Blackburn Community Association Meeting Minutes September 21, 2023 7:30 pm

- 1. Call to order at 7:35 pm
- 2. Approval of Agenda
- 3. Minutes from previous meetings
 - Motion to approve the minutes from June 15, 2023 by Barbara Whittaker. Seconded by Sarah Morgan-White. Carried.
- 4. Councillor Update (Laura Dudas)
 - There will be a budget consultation on November 18 at Shenkman Arts Centre.
 Additional consultations will be held throughout the ward and residents are encouraged to reach out at any time with their input and concerns.
 - The City will be planting over 100 trees in the ward this Fall. Woodhill Park in Blackburn Hamlet will be one of the locations to receive trees.
 - A section of Innes Road and part of the Bearbrook Park path were paved this year.
 Councillor Dudas will continue to push for more work to be completed in the coming years.
 - There was an intention was to complete the installation of traffic calming measures on Bearbrook from Westpark to Hornets Nest this year, but it has been delayed to next spring. This will include improved line markings, flex posts and signs.
 - OC Transpo has chosen Blackburn Hamlet for the on-demand transit pilot. Minibuses will replace the 28 on weekends only. It will operate during the same hours as the 28 schedule and will be available at all stops in the Hamlet plus Blair Station. There may be some virtual stops included on other streets such as Cleroux. If this pilot does not work, the expectation is that service would revert to the regular 28 until changes are made as part of the ongoing route review. There will not be any changes to the 25 route or schedule.
 - A Seniors Tea is planned for the Lois Kemp Arena on Friday September 22 from 10am to 11:30am.
 - The reason why council approved the Carling development across the street from the Experimental Farm is that fell within the rules of the Ontario Planning Act. The Planning Act has no provisions for assessing the impact on an Agricultural research farm.
 - One of the upcoming waste collection changes is that leaf and yard waste will no longer be permitted in the Green Bin. Yard waste pickup will continue for items in reusable bins, leaf and yard waste bags and bundles of branches.

5. Wifi Hotspot Options (Lynn Lefevre)

- Since there is no clear timeline for the City to install Wifi in our Hall, the BCA is looking for options where we can have Internet access for BCA volunteers at our events.
- Options were presented for the BCA to acquire our own 5G Wireless service, or to run a pilot using a board members service.
- Motion by Mark Lister to run a pilot service using Lynn Lefevre's 5G Wireless service and to reimburse all costs incurred when BCA Volunteers use this service. Seconded by Lisa Margeson. Carried.

6. Discovery Café (Barbara Whittaker)

- Discovery Café was a series of free public lectures on general interest subjects that used to be held at a local Church. It has been revived under the BCA and will be running on the fourth Thursday of each month from 7pm to 8:30pm in the Community Hall.
- Three nights have been scheduled: September 28, October 26 and November 23.
 The topic for September is Chemicals: The Good, the Bad and the Ugly by Prof Robert Burk.
- The only costs will be to cover posters, refreshments and appreciation gifts for the speakers.
- Motion by Barbara Whittaker to reallocate \$250 from the Canada Day budget to Discovery Café. Seconded by Don Kelly. Carried.

7. BCA Finances (Lisa Margeson)

- BCA Finances are in good shape. Revenue is being received as expected and Expenses are low.
- Lisa Margeson and Devin Fraser are planning a free tax clinic for those with simple tax returns in February 2024. Carleton University Accounting Students will be providing the service and CRA will be providing the software.
- We are seeing an increasing number of vendors who no longer accept cheques for payment. We are working with the Bank to identify options to make electronic payments, which are currently prevented due to our requirement to have dual authorization for payments.
- Lisa Margeson is investigating the possibility of organizing a community Social Club showcase next year.

8. Event Updates (Don Kelly)

- Sunday's Cancer Chase is moving forward in the Orleans location. The Orleans fun
 run team are taking care of the run portion of the event. There have been some
 issues with the Ottawa Hospital website which many account for the lower than
 expected registrations. The silent auction has over 40 items available. Ottawa Fire
 Services have confirmed that there will be a fire truck on site.
- The Christmas Craft event have over 30 vendors showing interest in the 19 tables available. It is being held in the Community Hall on November 18.
- There has been good community response from the Emergency Preparedness Plan article in the recent edition of the BANAR. Just Food is also looking to participate. A community meeting will be scheduled for mid October.
- The BCA held a successful first aid course last year and are looking to run another one this year near the end of October. A motion will be brought at the next board meeting to fund two training spots for members of our emergency response team.
- Sensei Paul Morck is running Shindao Martial Arts self defence training and discipline out of the Good Shepherd School. Don Kelly is working on a proposal that could offer free or reduced cost tuition for a one year program for up to four teens from low-income families.
- Don Kelly continues to work with the Frangian family on a plan to host a Christmas Tree display near the Blackburn Pharmacy.

