BCA board meeting highlights February & March 2023

Highlights from recent BCA board meetings discussions include:

- We continue to pursue the use of the Corine
 Wilson High School area in conjunction with the
 Convent Glen Orléans Wood Community Association for the 2023 Cancer Chase to be held in
 September 2023.
- The East End Community Associations continue their efforts to encourage the City of Ottawa to provide public Wifi at city facilities, including our Community Hall. The BCA is also investigating alternate options to provide this service in our hall.
- Repairs and upgrades to the hall continue. The outdoor bulletin board was repaired, new coat hooks were installed in the hallway, new 20-amp circuits have been installed and new LED lighting will be installed when staff are available. New signs have been installed to encourage hall users to properly store the tables and chairs after each event.
- The 2022/2023 winter weather proved to be a significant challenge for our outdoor rinks volunteers. We are grateful for their dedicated efforts to maintain the rinks for this shortened season.
- Due to unforeseen circumstances, the BCA Canada Day event has been cancelled for 2023.
- Miriam Hampson, our beautification chair, is working to install some light post banners and needs help completing the complex application and funding forms. If anyone is able to assist with this activity, please contact beautification@ blackburnhamlet.ca.





Neighbourwoods training — time to register!

A small team of volunteers launched the tree inventory program called "Neighbourwoods" in Blackburn Hamlet last spring. Unfortunately, our training program with Dr. Andrew Kenney was cut short by the unforgettable windstorm "derecho". The loss of many trees in Blackburn, in part because of the derecho, but also as a result of intensification, disease and pests, has only increased the importance of Neighbourwoods in Blackburn.

What is Neighbourwoods? The city has very limited information about trees on private property. The purpose of Neighbourwoods is to gather information

such as the type, size, and health of trees on private property, as well as, in some of our parks, to help us plan better diversity in our tree canopy. Volunteers receive free training from forestry professionals to learn how to identify, measure and assess the health of trees.

More about the free training on the weekend of May 13 and 14 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.: Dr. Kenney will return to the Blackburn Community Hall to train new volunteers. If you love trees and people, consider registering for the training. Love is in the air



Snow will melt, flowers will bloom again and mating season for cats will begin.

If you have a cute kitten at home you might want to make sure you plan their spay/neuter for when they are about 5-7 months old.

Once they reach puberty, intact females will start howling and may spray inside the house during their heat. This cycle last for about 1 week and comes back every 2-3 weeks until next winter.

Several health benefits are associated with

spaying your cat. First, spaying eliminates the risk of ovarian, uterine cancers and pyometra – a fatal condition of the uterus. Second, breast cancer is the number one type of cancer diagnosed in intact (unspayed) female cats which is greatly decreased if a cat is spayed earlier in her life.

What about the boys? For intact male cats, inappropriate urination, strong urine smell and aggressivity are the main problems seen. There is a much more viruses seen (mainly FIV) with intact male roaming outdoors.

Overpopulation is still an ongoing crisis. On average, cats have four kittens in a litter and can litters can range from one to 12. Moreover, a cat can give birth to up to five litters a year. A single female cat can produce up to 420 cats in seven years.... Please be responsible and part of the solution, spay or neuter your cat.

Save a spot in your garden this spring for something unique! On Saturday May 27 "Grandmas AIDing Grandmas", together with the Bearbrook Retirement Residence,





ELECTRICAL PANEL CHANGES

As a master electrician with over 45 years of experience, I have encountered several common problems with electrical panels in this area. These issues can lead to safety hazards and power outages if not addressed in a timely manner.


When should you replace your electrical panel? Your electrical panel protects the wiring system in your home. It must be in good condition in order to do so.

When it shows the following signs, your panel should be replaced:

- Panel is making noise or arcing sound.
- Panel is warm to touch.
- Burnt smell coming from panel.
- Breakers trip often. Breakers can trip for several reasons; a panel problem could be one of them.
- Rust on the panel. Water in the panel will cause corrosion and eventual failure or worse. Have it checked immediately.
- Undersized for today's needs. Your panel is full. You're planning a renovation such as a kitchen reno or an extension on your home. To meet code requirements, additional circuits will be needed.
- Fuse panels. For the same reasons listed above, plus some insurance companies will not cover homes with fuse panels.
- Age. Some types of first-generation breaker panels are no longer made because of ongoing problems. Some of these panels are still in service in the area.
- Circuit breakers can fail because of age, water infiltration or technical issues are often seen with older breakers.

If you have any of the above problems in your panel, have it checked out.




