Blackburn Community Association Meeting Minutes November 21, 2024 7:30 pm

- 1. Call to order at 7:40pm
- 2. Approval of Agenda
- 3. Minutes from previous meetings
 - Motion by Satinder Sahota to approve the October 17, 2024 minutes. Seconded by Jeff Miller. Carried.
- 4. Councillor's Update (Laura Dudas)
 - Council is currently focused on the budget.
 - Transit is one of the top topics being discussed and a new proposal for fare increases will be presented at the Transit Commission on Monday November 25.
 - We are still waiting for details regarding the infrastructure proposals for each Ward.
 - The budget includes a second speed camera on Bearbrook Road near Louis Riel (pending Hydro Ottawa assessment).
 - There will be a drop-in budget consultation session on Thursday, December 5, from 6:30 to 8 pm, at the Lois Kemp Arena.
- 5. Financial update & 2025 BCA Budget Reminder (Lisa Margeson)
 - Most of the 2025 BCA budget submissions have been received. The proposed budget will be circulated to the board prior to the vote at the January board meeting.
 - The outstanding tax returns from 2004 to 2019 have all been submitted to Revenue Canada as part of our GST rebate claim. Lisa Margeson will be following up with them next week and will report back at the next board meeting.
- 6. Transportation Director (Jeff Miller)
 - Multiple people are interested in helping with this portfolio. Jeff Miller will stand in as Interim Director and each person will report to him until the March AGM.
- 7. Pull down Projector Screen (Lynn Lefevre)
 - A tab tension Pull Down 110" Screen would cost \$900 +Tax. The board agreed that the current portable screen is sufficient.

- 8. Making Spirits Bright Funding/Support (William Pfitzer)
 - The organizers are looking for up to \$750 to offset the cost of games, crafts and food.
 - Motion by Jeff Miller for the BCA to provide a grant of \$350. Seconded by Lisa Margeson. Carried.

9. Hall Updates (William Pfitzer)

- The mural on the wall has been updated to replace pieces that have fallen off.
- The storage locker has been cleaned and reorganized.
- Firehouse Coffee is donating coffee to use in the Hall each month.
- There are extra Hall Keys if any of the BCA directors need one.
- Don Kelly has raised concerns about where some items have moved to. Where
 possible, event specific items should be in the containers when they are not needed.
 Napkins, plates and utensils that should be shared are currently stored in the
 container.
- Don Kelly will lead a sub-committee of storage users to continue improving the organization.

10. Interim BCA Grant Proposal (Lynn Lefevre)

- Motion by Lynn Lefevre to adopt the following Interim Grant guidelines. Seconded by Jeff Miller. Carried.
 - No grant should exceed \$500;
 - Grant priority should associated with a BCA event (Cancer Chase, Garden Tour, Teddy Bear Clinic, Christmas Market, etc) and groups who help support these events;
 - Any unallocated grant money should be allocated to community groups based on their alignment with the BCA Purpose.

11. Christmas Market (Jenny Lawrence)

- The market currently has 22 vendors and 24 tables and has been expanded to include the community the room at the Lois Kemp Arena.
- Vendor fees will be donated to the Ottawa Mental Health program to help cover supplies needed by patients when they are discharged.

12. Tutor Doctor Youth Learning sessions (Melanie Mathieu)

• Tutor Doctor enquired if the BCA was interested in offering shared sessions to community members (6 student per session/8 sessions). Unfortunately, this is not a program we can fund.

13. Accessibility Training (Melanie Mathieu)

 Melanie Mathieu will work with Kyle Humphrey to create an accessibility guide for the BCA. The goal is to complete this by next Spring.

14. Pool Mural (Melanie Mathieu)

• There was funding in this year's budget for a mural but Melanie Mathieu was not able to lead this activity. If no one is interested in taking the lead, it will be removed from next year's budget.

15. Winter Carnival (Don Kelly)

- Don Kelly is working with other Directors and Volunteers to expand the Hockey/skate day on Family Day weekend into a winter carnival.
- The Bearbrook rink would be used for skating and the Norman Johnston rink would host Hockey.
- Additional activities will include a Stingers hockey demonstration, snowshoe races, and a tug of war in the snow, They are also looking at hosting a Ringette demonstration and a Sledge Hockey demonstration.
- Both locations will be setup to provide food and drinks.

16. Showcase (Don Kelly)

• The BCA showcase in the Arena now has glass doors but we are still waiting for a lock. The committee made progress on content and hopes to have it completed in January.

17. Emergency Preparedness Plan (Don Kelly)

- The review and revisions of the plan have been completed.
- A meeting will be scheduled with the Ottawa Office of Emergency Management for their endorsement of the plan.
- The plan will be presented to the BCA after the City has approved it..

18. Event Updates (Don Kelly)

- The planning for Santa's Breakfast is going well and we have received a good response from the community. The 8:30am session is full and the 9:45am session is nearing capacity. There are still open spaces for the 11am session. The 11am session will be promoted on social media, the newsletter and our website.
- Don Kelly will be picking up the Community Christmas tree on November 29th. An inflatable bear will be added to this year's display. If there is no snow for the lighting event, arrangements have been made to bring some from the Arena. The lighting event is on December 14 starting at 6:30 pm. Kids will be encouraged to bring an ornament to hang on the tree.

19. Board & Spouse Christmas Party (Jeff Miller)

• Jeff Miller will book space at the Arms for December 12 (if the space is available). Attendance will be open to the board, committee chairs and spouses..

20. Presidents Update (Jeff Miller)

 Reminder that the construction fences and work on the NCC land adjacent to Tauvette is being conducted by the NCC, not the City of Ottawa, the BCA or Just Food.

21. New Business

- The asphalt plant group still looking at what can be done. The Freedom of Information Request requires a vote at a meeting to be held in December since a third party is involved.
- With the impending closure of our TD branch in the spring, the BCA will be looking at the costs and benefits to move our account to the Bank of Montreal.

24. Youth Update (Melanie Mathieu)

- Kids and Youth Halloween Parties: The kids party in the morning had so many people we were almost at capacity for the hall! They had a scavenger hunt, played musical chairs, carved pumpkins and mobile escape rooms hosted 2 escape rooms. Lessons learned: Less tables for kids event to make more space.
