

Help deter bike theft!

With the arrival of spring, many of us have moved our bikes out of the shed with anticipation of joyful rides along the many bike paths and trails offered to us in Ottawa. Unfortunately, this is also the time when thieves move about our neighbourhood to steal our bikes and ruin these joyful experiences. But there is something you can do to mitigate this potential loss! The Ottawa Police have a program called Project 529 Garage, which is a comprehensive bike registry and recovery system that deters bike theft, increases the likelihood that stolen bikes will be returned to their owners and provides an investigative tool for police to identify stolen bikes. - If someone you to pay in advance of receiving any goods, know that it is illegal for a company to ask you to pay upfront before they give you a loan.

The Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre collects information on fraud and identity theft. They provide information on past and current scams affecting Canadians. Learn more at their website. And remember, If you think you're a victim of fraud, report it!

We learned about the roles and responsibilities of the numerous businesses and groups that make the airport function, and gained insight into the impacts that the pandemic has had on flights and flying from Ottawa impacts that the airport and travelers are still dealing with today.

With your involvement, we can discourage criminals from our community, make our homes less inviting for thieves, heighten awareness of suspicious criminal activity within the community, and most importantly allow everyone to feel "safe" in our neighbourhood.


On April 6, the BCA held a Neighbourhood Watch seminar, where we shared that Blackburn Hamlet is developing an Emergency Preparedness Plan (EPP) and that this program will be an integral part of the EPP. A larger Neighbourhood Watch group would allow us to have greater awareness of the most vulnerable members of our community, so that during an emergency situation, these residents can have any support they might require. The EPP is expected to be posted on the BCA website in late May.

Did you know that a valuable crime awareness tool is available online for all residents to access? The Ottawa Police Crime Mapping Tool allows you to see all crime that has occurred across the city, including what has happened in our neighbourhood. Visit data.ottawapolice.ca/pages/maps for further details.

Another valuable crime prevention tool to consider is an exterior video camera. These cameras can capture suspicious persons or activity on your street

> or in your backyard, and are an excellent source for a police investigation. The best crime prevention source is YOU! Report all crimes, small or large, to the Ottawa Police.



Love is in the air



Snow will melt, flowers will bloom again and mating season for cats will begin.

If you have a cute kitten at home you might want to make sure you plan their spay/neuter for when they are about 5-7 months old.

Once they reach puberty, intact females will start howling and may spray inside the house during their heat. This cycle last for about 1 week and comes back every 2-3 weeks until next winter.

Several health benefits are associated with

spaying your cat. First, spaying eliminates the risk of ovarian, uterine cancers and pyometra – a fatal condition of the uterus. Second, breast cancer is the number one type of cancer diagnosed in intact (unspayed) female cats which is greatly decreased if a cat is spayed earlier in her life.

What about the boys? For intact male cats, inappropriate urination, strong urine smell and aggressivity are the main problems seen. There is a much more viruses seen (mainly FIV) with intact male roaming outdoors.

Overpopulation is still an ongoing crisis. On average, cats have four kittens in a litter and can litters can range from one to 12. Moreover, a cat can give birth to up to five litters a year. A single female cat can produce up to 420 cats in seven years.... Please be responsible and part of the solution, spay or neuter your cat.

Councillor's Update Why doesn't Blackburn Hamlet have a dog park?

This was one of the first questions I was asked when I became the Blackburn Community Association President back in, what was it, 2007? It feels like that was a lifetime ago now. The question really resonated with me on a personal level, as a resident, dog owner and now a City Councillor. Over the last several years, I have set out on many a walk with my four-legged friends, looking for a place where we could take the leash off, run safely and play together.

In my first term at City Hall, I started digging into options as soon as I could, asking staff about various pieces of land around the Hamlet, trying to find even a small option that would suit an enclosed dog park. One of the first surprises I had in this process was just how few suitable locations there were. When we think about our neighbourhood, there is a lot of greenspace that weaves in and out of each corner of the community, not to mention the lush green lands that completely surround it. At first blush, finding a space for a dog park shouldn't be that hard — there are so many places to choose from! I quickly learned that this just was not so. This is largely due to the myriad of different public and private entities that own the parks and open space around here, much of it belonging to the federally-managed National Capital Commission. Once the team I was working with



at the City confirmed all of the City-owned spaces that could be explored, I quickly realized how much of a challenge it would be to find a place for the dog park.

One of the blessings we have in Blackburn is that our parks have a variety of recreational amenities, whether it be volleyball nets, climbers and swings, basketball nets, or otherwise. There really is something for any age to enjoy. This presented challenge number two, meeting the requirement for any new dog park to be a certain distance from recreational facilities and structures. This left us with just two options — Tauvette Park and the fenced-in site former site of the Blackburn Preschool behind the arena. The actual space that was open for discussion was actually very small, with a meager footprint to work with after room for required snow storage was factored in. There were also several flags from staff that, with the existing activities at the arena and ball diamond, parking would likely be a huge issue — not to mention the close proximity to the space where many softball and baseball games take place in the summer. And of

course, there is the FunFair! All those issues aside, the project was prohibitively expensive due to the need to add a specialized surface to appropriately handle the potential dog piddling, with estimates coming in at around the \$350K mark, just for a postage stamp space that likely would fit just a couple of dogs at a time.

We also explored the possibility of building one at Tauvette Park. I had my hopes up for a short while, as there wasn't an immediate "no" from staff, but my hope was relatively short-lived. The lesser issue was the requirement for dogs and their owners to have to walk between the sports fields to access the park. This space would not be accessible at all during the winter, and there wasn't a way to add lighting to the area, a glaring concern for both practical and safety reasons.

Those two final locations brought to a halt the exploratory journey for a dog park location in Blackburn, a journey that spanned multiple years of back and forth with City staff, and thought experiments of what "could be". I would be lying if I said I wasn't incredibly disappointed at the thought of not getting our neighbourhood a dog park like many of us wanted. Knowing this topic often comes up in discussion among neighbours, I am always open to hearing new ideas. After years and years of trying to land a suitable option, at this time, I can safely say that no stone has been left unturned.
