COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

This being my first opportunity to address you in the Banar as City Councillor for our Ward, I wish to express my gratitude to the many individuals who were instrumental in sending me to City Hall. I am also appreciative for the advice and feedback I have been receiving from numerous residents during the first months in office.

The major issue to face Gloucester Council to date has been the **Budget**. In essence, the Good News is that the budget represents a tax freeze on the Gloucester portion of your tax bill. After some cosmetic trimmings and slight increases in the library budget and the road resurfacing program, urban ratepayers in Gloucester will have a 1/2% **reduction** in their municipal taxes. Rural ratepayers will see a 1.6% **increase** due to the phase-in of leisure services.

I wish I could take credit for the freeze in taxes but I must admit that the budget deliberations were overall a formality for the current council. The credit in this case goes primarily to city staff who assembled the numbers and presented the various departmental budgets in a way which made it easy for Council to approve the finances with minimum tinkering. Credit is also due to the previous council for having directed staff to present a budget which would not increase taxes. However, we should also recognize that this council is still benefiting to some degree from the legacy of previous budgets when we swallowed a bitter tax pill to build a financial cushion.

Of particular interest to Blackburn Hamlet in the current budget is the re-allocation of \$42,000 in the community **recreation reserve fund**. This money had been earmarked by the City for repairs to the pool this year. Instead, the funds are redirected for use as originally intended to upgrade our parks. This move reflects the wishes of your RPB and your community association.

Another issue of interest is **severance pay** for City Councillors. At the time of writing, I had tabled a motion to eliminate this perk for our councillors and it appeared there was sufficient support on council to finally eliminate severance pay once and for all. While this motion has little impact on the budget, it would send the message that our council is prepared to show leadership in being frugal. As you read this, you will no doubt have heard whether my motion won approval on January 24.

On a final note of interest, the NCC is commencing public consultations on its "Plan for Canada's Capital". In February and March, the NCC will be holding public information sessions on the Urban Corridor and the **Greenbelt**. In conjunction with the Blackburn Community Association, I will ensure that feedback from our community is brought to the fore at these sessions. I am confident on the basis of recent comments by the Chairman of the NCC that it is receptive to the public's concerns and wishes.

In closing, I look forward to hearing from you about any issues or concerns.

CIVIC AFFAIRS UPDATE

The NCC is commencing public consultations on its "Plan for Canada's Capital". Following a "Meet the NCC" event with various community groups and municipal representatives, public information sessions are being held in February and March. The NCC will then be seeking input and feedback on the proposals with respect to the Urban Corridor and the **Greenbelt**.

These forums are part of the NCC's commitment to openness to the public. The BCA will be attending these sessions to participate in the consultation process and to ensure that our concerns are heard by the NCC. Any comments or suggestions you may have can be forwarded to the BCA Info-Line at 786-1405 or by calling any of the directors.

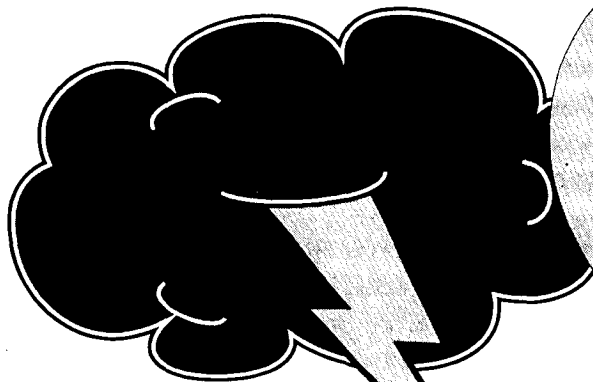

Gloucester Child Care Services is a non-profit organization established in 1974. Community Outreach (a program of G.C.C.S.) offers drop-ins for parents, providers and children (0-5 years) in Gloucester South, Beacon Hill North and Manotick. Other Services that we provide are: a toy library, special needs library, resource library, workshops for parents, providers and children, and a summer program.

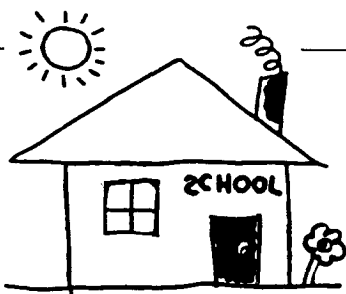

Blackburn Hamlet Preschool is a well established school which offers a diverse program for children aged 2 1/2 to 5 years of age. Our program provides the opportunity for each child to experience a variety of activities in order to develop socially, emotionally, physically and cognitively. This is accomplished by providing many learning centers for the children to participate in - block area, house center, art center, water and sand play, science center - manipulative materials, book and music areas.

The school operates an integrated program to meet the individual needs of children who have special needs. These children are completely integrated into the regular program. Being a cooperative school, Blackburn Hamlet Preschool also allows for parents to become involved in their child's activities through helping days (there are options available for parents who can't assist on these days), special committees, or serving on the executive. Parents can also help out on field trips.

The school is fortunate to have many dedicated, ECE (Early Childhood Education) trained teachers to provide an exciting and challenging program and to offer genuine care and warmth for each child.

A basic day at the Preschool involves freeplay in the art room or large muscle room for approximately 1 hour and 15 minutes, snack, circle time (songs, games, story etc.) and then outdoor play (climbing, riding tricycles, swinging etc.).

Registration for the 95-96 school year begins in February. The school offers 2, 3 or 5 half-day programs in either mornings or afternoons.
