- 4. Sustainable Eastern Ontario diagnostic report and climate action proposal for Blackburn Hamlet (Paul Johanis, Ked Neptune and Tephnie Beau de Rochars)
 - Mission is to create a more sustainable and resilient community by bringing together diverse voices and expertise. They are dedicated to connecting sustainability groups fostering collaboration, building administrative and operational capacity and celebrating success across Eastern Ontario and Western Quebec.
 - On January 19, 2024, the Collaborative Action Plan for francophone community awareness and engagement in the sustainability sector was officially launched.
 - An environmental neighbourhood diagnosis was conducted, which allowed them to identify key issues and propose active plans for community awareness and advocacy.
 - The object is to engage the community to have a more resiliant and sustainable neighbourhods.
 - One of the main issues in Blackburn Hamlet is low home efficiency due to the age of the housing, which is a leading cause of pollution in the neighbourhood.
 - Another challenge is the relatively low population density, which limits the quantity and quality of public transportation services, leading to pollution from a car dependant community.
 - The next phase will bring together organizations to work with residents on collective improvements.
 - They are also looking for representation from BCA to participate in quarterly meetings.

8. Seniors (Barbara Whittaker)

- Blackburn Seniors Breakfast Get-togethers

 - March 6, 2024 will be first anniversary of the breakfasts.
- Seniors Walk-and-talk outings
 - New series of walks for winter: February 14, with new time and departure location: 1 pm, end of Tauvette Street, where Greenbelt Pathway E begins. 7 people attended.

- Seniors Winter Social on Saturday, March 16, 2024: Potluck and Games afternoon

- Seniors Survey Results
 - From November 17 to December 8, 2023, the BCA Seniors Action Committee ran a survey of Blackburn Seniors to seek their input on activities and to find out what sources they used to get their information.
 - A hardcopy version of the survey was published in the BANAR and copies were made available at Metro and the Ottawa Public Library (OPL). Links to the online Google Forms survey were made available on the BCA website, in the December BCA enewsletter, and on the BCA Facebook page. Fifty online responses were received and 24 paper surveys were completed (2 at Metro, 22 at OPL).
 - Info sources: 64 of the 74 respondents cited the BANAR as one of their main info sources. The website, Facebook page, e-newsletter, signage and word-of-mouth were also popular choices. One person questioned why there are two Facebook pages for BCA (page and group).
 - Interestingly, many of made suggestions for activities which are now or will be offered by BCA, the City of Ottawa, or OPL here in the Hamlet. This means that the promotions we are doing are not reaching them
 - To help get the info out about some of these activities, we have further enhanced the Seniors page on the BCA site, and expanded the info that is provided to the seniors breakfast attendees (e.g. about development applications)
 - Other suggestions for a wide variety of activities, including:
 - Current offerings to be more tailored for seniors (e.g. lane swims, pickle ball, cycling, exercise programs.)
 - Return of a program called Better Strength and Balance. This was a free 12-week exercise program for seniors offered by OPH. A similar program is offered online, as well as on Rogers TV Community Channel, but in-person sessions are not currently offered.
 - Regular seniors games/cards activities
 - Day trips outside of the Hamlet
 - One full-page submission re: proposal for Seniors Info Session/Fair
