

BCA Board meeting highlights April 2023

Highlights from recent BCA Board meetings discussions include:

- We have been advised by the City of Ottawa that the Lois Kemp Arena Parking Lot pavement has deficiencies and will need to be replaced soon. Timing of this work is being negotiated with the paving contractor.
- The City of Ottawa will be increasing the height of the fencing around the baseball diamond that is beside the Lois Kemp Arena. Work will commence after the baseball season ends in early September and substantial completion is anticipated by the end of November.
- Our Director of Safety, Don Kelly, has agreed to take the lead on establishing a Community Emergency Plan to improve our response and support of our residents during emergencies, such as this year's Ice Storm and last year's Derecho.
- Barbara Whittaker has taken over the BCA Seniors portfolio and is developing a program to be reviewed at the next board meeting.
- The contract for keeping our Parks clean has been finalized and will run from mid-May to early September.

OC Transpo route review

This year, OC Transpo is undertaking a detailed, Citywide, transit service review. This review is required to reflect changing ridership, specifically, the impact of hybrid work, and the upcoming Stage 2 LRT extensions. This will be a review of the entire transit system and include all bus routes.

Ottawa residents are being asked to share their thoughts with OC Transpo staff, as they begin planning and building this new transit network. This is the opportunity for us as residents to share our suggestions, concerns, and experiences using the bus system. As well, for OC Transpo to re-think how routes are moving people through our community. In particular, how we connect with the expanded LRT and the new stations and hubs.

For so long, our bus routes were centered on moving Orléans commuters to their work downtown; even at the expense of our ability to move about locally in the community. This is our chance to help build a bus network that works for us.



As of April, city-wide consultations have been taking place, with both in-person and online opportunities for feedback. It is imperative that Blackburn Hamlet residents have every opportunity to be heard. This feedback is important, as OC Transpo is building the plan for the future transit network to share with the public as early as the end of this year.

Road safety is a shared responsibility

Don Kelly, BCA Safety

With the change of season and warm weather, more riders will be commuting on our paths, trails, and roadways. The rules of the road apply to all users, and motorists are urged to exercise more care around vulnerable road users, including pedestrians.

SAFETY TIPS FROM THE OTTAWA POLICE SERVICE:

Motorists

- Be prepared to share the road with cyclists they have the right to occupy a lane
- Give cyclists one metre when passing
- Know the hand signals used by cyclists
- Review the rules of motorists for bike lanes

Cyclists

- Use hand signals to let others know what you are doing and where you are going
- Follow all laws with respect to roadways, sidewalks and pathways

- Ensure your bicycle is equipped with a bell and lights
- Consider installing a mirror on your bike
- Always be situationally aware of what is going on around you

Motorcyclists:

- Re-familiarize yourself with the roads. Enhance your skills by practicing first in a vacant parking lot. Try slow-speed manoeuvres, quick braking, and swerves
- Be mindful of damage to road surfaces
- Watch for road debris, sand and gravel, especially in turns
- Give yourself plenty of space and pay attention to what other drivers are doing
- Make yourself as visible as possible by wearing a bright fluorescent jacket