9. Seniors (Barbara Whittaker)

- The Seniors Breakfasts are continuing with an average of 10 participants (15 in August).
- Seven people are now participating in the Seniors Action Committee.

10. Youth (Maureen Forsythe)

- Completion of new mural at Lois Kemp Arena on August 11th
 - 18 youth participants
 - We are waiting for a response from the City on a recognition event.
- Ongoing/Upcoming Events:
 - The Fall Short Story Contest has been launched. Submission deadline is October
 Winners will be announced in the BANAR
 - o A Halloween Event will be held in the Park next to the Hall on October 28.
 - Since the City provided funding for the Arena mural, the BCA mural funding may be used to for one inside the Blackburn Seniors Lodge at the reception area. The date has not been determined.

11. Beautification (Miriam Hampson)

• Rain Barrel Sale

- The BCA partnered with RainBarrel.ca to sell rain barrels to our community.
 RainBarrel.ca reclaims barrels used to transport fruits and vegetables to be used as rain barrels. Partnering with various non-profit organizations, RainBarrel.ca helps stage truckload fundraisers in communities like ours across Canada.
- The BCA sold over 80 rain barrels and 40 miscellaneous parts! Pre-ordered rain barrels were available for pick up at the Community Hall on June 22. The BCA received \$10 from every rain barrel sold; and \$2 from each downspout diverter, stand or flower pot sold. A total of: \$962.50 was made from the sale to support BCA initiatives.
- A special thank you to Lisa, Lynn, Barbara, and Robert for all their help with the delivery day (and Maureen for her moral support!)

Garden Tour

- There were 15 gardens on the tour, with seven of them being new ones. All adding to the varieties, achievements, and sharing of all the people who make the gardens such a pleasure to visit.
- This year, we were fortunate to have the Hamlet husband and wife team of Jenifir and David Thies- Thompson beautifully playing the flute and violin, in the garden of Jean Clark and Guy Moreau. We also had Garth Hampson singing, with Pat Messier on the keyboard in John and Gloria Peddie's beautiful garden. His voice, well known to many, is still going strong with a medley of memorable tunes, for his ninety years. The Peddie's family and neighbours came up with the 60 chairs required for the visitors to sit and relax and enjoy his singing.
- We were fortunate enough to also have two master gardeners, sitting around the patio table at Cynthia Hoisak's. With gardening encyclopedias, and their knowledge they were ready to answer any gardening questions throughout the weekend.
- Dylan Warrick filmed a few of the gardens and you can see his great maneuvering with his drone on You Tube. Blackburn Garden Tour 2023.
- Generosity was also extended to the many clay pots for cash donations to the Lifecentre Food Bank. All those coins and bills added up to \$1,706.60. The BCA generously contributed another \$500, for a total of \$2,217.30. These funds were donated to the Lifecentre Foodbank.
- A special thank you to Cynthia Hoisak for co-leading this wonderful initiative. We are in the planning process for next year!

BCA Gardens:

- o 15 volunteers continue to take care of the four Hamlet gardens at our entry points. The gardens, now in the 3rd year, have developed nicely with many perennials establishing themselves. This has allowed for more lasting blooms and less watering. The volunteer role is still quite onerous requiring muscle, time, water and transportation. We are fortunate to have community members (of all ages) to help with this initiative.
- As the weather gets a bit colder, I will be looking at planting more mums and adding fall decor (similar to last year).

Carleton University

- We will be working with a University of Carleton student this fall to help identify tree
 pests and diseases specific to Blackburn and remedies. The intention is to have a report
 that can be shared with our residents to help safeguard our urban forest!
- Our first meeting is October 2nd!
- The project overview is:
 - a review of research literature on invasive tree pests/diseases and the urban context, emphasizing the CDN context
 - research and report on 10 pests and diseases, most of which are not yet present in
 Ottawa, that we should be aware of
 - analysis and report of the city of Ottawa tree inventory data for Ward 2 and for Blackburn Hamlet
 - These will provide the groups with the resources to develop their final project deliverables. These are:
 - a final presentation (end of Nov/early Dec)
 - an executive summary (about 5 pages), and likely also a visual/infographic element (which may be figures inserted in the exec summary).
