Blackburn Community Association Meeting Minutes January 18, 2024 7:30 pm

- 1. Call to order at 7:35pm
- 2. Approval of Agenda
- 3. Minutes from previous meetings
 - Motion to approve the minutes from November 16, 2023 by Brent Lawrie. Seconded by Maureen Forsythe. Carried.
- 4. Just Food Update (Moe Garahan)
 - Just Food is 20 years old and has occupied the farm for the past 14 years. They have over 30
 Partners at the farm and have the goals of food access, sustainable agriculture and
 enhancement of community participation and development.
 - Programs at the farm include:
 - The community gardening network and development fund, which includes a seed library and gardening workshops and provides a growing number of family size plots at the farm
 - Savour Ottawa partnership which supports local food farms & businesses
 - Advocacy and education on local food policy
 - Startup farm training program.
 - o Foret capital forest, which has 9 acres on the farm
 - Women Warries Healing Garden
 - o Earth Path
 - Many more!
 - A portion of the upstairs barn is now a 4-season space with accessible elevator access and is available for events. The outdoor pavilion is also available for events.
 - The installation of an upper deck of the Barn was postponed due to rising construction costs for the other projects. The plan is to include it when the rest of the barn upstairs area is converted to 4-season space once funding has been secured.
 - Recent challenges have been vandalism attacks on the farm irrigation pipes and a cabin break-in.
 - The community is welcome to visit the farm but must respect the rules that are posted at https://justfood.ca/just-food-farm/farmrules/.
 - New signs will be posted this year throughout the farm to explain the activities at the farm and to remind visitors of the rules.
 - They are working with the NCC on an extension of the bike path from Hornets nest parallel to Tauvette. A fence will be installed separating the new path from the farm and it will only have 2 openings. One at Southpark and another along Tauvette.
 - Breakfasts at the farm will be held in conjunction with the monthly farm stand starting with Mothers Day and Fathers Day.
 - This year they hope for more collaboration and shared events.
 - They will also be setting up a pilot neighbourhood composting drop-off initiative.

5. Councillor Update (Sarah Loomis)

- OCTranspo is still working out the details with the on-demand pilot booking vendor. This will
 only run on weekends. A starting date has not been announced.
- The updated OCTranspo Route Review details are posted at https://lauradudas.ca/oc-transpo-route-review/. The route 28 weekday service is being replaced with an extension of the 24
- Councillor Dudas is holding a Family skating event on February 16 from 6pm to 7pm at the Lois Kemp Arena.
- The 98/100 Bearbrook development application has been resubmitted and now falls under new Provincial accelerated approval process.
- The 2024 vacant unit tax portal is now open for residents to submit their declaration.

Members and Voting Rights

Blacburn Community Association has two types of memberships: Regular and Associate

Regular members reside within the boundaries of Blackburn Hamlet. Membership gives them the right to vote on motions raised at Members' Meetings and to vote on the election of the Directors.

Associate members reside outside the boundaries of Blackburn Hamlet. Membership gives them the right to vote motions raised at Members' Meetings. Associate members are not eligible to vote on the election of the Directors.
