Family Skating Days were scheduled on the outdoor rinks and also in the arena by our local Recreation and Parks Board over the winter months. A health fair in March was organized by Ottawa-Hull Orthotherapy and other Blackburn health professionals. A beautiful wall mural was done for the community hall by the students of Emily Carr under the guidance of artist Karl Ciesluk. 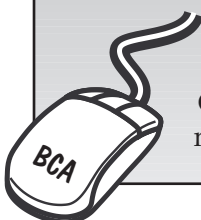

## Will Fun Fair Take Place This Year?

Planning for the Blackburn Hamlet Fun Fair 2001 must start now and a volunteer has not come forward to take on the chairperson position. This is a crucial position that must be filled as soon as possible. Many Fun Fair director positions are also vacant. In order to encourage persons to come forward, shares will now be awarded to all executive positions. The chairperson will receive 8 shares, the treasurer and those responsible for facilities, food and beverage will each receive 4 shares and all other directors will receive 3 shares.

Any person can volunteer and direct their shares to the non-profit organization or charity of their choice. If your organization is looking for fundraising, this is a good way to earn extra funding. Last year the Fun Fair paid out \$91.60 per share to all groups who participated. Each event at the Fair earns a number of shares depending on the time and effort required to put on the event. ## Blackburn History

### Third Blackburn Sign graces Eastern Entrance

A third Blackburn sign has been installed at the eastern entrance of Blackburn Hamlet.

The three signs were designed by the architectural firm of Corush, Sunderland and Wright. The firm also won an award this past year for the walkway beside the American Embassy at the end of York Street.

The sign is constructed of brick and wrought iron as these materials are typical of what is used in the Hamlet. The trees on the sign signify the NCC greenbelt, which is an important element of what makes this community so distinctive. The assessment roll of 1834 was the first time it was documented that there were families living in Concessions 2 and 3 (Blackburn area).

The area was first known as Green's Creek, then Daggville and was finally changed to Blackburn in 1880 in honour of Robert Blackburn. Mr.

Blackburn was a Reeve of the former Gloucester Township (1863-64) and a federal Member of Parliament in the government of Prime Minister Alexander Mackenzie. He was instrumental in getting a post office for the community.

This coming summer the funds that have been raised through the Blackburn Garden Tours will be used for the landscaping around the signs. A very special thankyou to Lois Kemp who spear-headed and co-ordinated the project.

It is my pleasure to address Hamlet residents for the first time as Innes Ward Councillor with the newly amalgamated City of Ottawa. I am honoured to have received your overwhelming support in November's municipal election and wish to thank all of you for the confidence that you have placed in me.

Over the course of the campaign as I met and chatted with residents across the ward, a wide variety of issues were discussed. One of the major concerns that emerged from these discussions was the whole issue of transportation in the east end. The ever-worsening Innes Road bottleneck, for example, and the level of service many neighbourhoods receive from OC Transpo were mentioned repeatedly. As a result, as the new Council began to take shape, my first choice of City Committees was the Transportation and Transit Committee. I am pleased to have succeeded in being named to this committee and I am committed to making east-end transportation issues one of my top priorities.

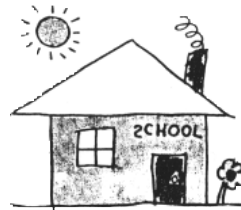
I will also have the privilege of serving on the Emergency and Protective Services Committee, the Health, Recreation and Social Services Committee and the Member Services Committee. I have been appointed as well to a number of boards, including the Ottawa Tourism and Convention Authority, the Pine View Municipal Golf Course Board of Management and the Children's Aid Society Board of Directors.

As Council members settle in and begin their work, the Ottawa Transition Board is folding up its tent. This provincially appointed Board, whose mandate was to make the amalgamation process as (economically) painless and seamless

as possible, has made recommendations on virtually every aspect of Council and City business. It will be Council's responsibility to accept, modify or reject these recommendations as the new city kicks into high gear.

Clearly there are challenges ahead. There is much to do and much to learn but I look forward to representing all of the residents of Innes Ward to the

best of my ability. As always, I welcome your feedback on important issues and I encourage you to call with any questions or concerns you might have about City policies and/or services. 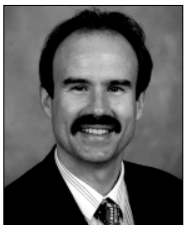

## Take it Back!

**D**o you ever wonder what to do with some of those odds and ends in your home such as used motor oil, expired medication and old batteries? Well, the City of Ottawa has made it easy for us – we can *Take it Back!*"

There are over 300 responsible retailers in the City that have agreed to take back more than 70 products for recycling, reuse or proper disposal. These are items that should not be placed out on the curb for garbage. They include special waste items such as car batteries, tires, oil filters, printer and photocopy cartridges, computers and monitors, and eyeglasses. The "Take it Back!" program also includes everyday household items such as clothes hangars, Brita water filters, flowerpots and plastic gardening flats.

