





Sustainability Tip: Run Your Own Clothing Swap

There are many reasons to love a clothing swap. Aside from getting a free update to your wardrobe, it's a fun, affordable way to reduce our consumption of fast fashion. But it doesn't stop at clothes! Done well, swaps can make for a fun opportunity for friends & family members to connect AND give back to the community. If you've ever thought about running a clothing swap, or if you're looking for a sustainable way to update your wardrobe, keep reading!

If you've attended one of the BCA Community Closet Events, you may have seen me there helping out. Aside from supporting these events, I've been running small clothing swaps at my workplaces and friends and family's homes for almost 10 years now. I want to share what I've learned about running these smaller events with the hope of inspiring you to give them a try.

There are many advantages to running a swap with a smaller group of colleagues or friends. Shopping becomes more fun and less stimulating in smaller groups. At a swap, you get to share your style and clothes with folks you know, poach pieces from people whose style you admire, and take risks on pieces you wouldn't normally buy. And when sharing clothing with a person they know, it may be easier for someone to part with favourite pieces they no longer wear or expensive outfits that never really brought them joy.

Is heartworm disease really in Ontario?



1 in 200 dogs tested positive for heartworm disease throughout Canada in 2022. The overall prevalence of heartworm in Ontario dogs appears to be approximately 0.5%. With more dogs coming up from heartworm areas through rescue groups and the untreated foxes/coyotes it is likely we will see more.

How is Heartworm Transmitted?

Heartworm is caused by an approximately 8 inch long spaghetti-like worm. A mosquito bites an infected dog, fox or coyote and takes in the larval stage that is circulating in the blood. Later, the mosquito can bite your dog and inject the larva into your dog's

bloodstream. Over the next 6-7 months it develops into an adult worm, living in the vessels of your dog's heart.

Symptoms of Heartworm: Cough, lethargy, exercise intolerance, congestive heart failure. Some dogs may be asymptomatic and show none of these signs.

Diagnosing Heartworm: Unfortunately, we cannot rely on the absence of clinical signs to say your dog is free of heartworm. Fortunately, heartworm disease can be diagnosed through a simple blood test.

Prevention is Key! Heartworm "season" is typically June to November. It is during this time that it is important to have your dog on an appropriate monthly preventative. This preventative kills the larval stage before it can develop into adult worms and before they can cause damage to your dog's heart and lungs. For information on which product is right for your dog please contact us.

Councillor's Update


Blackburn Hamlet really is unique in Ottawa. Being nestled in the Greenbelt has allowed us to flourish, offering a slice of small-town life in the city. In addition to our surrounding greenspace, we have an extensive network of pathways and active transportation links that connect to all corners. We have multiple local schools, an arena, a community hall, and so many amazing small businesses, all right here in the Hamlet. Yet, even though we're tucked away, we still contend with cut-through traffic funneled by our three entrances, and the challenges that come with it.

As everyone who takes Bearbrook southbound during the morning rush can tell you, vehicles trying to do drop offs at Louis Riel High School can cause queuing all the way down the hill to the Hornets Nest. While City Traffic Engineers had assessed the Bearbrook/Westpark intersection before, specifically looking at whether the intersection met the Province's warrants for a protected left-turn into Louis Riel, I am happy to share that it has now met the necessary criteria and is eligible. The installation of the advance leftturn signal is now on City work plans, and we should see the addition soon.

Another new addition to this stretch of Bearbrook will be new seasonal flex stakes between Westpark and the Hornets Nest, providing a separated place for walkers and cyclists to connect to the fields and NCC pathways. We will also soon see the return of centreline flex stakes and their accompanying "cyclo-delineators" along Innes throughout the Hamlet.

As many have already seen, the Ottawa Safety Council has completed its assessments, and determined that Bearbrook/Innes was eligible for a second crossing guard. This welcome change will make the intersection safer for all users during peak hours, particularly children and their families en route to school.

I am pleased to see how these improvements continue to focus on calming traffic, easing congestion and protecting school children in our wonderful community.


How does it work?