Two Blackburn Hamlet businesses are *Take it Back!*" retailers. These businesses have made arrangements with appropriate special waste handling companies, in order to provide this environmental service to their customers.

- Blackburn Home Hardware collects used Brita water filters and household batteries (824-9654)

- Blackburn Shoppers Drug Mart collects expired medication and used syringes (824-2257)

## Criminal Acts and Mental Illness (Part 2)

I left off last month with the court finding that although the accused had committed a criminal act, this act was committed while the accused suffered from a mental illness, or a "disease of the mind" — a question for the psychiatrist.

The next question for the court to decide is whether, as a result of this disease of the mind, the accused was unable to appreciate the nature and quality of his act or was unable to understand that his act was morally wrong. The answer to this query determines whether or not the accused is not criminally responsible due to mental illness, which is a complete defence to the charge.

What is an inability to appreciate the nature and quality of one's act or that one's act is morally wrong? Here we again turn to the psychiatrist. While some consider psychiatric opinion evidence junk science (rollover Freud), especially when a serious crime has been committed, the opinions of these specialized forensic psychiatrists making these assessments are scrutinized rigorously by our courts.

This evidence must establish either that the accused was unable to appreciate the impact on the victim of his act, or that he was unable to rationally discern that his act was morally wrong based on our social morals or values. Not always a straight forward decision.

If the court does determine that the accused is not criminally responsible then the accused is found not guilty of the criminal act, and the court proceeds to determine what it should do with the accused.

In non-serious cases, for example where the act is in the nature public mischief, the court will often order that the accused be set free on the condition that they attend at their psychiatrist and follow their prescribed treatment, which could include medications.

The court cannot order the accused to be medicated.

In serious cases, the accused is held in a hospital until the Ontario Review Board holds a hearing. This Board, made up of five provincially-appointed individuals, determines whether or not the accused may be released — and only if he does not pose a threat to the safety of the public. In many cases the Board grants to the psychiatric hospital the authority to determine when and under what conditions the accused may be released. This conditional discharge status might continue for many years, in order to ensure that the accused does not slip back into the illness which led to his committing the crime in the first place. Eventually, the accused is discharged absolutely.

Of course, in tough cases the accused will never be released and will reside in the hospital for perhaps the rest of his life.

While the answer to the question of whether an accused is not guilty of a criminal act because he was mentally ill at the time — the so-called insanity defence — is difficult for a court to determine, our criminal law can never allow, despite the rhetoric of some of our law and order politicians, an individual to be convicted of a crime that he did not "knowingly" commit. It is the basic foundation of what we consider to be justice.

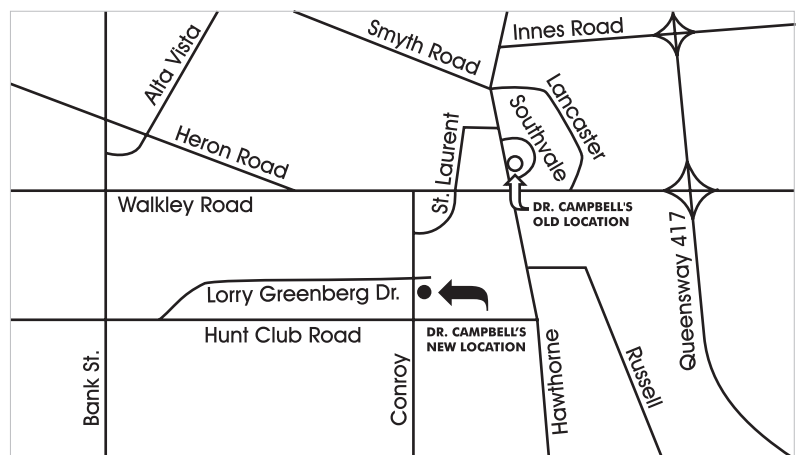

### Winter Composting!

Although the snow is flying and the wind is cold, composters can still be in full swing during the winter. Of course, it is best to start the blustery composting season with an empty composter, placed in a sunny, wind-sheltered spot. Regardless, keep adding kitchen scraps during the winter, whether or not the composting has stopped. Chop scraps a little smaller, and add a handful of dry chopped-up leaves each time you put in kitchen organics (if you've got them handy!). And remember... when out shoveling your driveway and sidewalk, make sure you clear a path to your composter too!

If composting just won't work for you this winter, try saving your kitchen scraps in large covered pails or plastic bags outside. Use them for starting up in the spring.

Your efforts to compost organic material contributes to the solution of reducing the burden on our overfilled landfills, as 25% of the garbage from homes in the City of Ottawa could be composted.

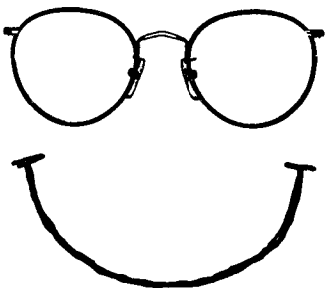
